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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	COMMISSIONER FAY: Good morning. Today is
3	August 19th. This is 9:30 a.m. We will call to
4	order this prehearing conference.
5	If staff could read the notice.
6	MR. TRIERWEILER: I say again. By notice
7	issued on August 10th, 2020, this time and place
8	has been set for a prehearing conference in No.
9	20190038-EI. The purpose of the prehearing is set
10	out more fully in the notice.
11	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you, staff.
12	And probably, in the future, what we will do
13	is just make sure all the parties are on or
14	there is representation from all parties at the
15	beginning so if somebody is for some reason not on
16	or available, then we give them some time do so,
17	otherwise, we will take it in order of appearances,
18	and maybe we will do the utility, OPC, FEA and then
19	staff can do their appearances.
20	Is Gulf
21	UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Are you just checking
22	to see if somebody is here, or are you doing
23	appearances?
24	COMMISSIONER FAY: Appearances, yeah.
25	MR. BADDERS: Good morning. Thank you,

1	Commissioner.
2	This is Jason Higginbotham. I would like to
3	enter an appearance on behalf of Gulf Power
4	Company. I would also like to enter appearances
5	for Ken Rubin and Russell Badders.
6	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Thank you.
7	Office of Public Counsel.
8	MR. DAVID: Yeah. This is Tad David,
9	appearing for the Office of Public Counsel. Also
10	want to make enter an appearance for J.R. Kelly.
11	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.
12	FEA.
13	MR. FRIEDMAN: Good morning, this is Captain
14	Rob Friedman on behalf of FEA.
15	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great, thanks.
16	And then staff.
17	MR. TRIERWEILER: I am Walt Trierweiler for
18	Commission staff
19	COMMISSIONER FAY: Did you get your mic on?
20	MR. TRIERWEILER: Walt Trierweiler for
21	Commission staff. Also making an appearance is
22	Shaw Stiller and Jennifer Crawford.
23	COMMISSIONER FAY: Thank you.
24	MS. HELTON: And finally your advisor here
25	is here, Mary Anne Helton. I would also like to

1	make an appearance for your General Counsel, Keith
2	Hetrick.
3	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.
4	And I think our General Counsel is one year
5	younger today actually, is that correct?
6	MS. HELTON: He is, and he is he is taking
7	a holiday today.
8	COMMISSIONER FAY: Good for him. All those
9	decades of wisdom that he holds, he deserves it.
10	Well, staff, I guess we will move to
11	preliminary matters.
12	MR. TRIERWEILER: Yes.
13	State buildings are currently closed to the
14	public, and other restrictions on gathering remain
15	in place due to COVID-19. Accordingly, this
16	prehearing is being conducted remotely with the
17	parties participating by communications media
18	technology.
19	Members of the public who want to observe or
20	listen to this prehearing may do so by accessing
21	the live video broadcast, which is available from
22	the Commission website. Upon completion of the
23	prehearing, the archived video will also be
24	available.
25	Each person participating today needs to keep

1	their phone or device muted when they are not
	their phone or device muted when they are not
2	speaking, and only unmute when they are called upon
3	to speak. If they do not keep their phone muted,
4	or put their phone on hold, they may be
5	disconnected from the proceeding and will need to
6	call back in.
7	Also, telephonic participants should speak
8	directly into their phone and not use to the
9	speaker function.
10	Staff is what I reviewed of into other matters
11	at this time.
12	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you, staff.
13	Do any of the parties have any other
14	preliminary matters to address?
15	Okay. Great. Thank you.
16	Next we will move into Section V, proceed
17	through the draft prehearing order. I will
18	identify the sections that we can go through, and
19	the parties can let me know if any corrections or
20	changes that would be made. I will move somewhat
21	quickly through these, so please interject where
22	appropriate.
23	The first three sections, case background,
24	conduct of proceedings and jurisdiction, are pretty
25	standard. I can take all those three, if there is

1	any parties that have any changes to those at this
2	time.
3	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: Thank you, Commissioner,
4	this is Jason Higginbotham.
5	The only thing we would request is that
6	GoToMeeting invitation be provided to all three of
7	the attorneys who have appeared for Gulf Power, so
8	that would be myself, Jason Higginbotham, Ken Rubin
9	and Russell Badders.
10	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. That's fine. We can
11	do that.
12	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: Thank you.
13	COMMISSIONER FAY: Is there somebody else, or
14	is that it? Okay. Great.
15	We will move on to Section VI procedure
16	procedure for handling confidential information.
17	MR. TRIERWEILER: Materials that have been
18	identified by parties as confidential have been
19	marked and will be available via a secure password
20	on the Commission's website for use at the hearing.
21	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.
22	And then section we will move to Section
23	VII, prefiled testimony and exhibits and witnesses
24	be staff.
25	MR. TRIERWEILER: Staff suggests that the

