After we have gone through a year of high power bills, higher than we have had in the last 20 years or so, I just received an e-mail notifying me that FPL has requested an increase due to high gas prices and weather. Under Gulf Power we could plan usage by demand requirements (low, medium, and high periods), but FPL dod away with that. Their rates are about twice of Gulf Power's were, but service isn't any better or reliable. The PSC approved the increases the last time, seemed to be based on South Florida demands, but we're in Northwest Florida.
