Overcoming Racial Inequality Then and Now

PUF member organizations and readers will receive next month my new book, "Lewis Latimer: The First Hidden Figure." It tells the inspiring story of this extraordinary founding father of our industry, and the challenges of being the sole African American at the apex of the nation's commerce during the many setbacks on the road to racial equality.

With the cover painted by the First Vice President of NARUC, an introductory essay by the retired Executive Vice President of the Edison Electric Institute (who himself broke down racial barriers), the startup of the PUF Latimer Scholarship Fund with the American Association of Blacks in Energy, and many beautiful illustrations of Latimer's life and work, the book should have a large impact.

Here's a sample from the book:

The decisive battle of the war of currents between Thomas Edison and George Westinghouse, with Nikola Tesla much more than an ordinary warrior in the conflict, was fought at the World's Columbian Exposition in 1893. To celebrate the four hundredth anniversary of Christopher Columbus' landing in the Americas, the spectacular hundred and eighty-four day fair – which brought a third of the nation's populace to Chicago to see the future and featured everything from the first Ferris wheel to the first serial killer – has been oftentimes depicted in popular culture. There's Erik Larson's 2003 book, "The Devil in the White City: Murder, Magic, and Madness at the Fair That Changed America," for example, and the star-studded 2017 movie, "The Current War."

It has been little-noticed that the movie featured the British actor Simon Manyonda of South African and Zimbabwean descent playing the role of Lewis Latimer. Latimer is shown realistically in the film as a clever and studious man in Thomas Edison's employ – and the sole one of color – advising Edison as the Wizard of Menlo Park endeavors to beat down all of those with a competing claim to electricity's development. Hiram Maxim, Latimer's former employer, was one. George Westinghouse was another.

The movie captures the character of Latimer, Edison and the other warriors of current. One scene early on opens with Edison throwing a tantrum in front of twenty of his men gathered in the laboratory, after discovering George Westinghouse had taken an advantage in the war, using Hiram Maxim's light bulbs:

Thomas Edison, played by actor Benedict Cumberbatch: No! How did he get the bulbs? {Edison pauses, about to explode in anger.} What a roaring silence from the brightest minds of America.

Lewis Latimer, played by actor Simon Manyonda: He's using Hiram's design.

Edison: {Now, in a rage.} Which Hiram stole from me! Sue him!

Latimer: We already did. The Court upheld his patent.

Edison: I'm talking about Westinghouse. Find an angle.

Samuel Insull, played by actor Tom Holland: Take a trip to Barrington and see for yourself {at George Westinghouse's laboratory}.

Edison: {He's really shouting now.} You're not even slightly irked that fifteen years of work have been filched from right under your eyes. Not again! I built a system here and you go shopping for patents to cobble together something to legally steal what is mine. If bulbs are a battle, then nail him on the dynamos {that is, the power generator patents}.

Insull: We can't. He's not even using direct current, sir.

Edison: He's using alternating?

September 1-15 Grid Stats

Through Tuesday night, electricity sales in the continental U.S. in the first half of September were 4.9 percent less than in the same period last year. That is a big drop.

Coal plant generation was 7.2 percent less. So, it's not surprising that carbon dioxide emissions were 7 percent less.

Generation by zero-emission plants – nuclear, hydro, wind, solar – accounted for a smidge over one-third of all the grid's power, 33.9 percent. This means of course that plants that emit carbon dioxide produced the remaining 66.1 percent of the grid's power.

Since we are having a hearing about Solar I have a problem. I want the Tier 1 threshold to be raised to 30kW, so I can install more panels without incurring the liability insurance expenses associated with installing a Tier 2 system. The Tier level thresholds and the insurance requirement for Tier 2 are established in Rule 25-6.065, Florida Administrative Code, Interconnection and Net Metering of Customer-Owned Renewable Generation (generally referred to as the Net Metering Rule). The rule can be viewed here: <https://www.flrules.org/gateway/ruleNo.asp?id=25-6.065>

I have 36 solar panels installed on my roof it's a rated 7.6 KW system. We do not produce anything near 7.6 kw. The system cost \$31,500. And our electric bill is \$163. That to me seems a high bill for a person that is making electricity. I would like to put as much solar panels as possible on my roof but with the limit of requiring me to have additional insurance is cost prohibitive. With Solar panels becoming cheaper it seems that this level should be changed to 30,000 watts of power because if I go over 10,000 watt then I need to get a Million dollar insurance policy added when you go to a Tier 2 and that is an additional \$400 a year for this policy and not very many companies will do it. I went to 3 different insurance agencies. 10,000 watts of power is not a lot of power. My house power demands are not being meet and I have a PV solar system installed. My house is a block house and is not a large home only 1392 SQFT built in 2003.

I would think the "Sunshine" state would encourage people to go to cleaner form of power but when I need to get additional insurance for a very safe form of power it does the opposite. If I have to get insurance for the life of the 25 year warranty system it would be an additional \$10,000 spent. That is a lot of money just to produce safe clean renewable power.

How many Solar systems have caused harm to the electric grid? Where is the data that says 10,000 watt system is the correct level for Tier 1.

I also want the net metering to stay where it is or to be better for consumers. When you compare PV solar in other states FL is in the dark ages. Why is FPL installing so many PV solar systems but does not want customers to put it on their roofs? My power flickers all the time.