1	witness summary testimony be no longer than five
2	minutes.
3	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.
4	And then cross-examination exhibits?
5	MR. TRIERWEILER: All cross-examination
6	exhibits and impeachment exhibits, confidential and
7	nonconfidential, that a party intends to use at
8	hearing must be provided to the Commission Clerk by
9	close of business August 25th, 2020, in order to be
10	processed and placed on the Commission as website.
11	The parties are aware of the cross-examination
12	requirements in Attachment A to the Draft
13	Prehearing Order.
14	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you.
15	Any any parties have any objections to the
16	time limit or the cross cross-examination
17	exhibit? Great.
18	All right. We will keep moving on.
19	Item VIII is the order of the witnesses. Are
20	there any well, go ahead, staff.
21	MR. TRIERWEILER: There are no stipulated
22	witnesses at this time.
23	COMMISSIONER FAY: Perfect.
24	And obviously, moving forward, we encourage
25	the parties, if if appropriate, to stipulate

1	before the hearing.
2	Basic positions
3	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: Commissioner
4	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yes.
5	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: My apologies.
6	COMMISSIONER FAY: No, go ahead.
7	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: I would just like to add
8	I would just like to add that the the order
9	indicates that the witnesses whose name is preceded
10	by a plus sign will present direct and rebuttal
11	testimony together and we would just like to note
12	that Gulf witness Paul Talley and Gulf witness
13	Mitchell Goldstein will both be presenting direct
14	and rebuttal testimony.
15	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. And do the other
16	parties have any objection to that?
17	MR. DAVID: No.
18	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yeah, so just for clarity,
19	they would be present they would be presenting
20	their direct and rebuttal one after another?
21	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: And so all right,
22	Commissioner, we would we would request that the
23	direct be presented and then cross-examination be
24	conducted on the direct, and then the witness be
25	permitted to present the rebuttal testimony with

1	cross-examination after.
2	I just wanted to make it clear for the record
3	that those witnesses will both be presenting direct
4	and rebuttal testimony.
5	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. And I
6	MR. RUBIN: Commissioner
7	COMMISSIONER FAY: that's fine. I don't
8	have any issue with that.
9	Yeah, go ahead.
10	MR. RUBIN: I am sorry. This is Ken Rubin,
11	but I just want to clarify our intention here is to
12	not have I understand that there is no plus
13	there now, and our intention is to allow direct
14	testimony by our by Gulf's witnesses, then to
15	allow Mr. Kollen to testify, and Mr. Gorman if he
16	needs to, we have offered to stipulate him. And
17	then Mr. Talley and Goldstein would offer their
18	rebuttal afterwards. But certainly, we are willing
19	to talk to to the parties about trying to
20	truncate that process.
21	But for now at least, we want to do it in the
22	order direct, direct by OPC and FEA, and then
23	rebuttal by Gulf's witnesses.
24	COMMISSIONER FAY: Got you, okay. And we
25	would I think we would move forward with the

1	direct, cross-examination, and then that witness
2	would be called back up for rebuttal. I think
3	what's being asked here is they would take up
4	rebuttal immediately after that cross-examination,
5	and I believe that a request would be for purposes
6	of efficiency, is that is that why it's being
7	asked?
8	MR. RUBIN: That's ultimately our goal, but at
9	this point, we would like to maintain the position
10	that the rebuttal would come after OPC and FEA's
11	witnesses are are allowed to testify, but we
12	will work towards trying to get get an agreement
13	with all the parties to move it move it forward.
14	But for this at least at this point, we
15	intend to or at least we would like to provide
16	our rebuttal witnesses after OPC and FEA have
17	testified.
18	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. I am I am fine
19	with that and I would just encourage you guys to
20	keep working on it to make sure procedurally, when
21	we get to the hearing, that there isn't any sort of
22	confusion at that point.
23	MR. RUBIN: Absolutely.
24	COMMISSIONER FAY: Thank you.
25	MR. RUBIN: Thank you.
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1	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yep.
2	So next we would move on to the basic
3	positions of the parties, if if any of the
4	parties have changes to those.
5	MR. TRIERWEILER: If changes are announced,
6	please note that changes to basic positions should
7	be submitted in writing by the close of business
8	tomorrow, August 20th, 2020.
9	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you, staff.
10	I am going to walk through the presented
11	Issues 1 through 12. I do think just to make
12	sure we are clear, FEA has taken a position of
13	agreeing with staff's position on some of those
14	issues, so I think, Mr. Trierweiler, if you could
15	clarify maybe how that would work as it relates to
16	OEP.
17	MR. TRIERWEILER: Yes, Commissioner.
18	We have a consensus issue list, which means
19	that at the time of that we put the order
20	together, there was no dispute as to the wording of
21	the issues themselves. However, as far as the
22	positions taken by the parties, FEA has adopted the
23	staff position, which is which is no position at
24	this time for their Issues 1 through 6 and 9
25	through 12 in accordance with the OEP, on page

