2	COMMISSIONER FAY: Good afternoon. This is
3	October 26th, exactly 1:00 oh, 1:31. And we'll
4	call this prehearing conference to order.
5	Staff, (technical interruption).
6	MS. WEISENFELD: Good afternoon, Commissioner.
7	By notice issued on October 7th, 2020, this time
8	and place has been set for prehearing conferences
9	in Docket Nos. 20200001-EI, 20200002-EG,
10	20200003-GU, 20200004-GU, and 20200007-EI.
11	The purpose of these prehearings is set out
12	more fully in the notice.
13	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. And then we'll take
14	appearances. Ms. Weisenfeld, do you have anything
15	to add before we take appearance?
16	MS. WEISENFELD: Yes, Commissioner. There are
17	five dockets to address today. Staff suggests that
18	all appearances be taken at once. All parties
19	should enter their appearances and declare the
20	dockets that they are entering an appearance for.
21	Several parties will make appearances and, after
22	the parties make their appearances, staff will need
23	to make theirs.
24	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. And we'll start
25	with appearances. Florida Power & Light just

1	real really quick, can you hear me okay? Audio
2	coming in? Better? Thank you.
3	Okay. Florida Power & Light, go ahead.
4	MS. MONCADA: Good afternoon, Commissioner

14	Putnal with our firm.
15	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Gotcha, Mr. Moyle.
16	Thank you.
17	PCS Phosphate.
18	MS. BAKER: Good afternoon, Commissioner.
19	This is Laura Baker on behalf of White Springs
20	Agricultural Chemicals doing business as PCS
21	Phosphate, in the 01, 02, and 07 dockets. I'd also
22	like to enter an appearance on behalf of my
23	partner, James Brew, in the same docket.
24	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. We gotcha.
25	Commission staff.

1	MS. WEISENFELD: Commissioner, this is Ashley
2	Weisenfeld. I'd also like to enter appearances for
3	Kurt Schrader in the 03 docket, Gabriella Passidomo
4	in the 04, Charles Murphy in the 07, Suzanne
5	Brownless in the 01.
6	And just before we finish appearances, I want
7	to make sure that we give TECO the chance to say if
8	they're on the line as well.
9	COMMISSIONER FAY: I'm sorry. Say that again,
10	Ms. Weisenfeld, the last part.
11	MS. WEISENFELD: Oh, just before we conclude
12	appearances, I just wanted to make sure that TECO
13	gets the chance to enter their appearances as well,
14	if they're on the line.
15	COMMISSIONER FAY: Who is it? I I
16	apologize TECO, oh. Thank you.
17	MS. WEISENFELD: Tampa Electric. We might
18	have skipped them earlier.
19	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yeah, no, thank you.
20	TECO, are you on the line?
21	MR. MEANS: Yes. Good afternoon, Commissioner
22	Fay. This is Malcolm Means with the Ausley
23	McMullen Law Firm appearing on behalf of Tampa
24	Electric in the 01, 02, and 07 dockets. And I'd
25	also like to enter an appearance in those same

1	dockets for Jim Beasley and Jeff Wahlen. And I
2	believe Mr. Beasley is also on the line this
3	afternoon.
4	Thank you.
5	COMMISSIONER FAY: Thank you. And I apologize
6	for that, TECO. I was I was up late watching my
7	Rays lose to the Dodgers last night. So, my
8	apology for that miss.
9	MR. GRIFFIN: Commissioner Fay, one more

11	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yes.
12	MR. GRIFFIN: This is Steven Griffin with the

15	appearance for Russell Badders in the 02 docket.
16	Thank you very much.
17	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you.

20	your advisor along with your general counsel, Keith
21	Hetrick, for all the dockets.
22	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.
23	We will work into preliminary matters.

buildings are currently closed to the public and

being conducted remotely with the parties

participating by communications media technology.

Members of the public who want to observe or listen to this prehearing may do so by accessing the live video broadcast, which is available from the Commission website. Upon completion of the prehearing, the archived video will also be available.

And just a little bit of housekeeping here. I know we have a number of dockets, so we'll be taking those up in numerical order, with the exception of the 01 docket, which we will take up last.

