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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Seeing nothing else in
3	the 07 docket, I think we can move on to the 10
4	docket.
5	Mr. Stiller, that's you. It looks like you
6	are in the batter's box ready to go, so I will kick
7	it off to you for to address us before the
8	prehearing, the draft prehearing order.
9	MR. STILLER: Good morning, Commissioner La
10	Rosa.
11	Staff is unaware of preliminary matters that
12	need to be addressed at this time.
13	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Excellent.
14	Does any of the parties have any other
15	preliminary matters? OPC, you are recognized.
16	MS. WESSLING: Just briefly.
17	We have already submitted some proposed
18	changes to staff yesterday afternoon, and I can
19	either go through them individually or not, but the
20	very first one does appear on the first page. We
21	are just addressing the notices of appearance on
22	that page, which is I just wanted to point that
23	out before we got into the actual sections.
24	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Staff.
25	MR. STILLER: Commissioner, yes. We received

1	a number of editorial suggestions from the Office
2	of Public Counsel and Duke Energy in the last two
3	days. None of them are in the nature of
4	substantive changes, with the exception, perhaps,
5	of the deletion of counsel for OPC. And those are
6	going to be incorporated into the prehearing order
7	without going through them individual word change
8	by word change unless it is the preference of you,
9	Mr. Commissioner, or any of the parties. They are
10	editorial changes and have been supplied to all the
11	parties.
12	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: It's not, unless one of
13	the parties would like to hear them. It does not
14	seem so, and certainly that will be circulated.
15	MS. KEATING: Commissioner.
16	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Yes.
17	MS. KEATING: Sorry.
18	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: No, you are recognized.
19	MS. KEATING: For FPUC, I just wanted to make
20	the parties aware, and make you aware, that FPUC
21	has been in some discussions with Commission staff
22	about some minor adjustments to Issues 2, 3 and 4
23	that ultimately have a very minor impact on the
24	factors in No. 7, and we are fully prepared to
25	provide those to all those all the parties

1	before the close of business today.
2	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Excellent.
3	Staff agrees.
4	Okay, seeing no other preliminary matters, I
5	believe, let's move on to each section, starting
6	with the Case Background, Section 1. Seeing
7	nothing.
8	Section II, Conduct in Proceedings.
9	Section III, Jurisdiction.
10	Section IV, Procedures in Handling
11	Confidential Information.
12	Section V, Prefiled Testimony and Exhibits and
13	Witnesses. Staff, do you have anything there?
14	MR. STILLER: Staff would suggest that for any
15	witness who is not excused that the summary of
16	their testimony be limited to three minutes.
17	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: That sounds fair. Any
18	objections? FPL.
19	MR. CHRISTOPHER WRIGHT: Commissioner, this is
20	Chris Wright for Florida Power & Light. No
21	objection, but to try to expedite this proceeding,
22	FPL is willing to waive the opening summaries of
23	its witnesses.
24	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Thank you. Noted.
25	Let's move on to the Order of Witnesses in

1	Section VI.
2	MR. MEANS: Commissioner, one small change for
3	Tampa Electric.
4	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: You are recognized,
5	yeah, go ahead.
6	MR. MEANS: Thank you.
7	We would to ask though Witness Sloan Lewis be
8	removed from the witness list. Witness Richard
9	Latta is substituted for her, and then we could
10	list Issues 1 through 10 for Witness Latta.
11	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Are there any
12	objections to that, parties?
13	MR. MEANS: Thank you.
14	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: No problem.
15	MR. BERNIER: Mr. Commissioner, I just wanted
16	to make a note for the record that it is Section
17	VI, and then later Section IX, where we made
18	corrections that were provided to staff, and I
19	believe to the parties. And if not, I will make
20	sure that they were, but for the record.
21	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay.
22	MR. BERNIER: Thank you.
23	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Sounds right.
24	Okay. Anything else?
25	All right. Can we talk about the order of

1	witnesses?
2	MR. STILLER: Yes, Mr. Commissioner. If
3	stipulation of issues and witness testimony can be
4	reached, staff will confirm with each Commissioner
5	will such witnesses can be excused. If no
6	Commissioner has a question of a stipulated
7	witness, the witness may be excused from the
8	hearing and his or her testimony and exhibits
9	entered into the record at the hearing as though
10	read.
11	Staff would further note that the OEP requires
12	that each party take a position at the prehearing
13	conference unless good I am sorry, I was
14	skipping your section, Mr. Commissioner.
15	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: No problem.
16	Let's jump, then, to the basic positions. Do
17	the parties have any changes to your basic
18	positions? Seeing none. As, you know, disclosed
19	before, please if that changes, please have that
20	into us before the end of the close tomorrow end
21	of business close tomorrow.
22	Issues and Positions.
23	MR. STILLER: Yes, Commissioner. The OEP
24	requires that each party take a position at the
25	prehearing conference unless good cause can be