seven, the large paragraph in the center of that pages, unless a matter takes a position by the deadline, wherein they are supposed to have offered a position or corrected their position, then they have waived that position and -- and may not take a position later on, or participate on that position at the hearing.

And this has been raised with FEA, and we wait their response, but want to emphasize that unless there is some sort of good cause shown, that the OEP should be enforced, and that by the close of business tomorrow, August 20th, they should select a position unless they want to waive that position.

COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.

So -- so, Mr. Friedman, we -- it's not uncommon, I think, for parties to potentially take another party's position, but for purposes of taking a position that is consistent with staff, the -- the timing might not be your best option in that, based on the OEP, you would waive any sort of position on that -- that issue. So if you do have changes to make on that, either today, feel free to raise them as we go through the issues, otherwise, raise -- make sure you raise them by the end of business tomorrow so the Commission can have

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1	clarity as to those in your your position. Is
2	that is that clear, Mr. Friedman?
3	MR. FRIEDMAN: Yes. This is Rob Friedman.
4	Thank you.
5	We will make any updates by the end of
6	business tomorrow if we need to; otherwise, we will
7	stick with just those two those two issues being
8	our issues we are contesting.
9	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you.
10	Next we will move on to the the issues. I
11	will walk through each issue to allow the parties
12	to inject if they have changes that they would like
13	to make for these issues, or or any issues that
14	they want to raise with these issues.
15	So starting with that, Issue 1, do the parties
16	have any any changes?
17	And I will I will walk through, and unless
18	I hear otherwise issues, I will keep moving on to
19	the next one.
20	Issue 2, do the parties have any changes?
21	Issue 3?
22	Issue 4?
23	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: Yes, Commissioner, this is
24	Jason Higginbotham.
25	So Issue 4, you know, subject to FEA

1	potentially changing its position on this, this
2	appears to be one that that could potentially be
3	stipulated and so, you know, Gulf would request
4	that, you know, if FEA plans to make changes to its
5	position on that, that it indicates that now;
6	otherwise this is this is an issue that
7	potentially could be stipulated, given OPC's
8	position and Gulf's.
9	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you.
10	That I think that would be for efficiency
11	purposes, that would make sense.
12	Mr. Trierweiler, as long as that we get
13	that notice from FEA by close of business tomorrow
14	with the other parties' agreement, that could be
15	stipulated and taken off off of the hearing
16	issue, correct or I guess clear that that issue
17	has been stipulated?
18	MR. TRIERWEILER: That is correct. However, I
19	believe this is also an offer by Gulf to see if FEA
20	was in a position where they could stipulate to the
21	issue at this time seeing how close the positions
22	of OPC and Gulf were.
23	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great.
24	Go ahead, Mary Anne.
25	MS. HELTON: Mr. Chairman, parties can reach

1	stipulation on issues up to the time of the
2	hearing, and then the Commission then would vote on
3	those stipulated issues at the hearing to see if,
4	when you are litigating the case, that will help
5	resolve what's up for litigation and what is not up
6	for litigation.
7	COMMISSIONER FAY: Right. I appreciate that.
8	So for our purposes, it is more of an
9	efficiency discussion. The parties are obviously
10	welcome to stipulate to any of those issues all the
11	way up until the hearing timeline.
12	So if if Mr. Friedman, if you have a
13	position on that today, it sounds like the parties
14	would be interested, otherwise, you can continue
15	the dialogue.
16	MR. FRIEDMAN: So the question is whether we
17	are in agreement to stipulate to that issue today?
18	COMMISSIONER FAY: Correct.
19	MR. FRIEDMAN: Yes, on that issue we are.
20	It's just both Issues 7 and 8 that we are
21	contesting at this time.
22	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. So you said Issue 4,
23	and then as we we keep going forward, we will
24	get to 7 and 8, we can take your positions on
25	those. I appreciate that.