1	And for those who do want to speak up as we're
2	going through these dockets, please when you do
3	speak up, just acknowledge your your name just
4	so the court reporter is able to track who is
5	speaking. I think that's all I have for that.
6	We can move on to Docket 2 20200002.
7	Ms. Weisenfeld, do we have any preliminary matters
8	before we go into the draft prehearing order?
9	MS. WEISENFELD: Yes, Commissioner. All
10	issues have been stipulated in this docket and the
11	parties have agreed to excuse all witnesses and to
12	include all exhibits on the comprehensive exhibit
13	list into the record.
14	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Any parties that
15	MS. WEISENFELD: Staff has no other
16	preliminary matters.
17	COMMISSIONER FAY: I apologize. Say that last
18	part again?
19	MS. WEISENFELD: Oh, I was just saying that we
20	have no other preliminary matters at this time.
21	That's it.
22	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great.
23	And any any other party have any other
24	preliminaries to take up?
25	MR. REHWINKEL: Commissioner, Charles

1	Rehwinkel with the Office of the Public Counsel.
2	For this docket and all others, with respect
3	to the admission of testimony and exhibits, we
4	would like the record to reflect that we we do
5	not object to the entry of the CEL and the
6	testimony and exhibits.
7	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay.
8	MR. REHWINKEL: Thank you.
9	COMMISSIONER FAY: Thank you.
10	We will move through the
11	MR. MOYLE: And
12	COMMISSIONER FAY: Oh, go ahead. Is there
13	somebody else?
14	MR. MOYLE: I I would just add that that
15	that would be the same for FIPUG. I don't feel a
16	need to repeat that for the 01, 02, and 07
17	document doc dockets, but just because we've
18	entered a Type 2 stipulation, that couldn't
19	shouldn't be construed as saying, oh, we've
20	stipulated affirmatively to anything. So, same
21	point. I just wanted to me-too it.
22	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. And it if
23	there I think just translating what both you and
24	the Office of Public Counsel said, if there's
25	anything specific in the the language regarding

1	the "no position," that's something that would be
2	submitted for the final prehearing order. So, I
3	appreciate that.
4	We're going to move through the prehearing
5	order fairly quickly because of all the
6	stipulations. If there is something that is, I
7	guess, by your definition either incorrect or
8	something that we've missed to that draft
9	prehearing order, please feel free to object and we
10	will acknowledge you and then let you speak on that
11	item.
12	With that said, I'll move through Section I,
13	case background.
14	Section II, conduct of proceedings.
15	And Section III, jurisdiction.
16	Section IV, procedure for handling
17	confidential information.
18	Section V, prefiled testimony and exhibits,
19	witnesses.
20	MS. WEISENFELD: Commissioner, staff
21	suggests
22	COMMISSIONER FAY: Oh, go ahead.
23	MS. WEISENFELD: for any witness who is not
24	excused sorry, Commissioner. This is Ashley
25	Weisenfeld.
1	

1	Staff suggests, for any witness who is not
2	excused, that the summary of their testimony be no
3	longer than three minutes.
4	COMMISSIONER FAY: All right. Thank you.
5	And I know this is pretty standard with most
6	dockets, but in the 01 docket, there is some
7	language about the the standard operation of
8	witness testimony. And I've asked staff to make
9	sure that that's included in these various dockets.
10	I know, with different dockets different
11	clauses being brought together and different
12	dockets running continuously, it can be sort of
13	fairly complex to keep up with all of these. And I
14	just want to ensure that there's standard language
15	throughout those prehearing orders.
16	With that, I'll move on to the order of
17	witnesses.
18	MS. HELTON: Commissioner
19	COMMISSIONER FAY: Mary Anne, did you have
20	something? I apologize.
21	MS. HELTON: I just wanted to confirm and
22	clarify and make sure that I understand, so that it
23	can be included appropriately in the order, that
24	the parties have agreed to stipulate and enter into
25	the record the testimony and the exhibits, and

1	we're waiting to here from Commissioners and
2	that will actually happen by the with the
3	Chairman's doing so at the pre at the hearing,
4	if everyone is in agreement.
5	COMMISSIONER FAY: So so, that is accurate.
6	The prehearing order that would be finalized by the
7	end of business tomorrow would state the intent of
8	that, but Commissioners have the opportunity to
9	object (technical interruption). Does that clarify
10	it for you?
11	MS. HELTON: Yes, sir.
12	COMMISSIONER FAY: Thank you.
13	Let's see here. Move on to the order of
14	witnesses. Staff?
15	MS. MONCADA: Commissioner Fay, this is Maria
16	Moncada.
17	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yes, Maria. Go ahead.
18	MS. MONCADA: Thank you. Just one correction
19	in the order of witnesses. For Witness Renee B.
20	Deaton, the issue numbers for her should be one
21	through three, five through seven, and ten.
22	MS. WEISENFELD: Maria, this is Ashley. I've
23	got that change made. Thank you.
24	MS. MONCADA: Thank you, Ashley.
25	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.