1	shown why they cannot do so. If a party's position
2	in the draft prehearing order is listed as no
3	position at this time, that party must change it
4	today or show good cause why it can't take a
5	position. And on that, I would note that OPC has
6	changed in the submitted drafts their position to
7	no position. Absent a showing of good cause, the
8	prehearing order will reflect no position for that
9	party on that issue. If the parties have not taken
10	a position, or wish to change a position, staff
11	suggests that they be allowed to do so by the close
12	of business tomorrow. And the current issues and
13	positions are set forth in the prehearing order.
14	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Let's
15	everyone okay with that?
16	MS. EATON: We have a change. We noticed that
17	on page 21 of the draft prehearing order, Walmart
18	it says Walmart takes no position at this time.
19	Actually, in our prehearing brief on Issue No. 7,
20	Walmart did have a position. So we would like that
21	reflected in the prehearing order on that
22	particular issue.
23	I will also note, and we will get to this when
24	we talk about stipulations, that Walmart has spoken
25	with FPUC regarding Issue No. 7, and that

1	stipulation will hopefully resolve the issue that
2	we've raised, but we did raise an issue on in
3	our prehearing brief.
4	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: We can make that note,
5	staff?
6	MR. STILLER: We will make that change and
7	circulate that back around to the parties.
8	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Anything else
9	from the parties? Seeing none, let's move on to
10	the exhibit list.
11	MR. STILLER: Staff has prepared a
12	comprehensive exhibit list that includes all
13	prefiled exhibits, and also includes the exhibits
14	staff wishes to include in the record. Staff is
15	aware unaware of any objections to the CEL from
16	any of the parties.
17	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Is that accurate? It
18	seems to be with no objections.
19	Proposed stipulations.
20	MR. STILLER: Yes, Commissioner. As was just
21	noted by counsel, there is one proposed stipulation
22	between FPUC and Walmart as to Issue 7.
23	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Excellent.
24	You are recognized.
25	MS. EATON: Sure. Again, Stephanie Eaton for

1	Walmart.
2	In relation to the stipulation between FPUC
3	and Walmart, we would request that our witness Lisa
4	Perry be excused from the hearing, and her
5	testimony read into the record, and her Exhibit
6	LVP-1 entered into the record as if read. We have
7	spoken with counsel for FPL. I believe they were
8	in agreement, but if the other utilities and
9	parties are amenable to that, we would we would
10	make that request now in light of the stipulation.
11	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Any questions or
12	thoughts on that from the parties? Okay.
13	Excellent. Thank you. Noted.
14	MS. EATON: Thank you.
15	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Pending motions.
16	MR. STILLER: There are none.
17	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Pending confidentiality
18	motions.
19	MR. STILLER: There are six pending
20	confidentiality motions that staff will endeavor to
21	address before the hearing.
22	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Excellent.
23	Post-hearing procedures.
24	MR. STILLER: If there is no bench decision in
25	this docket, staff recommends that briefs be no

1	longer than 40 pages, and due to be filed not later
2	than November 29th.
3	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Rulings.
4	MR. STILLER: Staff recommends that the
5	Prehearing Officer make a ruling that opening
6	statements, if any, should not exceed five minutes
7	per party, and that witness summaries be limited to
8	three minutes per witness.
9	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Parties in agreement?
10	FPL.
11	MR. CHRISTOPHER WRIGHT: Commissioner La Rosa,
12	obviously, we've already agreed to waive opening
13	summary or I am sorry, summaries of our
14	witnesses, but to we would offer, in the spirit
15	of trying to expedite the hearings coming up, if
16	other parties are agreeable to waive opening
17	statements. We are largely repeating what we've
18	seen just recently in the SPP docket. If other
19	parties are willing to waive opening statements,
20	FPL, likewise, would be willing to do so.
21	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Do we have any takers?
22	OPC.
23	MR. REHWINKEL: We are we will we are
24	not prepared today to do that, but we are willing
25	to consider that we would like I checked

1	yesterday, I haven't checked today, to see if the
2	orders we want to see the orders in the SPP
3	docket, and I don't know when they are due out.
4	MS. HELTON: They are still in progress. I am
5	not sure that they will get issued this week, but
6	hopefully the first of next week.
7	MR. REHWINKEL: Okay. So just to put folks on
8	notice, we want to see those orders, and those
9	orders could be a domino effect on our willingness
10	to stipulate not only oral argument, but witnesses,
11	but we just have to see them to understand what our
12	overall SPP approach will be.
13	So I just wanted to put folks on notice. When
14	we see those, we would like to talk to the parties
15	and the staff about where we are going, and see if
16	we can streamline the process. So we are open to
17	it.
18	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Okay. Great. Sounds
19	like it's ongoing.
20	Let's move on to other matters. Are there any
21	other matters that need to be discussed in this
22	prehearing?
23	MR. STILLER: Staff is aware of none.
24	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Parties?
25	MS. WESSLING: The only other thing I would

1	mention is, like in one of the previous dockets,
2	Mr. Rehwinkel mentioned the possibility of doing
3	closing arguments after given a little bit of time
4	to prepare in lieu briefing. That's just another
5	thing we wanted to put out there. Again, it
6	doesn't need to be decided today by, you know,
7	anyone. I just wanted to put that option out there
8	for consideration.
9	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Sure. No, we
10	appreciate that, and certainly will take it into
11	consideration, so thank you.
12	Okay. Seeing no other matters. I think that
13	can adjourn our 10 docket.