1 And, Commissioner, this is MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: 2. Jason Higginbotham again, my apologies. 3 I meant to interject when you got to Issue 3. 4 This also appears to be an issue that potentially 5 could be stipulated. And based on Captain Friedman's representation, it appears that perhaps 6 7 FEA can stipulate that, but I want to confirm that obviously. 8 9 COMMISSIONER FAY: No, I appreciate that. And 10 I think based on FEA's position in this, that we --11 if they don't peak speak up otherwise, we presume 12 that won't be stipulated, and if they do, we -- we 13 will accept that stipulation from the parties 14 and -- and move on. 15 So no -- no concerns about going backwards a 16 little bit, because I think you made your point, 17 but I think just for purposes of what they would 18 like to do going forward, they are entitled to --19 to speak up and say that they are comfortable with 20 that or not as we go through the issues; and if 21 they don't, otherwise, we will presume that they --22 they want to continue the dialogue with the 23 parties. 24 So, FEA, if you have a position on Issue 3 25 also, feel free to present that now, otherwise we

1	will keep moving forward.
2	MR. FRIEDMAN: This is Rob Friedman.
3	We are we are going to be aligning with
4	staff on those issues, so if staff is agreeing to
5	stipulate, then then we are going to be in a
6	position to do the same, other than on those Issues
7	7 and 8.
8	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. And for purposes
9	MS. CRAWFORD: Commissioner Fay.
10	COMMISSIONER FAY: Hold on one second.
11	So for purposes of stipulations, the the
12	staff position doesn't relate to essentially what
13	the parties would would agree upon; however, if
14	you want to continue that dialogue with the
15	parties, you can do so.
16	So we will we will move past Issue 3,
17	because it doesn't sound like we have a specific
18	resolution to it. And on Issue 4, which we spoke
19	earlier about the parties' stipulation, which is
20	fine, we will move forward on Issue 5, and then
21	there is somebody also on the call had a comment
22	about this that they wanted to make.
23	MS. CRAWFORD: Yes, sir. This is Jennifer
24	Crawford.
25	I just want to offer for clarity. Staff

1	doesn't take positions on stipulations. Typically
2	the way they before the Commission is either all
3	parties stipulate, or some parties stipulate and
4	take no position or don't object
5	COMMISSIONER FAY: Correct.
6	MS. CRAWFORD: to the Commission's
7	stipulation. So just for clarity, staff wouldn't
8	enter a position on the stipulation, and so FEA
9	just needs to take a position accordingly.
10	COMMISSIONER FAY: I appreciate that. And I
11	think that that FEA is well aware at this
12	point kind of what the what the dos and don'ts
13	are as far as going through these, so we will
14	continue to to move through them. And if they
15	have something they would like to raise, they are
16	welcome to do so, but I do agree with you, related
17	to the statement of staff and taking stipulations,
18	that's not that's not a position that could be
19	taken forward.
20	However, if they don't make a change by the
21	close of business tomorrow, then the prehearing
22	order will reflect their their position, and
23	essentially be consistent with the OEP as to the
24	waiver of what their position is at that time.
25	So if we can move on to Issue 5.

1	MR. TRIERWEILER: Commissioner, excuse me.
2	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yeah, go ahead.
3	MR. TRIERWEILER: Before we do that, I realize
4	that we are talking about a stipulation and that we
5	did not hear from OPC. Even though their language
6	appears to be very similar, I believe that OPC
7	ought to indicate whether or not they believe that
8	they can stipulate to this to Issue 4.
9	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yeah, that's that's
10	fine. Once again, if they don't speak up based on
11	what we state, we will presume that that is the
12	case with the party on the line, but I do agree
13	with you.
14	When I looked at these originally, one party
15	is using the the number of 541,000, the other is
16	using .514 million, so I think the the numbers
17	align, but but are the positions consistent is a
18	fair point to verify.
19	So I think it would be maybe Tad or whoever
20	with OPC could verify that they are okay with the
21	stipulation on Issue 4.
22	MR. DAVID: Yeah. Right now thank you,
23	Commissioner Fay.
24	Right now, as far as we are not ready to
25	formally stipulate on on any of these. We will

