¹ Events one and two do not include Florida Public Utilities Company (FPUC). By Order No. PSC-2020-0097-PCO-EI, issued on April 6, 2020, in Docket No. 20200068-EI, FPUC was allowed to file its initial SPP in 2021 and submit an updated SPP in 2023. Following Commission approval of SPPCRC settlement agreements with respect to the other investor owned electric utilities, by Order PSC-2020-0502-PAA-EI, issued December 16, 2020, in Docket No. 20200028-EI, FPUC was allowed to defer filing its SPP from April 12, 2021, to April 2022, so that it could remain in alignment with the overall plan update schedule for the other utilities. ² FPUC is included in events three through twelve.

ORDERED by Commissioner Mike La Rosa, as Prehearing Officer, that Order No. PSC-2022-0044-PCO-EI is modified as set forth in the body of this order. It is further

NOTICE OF FURTHER PROCEEDINGS OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

The Florida Public Service Commission is required by Section 120.569(1), Florida Statutes, to notify parties of any administrative hearing or judicial review of Commission orders that is available under Sections 120.57 or 120.68, Florida Statutes, as well as the procedures and time limits that apply. This notice should not be construed to mean all requests for an administrative hearing or judicial review will be granted or result in the relief sought.

Mediation may be available on a case-by-case basis. If mediation is conducted, it does not affect a substantially interested person's right to a hearing.

Any party adversely affected by this order, which is preliminary, procedural or intermediate in nature, may request: (1) reconsideration within 10 days pursuant to Rule 25-

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22.0376, Florida Administrative Code; or (2) judicial review by the Florida Supreme Court, in the case of an electric, gas or telephone utility, or the First District Court of Appeal, in the case of a water or wastewater utility. A motion for reconsideration shall be filed with the Office of Commission Clerk, in the form prescribed by Rule 25-22.0376, Florida Administrative Code. Judicial review of a preliminary, procedural or intermediate ruling or order is available if review of the final action will not provide an adequate remedy. Such review may be requested from the appropriate court, as described above, pursuant to Rule 9.100, Florida Rules of Appellate Procedure.