1	Any other issues with the order of witnesses?
2	MS. WEISENFELD: Yes, Commissioner. We will
3	confirm with each Commissioner that the witnesses
4	can be excused. If no Commissioner has any
5	questions of those witnesses, the witnesses may be
6	excused from the hearing and his or her testimony
7	and exhibits may be entered into the record as
8	though read.
9	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.
10	Move on to Section VII, basic positions. Any
11	parties have any issues with their basic positions?
12	Ms. Weisenfeld, did you want to clarify
13	anything here?
14	MS. WEISENFELD: I could just note here that,
15	if there were changes to these positions, those
16	changes should be submitted in writing by close of
17	business tomorrow, October 27th.
18	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you. That
19	correct.
20	Section VIII, issues and positions. Staff?
21	MS. WEISENFELD: Issues and positions
22	issues and positions are included in the draft
23	prehearing order and staff notes that there are
24	Type 2 stipulations on all issues.
25	COMMISSIONER FAY: And with those Type 2

1	stipulations, (technical interruption) feel
2	comfortable moving forward, unless any party has
3	any specific issue or stipulation that they would
4	want to address here.
5	With that, we'll move on to Section IX,
6	exhibit list. Ms. Weisenfeld.
7	MS. WEISENFELD: Staff has prepared a
8	comprehensive exhibit list that includes all
9	prefiled exhibits and all also all exhibits that
10	staff wishes to include in the record.
11	Staff's understanding is that the parties have
12	agreed to include the comprehensive exhibit list in
13	the record at the hearing.
14	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.
15	Section X, proposed stipulations.
16	MS. WEISENFELD: The proposed stipulations for
17	all issues are set forth in Section X of the draft
18	prehearing order. The stipulations include the
19	excusal of witnesses and the inclusion of testimony
20	and exhibits in the record.
21	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Thank you.
22	And then, Section XI, pending motions; Section
23	XII, pending confidentiality motions.
24	MS. WEISENFELD: There are none.
25	COMMISSIONER FAY: Thank you.

1	Section XIV [sic], post-hearing procedures.
2	Ms. Weisenfeld.
3	MS. WEISENFELD: A bench decision may be
4	possible in this docket; however, if there is no
5	bench decision, staff recommends that post-hearing
6	briefs be no longer than 40 pages.
7	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.
8	Any parties have any issue with that?
9	Great. Thank you.
10	Section XIV, rulings. Ms. Weisenfeld.
11	MS. WEISENFELD: We recommend that a ruling be
12	made that opening statements, if any, should not
13	exceed five minutes per party unless any party
14	chooses to waive its opening statement.
15	Because this case has been stipulated and the
16	parties have agreed to excuse the witnesses, no
17	cross-examination is anticipated; however, should
18	cross-examination exhibits be needed, all cross
19	exhibits that a party intends to use at the hearing
20	must be provided to the Commission clerk by the
21	close of business on October 27th, 2020, in order
22	to be processed and made available digitally.
23	Attachment A to the draft prehearing order
24	explains the process for the parties to follow when
25	providing cross-examination exhibits to the clerk.

1	The exhibits that are prefiled and designated as
2	cross-examination or impeachment exhibits shall not
3	be viewed by opposing witnesses or opposing counsel
4	or otherwise have their contents or identity
5	communicated to such witnesses or counsel.
6	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.
7	Any parties have issue with that?
8	All right. I think staff, are there any
9	other matters that we need to address for the
10	prehearing conference?
11	MS. WEISENFELD: Just that any edits to the
12	draft prehearing order will be circulated to the
13	parties for review before the order is issued. The
14	comprehensive exhibit list has already been
15	circulated.
16	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.
17	And just last opportunity for any of the
18	parties, if there's any additional matters that
19	need to be addressed?
20	Great. Thank you. With that, I will conclude
21	the 02 docket and move on to the 03 docket.