1	just stand by our position in there, realizing that
2	it's that it's pretty closely aligned with
3	Gulf's, and that we will certainly continue to
4	consider, you know, stipulations as the time
5	permits and everything.
6	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay.
7	MR. DAVID: So but as far as formally
8	stipulating to any of the issues, I would withhold
9	such such agreement at at this moment.
10	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Thank you. I am
11	glad Mr. Trierweiler brought it up. It's good
12	clarity. So that is not a clear stipulation issue
13	for that issue. We will move on from their
14	position for Issue 4 to Issue 5 unless any of the
15	parties have anything else to add.
16	Okay. Great. Thank you.
17	Issue 5, any any parties have any issues?
18	Issue 6?
19	Issue 7?
20	Issue 8?
21	Issue 9?
22	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: I'm sorry, Commissioner.
23	My apologies.
24	On Issue 7
25	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. We will go back to

1	Issue 7. Go ahead.
2	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: Thank you.
3	So so Gulf would just request clarification
4	on FEA's position as to Issue 7, because the the
5	exclusion of regular payroll related costs
6	recoverable incremental storm damage cost does not
7	impact what actually goes into the storm reserve.
8	That's just kind of a number that that Gulf has
9	proposed. And so, you know, to the extent that
10	that specific line item were excluded is not going
11	to necessarily impact that number, and so Gulf
12	would just request some clarification from FEA on
13	its position for that issue.
14	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. That's fair.
15	And, FEA, if you want to provide some clarity
16	on that now, you can do so; otherwise, you can
17	you can provide a change in your position up to the
18	close of business tomorrow with staff.
19	MR. FRIEDMAN: Okay. Yeah, I will have to
20	confirm with Mr. Gorman, our expert, and will do
21	so.
22	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Will do. Thank you.
23	Moving on to Issue 8.
24	Issue 9?
25	Issue 10?
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1	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: And again, Commissioner,
2	this is Jason Higginbotham for Gulf.
3	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yeah.
4	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: And at this time, Gulf
5	would request some clarification from OPC on its
6	position.
7	COMMISSIONER FAY: On which issue?
8	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: It doesn't appear on
9	Issue 10.
10	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay.
11	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: It doesn't appear that
12	that OPC disagrees with the proposed tariff and
13	charge, the proposed tariff itself, so we just
14	wanted to understand if that is a specific I
15	know OPC is not not stipulating to anything at
16	this point, but just some clarification as to, you
17	know, whether the tariff itself is a subject of
18	disagreement, or if it's or if it's the charges.
19	I think the issue as framed is is
20	requesting whether the tariff and charge should be
21	approved, and it's just not clear to to Gulf
22	from from what OPC has indicated what its
23	position is on this. So we would just request a
24	clarification on that.
25	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. And OPC is put on

notice of that. Do you have anything to add, OPC?

MR. DAVID: Yes, this is Tad David for OPC.

Yeah, it just means that -- that the fact that we are not opposing -- I am not sure, and we may need to talk afterwards on this, but it's just opposed if they care if it's built and -- and associated charges is not being opposed, but what those charges should be and what the, you know, what specific content of the tariff should be with regard to our positions in the other issues, and the effects that some of the other issues are going to have on that -- on the charges are where our disagreement is.

So we -- we just wanted to ensure that we weren't -- that we didn't waive something from one of our other issues by agreeing to the proposed tariff. I don't know, I may not be -- maybe I am not understanding the -- the question or the issue, but --

COMMISSIONER FAY: No, that's fine. It doesn't sound like either party has an issue with the -- the language for the issue itself, but may impact other components of the decision. So that's something that you could keep discussing and decide if it could be resolved, or if you would want to

1	continue with the position you have here going
2	forward.
3	So just as I understand both parties, their
4	the issue itself doesn't is not problematic, but
5	OPC's response might need some clarity for the
6	parties, and that's perfectly fine to do so. And
7	if once again, if you do want to change that
8	position with OPC, you are you are welcome to do
9	so up to the close of business tomorrow. And of
10	course, can keep having the dialogue to keep
11	stipulate the issue between the parties.
12	Is that all for Issue 10?
13	MR. DAVID: Yes, sir. Thank you.
14	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yep.
15	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: Thank you, Commissioner.
16	COMMISSIONER FAY: Issue 11?
17	Issue 12?
18	Okay. Staff, are there any at this time,
19	are there any contested issues?
20	MR. TRIERWEILER: No, Commissioner. The
21	parties have worked together and achieved a
22	consensus issues list.
23	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great.
24	Then we will move on to the comprehensive
25	exhibit list.

