RESOLUTION NO. 2020-48

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA, REVISING THE MONTHLY ELECTRICAL RATES AS CONTAINED IN APPENDIX A, SECTION 18 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, PURSUANT TO SECTION 74-113 OF THE CLEWISTON CODE OF ORDINANCES, TO REFLECT ADJUSTMENTS TO THE RATES, AND PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, a financial planning model to support the Fiscal Year 2021 budgeting process was developed by Florida Municipal Power Agency (FMPA) and presented to the commission at its regular meeting on April 12, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the financial analysis estimates that Fiscal Year 2021 revenues at current rates will fall short of budgeted Electric Department costs by approximately five percent.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA, that:

SECTION 1. The City Commission hereby authorizes rate adjustments to the electrical rates to help meet the estimated revenue shortfall.

SECTION 2. Pursuant to Section 74-113, "Monthly electrical rates", the monthly electrical rates as reflected in Appendix A, Section 18 of the Clewiston Code of Ordinances, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18 Monthly electrical rates.

The following uniform monthly electricity rate shall be charged by the city for electric current furnished to consumers of electricity (language from section 74-113 of the Code of Ordinances):

(1) Where such electric current is used for a single-family dwelling unit occupied by one family or household:

- d. Customer using less than 400 kWh will receive a credit (per kWh) ..0.0100...\$0.0105

The minimum monthly bill shall be the customer charge, plus other applicable charges, covered by ordinance, state statutes or federal law.

- (2) Where such electric current is used for nonresidential customers with an electrical demand requirement of less than ten kWh per month:

The minimum monthly bill shall be the customer charge, plus other applicable charges, covered by ordinance, state statutes or federal law.

- (3) Where such electric current is used for nonresidential customers with an electrical demand requirement of ten kWh or more:

 - d. Billing demand. The maximum 15-minute integrated demand established, or 70 percent of the highest demand for the prior 11 months.

The minimum monthly bill shall be the customer charge, plus billing demand, and other applicable charges covered by ordinance, state statutes or federal law.

- (4) The rate charged by the city for electric energy furnished to consumers of electricity shall be decreased or increased \$0.0001 per kilowatt hour for each \$0.0001, or a major fraction thereof, decrease below or increase above \$0.0375 per kilowatt hour as determined by the average cost to the city each month including a power cost true-up (plus \$0.002 per kilowatt hour). The power cost true-up shall be the difference between the power cost actually incurred in second month preceding and the power cost recovered through application of the power cost base and the power cost adjustment.
- (5) The uniform monthly electricity rate charged by the city for electric current furnished to consumers in subsections (1) through (3) of this section, inclusive, shall be decreased or increased the applicable proportionate part of any taxes and assessments imposed by any governmental authority below, or in excess of, those in effect on May 1, 1981; which are assessed on the basis of meters or customers or the price of, or revenues from, electric energy or services sold, or the volume of energy purchased for sale or sold.

SECTION 3. The rates provided for herein shall be effective October 1, 2020.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA, REVISING THE MONTHLY ELECTRICAL RATES AS CONTAINED IN APPENDIX A, SECTION 18 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, PURSUANT TO SECTION 74-113 OF THE CLEWISTON CODE OF ORDINANCES, TO REFLECT BULK POWER COST ADJUSTMENTS AND A RATE STABILIZATION FUND ADJUSTMENT, AND PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, a financial planning model to support the Fiscal Year 2021 budgeting process was developed by Florida Municipal Power Agency (FMPA) and presented to the commission at its regular meeting on April 12, 2020; and

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to provide for the establishment of a Rate Stabilization Fund, provide for a Rate Stabilization Fund Adjustment, and a Bulk Power Cost Adjustment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF CLEWISTON, FLORIDA, that:

- SECTION 1. The City Commission hereby authorizes rate adjustments to the electrical rates to help meet the estimated revenue shortfall.
- <u>SECTION 2.</u> Pursuant to Section 74-113, "Monthly electrical rates", the monthly electrical rates as reflected in Appendix A, Section 18 of the Clewiston Code of Ordinances, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 18 Monthly electrical rates.
