Dear Clerk Florida PSC Clerk,

Our family installed solar panels in late 2018. We enjoy the benefits of a net metering plan with FPL, that has reduced our electric power expenses and provided the utility with power from our excess generation. We would expect that the utility would accept the current plan since it benefits from it. For that reason we ask the commission to retain the present net metering rule.

As we struggle with a global pandemic, an economic crisis, and an active hurricane season, it is not the time to create more uncertainty by signaling a change in solar policies that are helping to make our state a leader in clean solar power and providing good paying local jobs.

At the start of 2020, Florida was ranked 4th in the nation for solar energy production, employing thousands of people and powering the Sunshine State with clean, affordable, homegrown energy.