1	MR. TRIERWEILER: Staff has prepared a
2	comprehensive exhibit list which lists all prefiled
3	exhibits and those exhibits that staff wishes to
4	include in the record.
5	The draft list was given to the parties to see
6	if there were any changes or objections to the CEL.
7	Some adjustments from made, more concerning the
8	introduction of any of staff's exhibits being
9	entered into the record.
10	At this time, we would like to see and hear
11	from the parties if there are any known changes
12	that need to be made to this updated comprehensive
13	exhibit list, and if there are any known objections
14	to the entry of staff's proposed exhibits into the
15	record.
16	Staff will continue to work with the parties
17	to work towards stipulating the comprehensive
18	exhibit list prior to the hearing.
19	COMMISSIONER FAY: Thank you.
20	So with that, we can then move on to Section
21	XII, which is stipulations.
22	MR. TRIERWEILER: There are no proposed
23	stipulations at this time.
24	COMMISSIONER FAY: I was afraid you were going
25	to say that, Mr. Trierweiler.

1	To ahead.
2	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: Good morning. Yeah, this
3	is Jason Higginbotham with Gulf.
4	So Gulf has agreed to stipulate to the
5	admission and waiver of cross cross-examination
6	or the direct testimony of FEA witness Gorman.
7	And it is Gulf's understanding, you know,
8	subject to confirmation by FEA, that FEA has also
9	agreed to stipulate to the admission and waiver of
10	cross-examination for Gulf witness Boyett, if FEA
11	can confirm that?
12	MR. FRIEDMAN: Yes, is that correct. This is
13	Rob Friedman, FEA.
14	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: Thank you.
15	Gulf is also able to stipulate to the
16	admission and waiver of cross-examination for the
17	direct testimonies of staff witnesses, Dobiac and
18	Vinson.
19	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great.
20	Are there any others?
21	Okay. Thank you for that, Mr. Trierweiler.
22	Is that is that okay?
23	MR. TRIERWEILER: Well, Commissioner, since it
24	looks like it may be appropriate to mention, if the
25	parties advise staff of any witness stipulations
I	

1	for for witnesses in which the testimony will
2	still be included in the docket, the staff will
3	confirm with each Commissioner that any identified
4	witness can be excused. If Commissioners do not
5	have any questions for these witnesses, then the
6	witnesses may be excused from the hearing, and his
7	or her testimony and exhibits entered into the
8	record at the time of the hearing as though they
9	were read.
10	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.
11	Parties have any other comments on that?
12	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: I guess, Commissioner,
13	given the stipulation for Gulf witness Boyett that
14	Gulf and FEA have entered into, Gulf would request
15	whether OPC is able to, at this time, stipulate to
16	a waiver of cross-examination and the admission of
17	Mr. Boyett's testimony into the record?
18	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. And I would presume
19	if they did that, then they would speak up and do
20	so, but we will give them the opportunity to do
21	that.
22	MR. DAVID: Right. And thank you,
23	Commissioner Fay. This is Tad David at OPC.
24	Right now, I can't stipulate to that. We
25	we we can work on potentially clarifying that

1	and stipulating after the phone call today, and
2	maybe even before the close of business tomorrow.
3	So we will continue to try to have a, you know, a
4	productive conversation with the other parties.
5	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.
6	And I know historically, the Commission has
7	encouraged those types of discussions, and this
8	is this is, you know, it was a Cat 5 hurricane,
9	so this is a big issue. The hope is that some of
10	those things can be resolved by the time of the
11	Commission, but that's for the parties to continue
12	that that dialogue.
13	If we don't have anything else under
14	stipulations, we will move on to pending
15	confidentiality motions.
16	MR. TRIERWEILER: Commissioner, there are five
17	pending confidentiality motions remaining at this
18	time, and staff will endeavor to get those resolved
19	prior to the hearing.
20	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.
21	With that, we will move on to the post-hearing
22	procedures. Mr. Trierweiler, can you just lay out
23	what that will look like do us?
24	MR. TRIERWEILER: Yes, Commissioner.
25	Staff recommends post-hearing briefs be

