## CONSUMER COMMENTS

As a Florida resident, I firmly object to a rate hike for the following reasons:

- 1) As a monopoly you can recover cost w/out increasing rates
- 2) As a subsidiary of Next Era, a publicly traded co with the largest renewable portfolio, you are still depending on 74% natural gas (an ghg emitter heating planet) for electricity generation
- 3) We are barely returning to normal from pandemic and many families, specifically lower income, will be challenged
- 4) The vagueness and low social contract places the burden of proof this is justifiable - NO details to public
- 5) Your financials state otherwise (\$26B P/E)
- 6) Increase in temperatures will create more demand to assist covering cost & returns
