OBSCENE RATE INCREASES

Lee Constantine, commissioner, Seminole County:

The Public Service Commission staff's habit of leaving for jobs from the very companies they are authorized to regulate has always brought into question their ethics and judgment. But their latest recommendation makes me shake my head in disbelief. With the PSC decision looming on Utilities Inc.'s consolidation rate increase Aug. 3, the staff is supporting a \$5.5 million increase, with more than \$4 million, or 70 percent-plus, coming from customers in Seminole, Orange and Lake counties. One system, in Orange, would see a 212 percent rate increase. We should not subsidize Utilities Inc.'s 16 separate systems. State law requires a "reasonable and not unfairly discriminatory" rate. Public Service commissioners, abide by the law: Say no to these obscene rate increases.

My water bill averaged \$50 before the last major increase. It is currently averaging around \$100 and going to \$125 plus per month if this increase is passed.....assuming 5000 gallons. Forget irrigation!! It is becoming financially undesirable to live in this part of Seminole county. This is OUTRAGEOUS. No other "business" could get away with a heinous rate increase like this (Spectrum Cable can but I am able to cancel their service).

The only option to avoid this disgraceful and egregious increase is to sell and relocate. That is not reasonable, feasible or fair. PLEASE DENY the current request.