1	limited to 40 pages should briefs be necessary.
2	Staff also recommends that a summary of each
3	position of 50 words set off with asterisks should
4	be included in each prehearing statement.
5	If a bench decision is not made, post-hearing
6	briefs will be due on September 25th, 2020.
7	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.
8	Are all parties in agreement with that?
9	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: Yes. Thank you,
10	Commissioner.
11	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.
12	MR. DAVID: Yes. Thank you.
13	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great.
14	Well, then we we will move on to Section
15	XV, rulings.
16	MR. TRIERWEILER: Commissioner, these are
17	the the rulings that I have collected from the
18	prehearing. Staff recommends that the prehearing
19	officer make render a ruling that all parties shall
20	be provided five minutes for opening statements, is
21	that something that you want to take up at this
22	time?
23	COMMISSIONER FAY: Sure. I don't think we
24	have do we have any objections to that?
25	MR. TRIERWEILER: Thank you.

1	Witness summaries, as discussed earlier, are
2	also limited to five minutes, and we are taking
3	into account the fact that the two Gulf witnesses
4	that are providing both direct and rebuttal will
5	provide their statement, be subject to
6	cross-examination on direct, and then present their
7	rebuttal and then cross-examination.
8	Confidential and nonconfidential exhibits that
9	a party intends to use at the hearing must be
10	provided to the customer the Commission Clerk by
11	the close of business on August 25th, 2020, in

accordance with Attachment A to the draft

prehearing order.

Changes to basic positions should be submitted I -- it's in writing by close of business tomorrow. That includes positions of each party on -- on each and every issue that they wish to change.

COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. And I think the only little thing we had flagged, I know that Mary Anne is working through her schedule to make sure she could be here this morning, and thankfully she was, because in the order it states witness summaries shall not exceed five minutes per party, and we will make sure we clarify that that's per witness. We are not limiting the parties to that -- that

1	level of time.
2	So just that's reflected in the rulings
3	correctly, but just make sure when we place out
4	this order, it will be consistent with that.
5	MS. HELTON: And, Mr. Chairman, can I just
6	clarify a statement that Mr. Trierweiler made to
7	make sure I understand?
8	COMMISSIONER FAY: Sure.
9	MS. HELTON: So when Gulf's witness takes the
10	stand for direct, the witnesses will be given five
11	minutes to summarize that testimony, though they
12	don't have to take the full five minutes; and then
13	when the witness takes the stand for rebuttal, the
14	witness will be given five minutes to summarize his
15	or her testimony.
16	MR. TRIERWEILER: I appreciate that
17	clarification.
18	COMMISSIONER FAY: Their rebuttal, yeah, and
19	unless the parties have any objection to that
20	rebuttal time also being five minutes, we would
21	move forward with that.
22	MR. DAVID: This is Tad David with OPC.
23	The only it's not necessarily an objection,
24	but I would want to ensure that the five minutes
25	that they devoted to summarizing rebuttal was

1	that we would I would want to preserve an
2	objection if they try to delve into into things
3	that were on direct or that were responsive to our
4	direct testimony that are that is not in
5	their their rebuttal testimony. But that's just
6	clarity that I want to reserve the right to object
7	if they if they stray afield.
8	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. That it's a fair
9	point. I mean, it's something our Chair would make
10	the decision at the time if they they were
11	outside the scope of of what was appropriate.
12	Anything to add, staff?
13	MR. DAVID: Thank you.
14	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yep.
15	Okay. I guess are there are there any
16	other matters to address?
17	MR. TRIERWEILER: Commissioner, staff is aware
18	of no other matters at this time.
19	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great.
20	Do the parties have any additional matters
21	they would like to raise at this time?
22	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: Nothing from Gulf,
23	Commissioner.
24	Thank you.
25	MR. DAVID: Nothing from OPC.

1	Thank you.
2	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. And, FEA, we are
3	good?
4	MR. FRIEDMAN: Nothing further from FEA.
5	Thank you.
6	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Okay. With that,
7	staff, anything else?
8	MR. TRIERWEILER: No.
9	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Seeing no other
10	matters, this prehearing conference is now
11	adjourned.
12	Thank you so much.
13	MR. DAVID: Thank you.
14	MR. HIGGINBOTHAM: Thank you.
15	(Proceedings concluded at 10:05 a.m.)
