**DUKE ENERGY FLORIDA LLC'S
SECOND REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION**

Duke Energy Florida, LLC (“DEF” or “Company”), pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (“F.S.”), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code (“F.A.C.”), submits its Second Request for Extension of Confidential Classification (the “Request”) for certain information contained in the Division of Administrative Hearings’ (“DOAH”) Transcript and Exhibits. In support of this Request, DEF states:

1. On March 10, 2020, DEF filed a Request for Confidential Classification (document number 01338-2020), for certain information contained in the Transcript and Exhibits from the DOAH hearings held on February 4 and February 5, 2022, specifically Exhibits 101 through 113, 115 and 117, as it contains “proprietary confidential business information” under Section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes.

2. DEF’s March 10, 2020 Request was granted by Order No. PSC-2020-0374-CFO-EI on October 16, 2020. On April 18, 2022, DEF filed its First Request for Extension of Confidential Classification which was granted by Order No. PSC-2022-0158-CFO-EI on April 27, 2022. The period of confidential treatment granted by that order will expire on October 27, 2023. The information continues to warrant treatment as “proprietary confidential business information within

the meaning of Section 366.093(3), F.S. Accordingly, DEF is filing its Second Request for Extension of Confidential Classification.

3. DEF submits that the confidential information contained in the Transcripts and Exhibits from the DOAH hearings, identified in Exhibit “A” and Exhibit “C” to the March 10, 2020, Request¹ continue to be “proprietary confidential business information” within the meaning of section 366.093(3), F.S. and continue to require confidential classification. *See* Affidavit of Anthony Salvarezza at ¶ 3, attached as Revised Exhibit “D”. This information is intended to be and is treated as confidential by the Company. The information has not been disclosed to the public. Pursuant to section 366.093(1), F.S., such materials are entitled to confidential treatment and are exempt from the disclosure provisions of the Public Records Act. *See* Affidavit of Anthony Salvarezza ¶¶ 3-5.

4. Nothing has changed since the issuance of Order No. PSC-2020-0374-CFO-EI to render the information stale or public such that continued confidential treatment would not be appropriate. Upon a finding by the Commission that this information continues to be “proprietary confidential business information,” it should continue to be treated as such for an additional period of at least 18 months and should be returned to DEF as soon as the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. *See* §366.093(4), F.S.

WHEREFORE, for the foregoing reasons, DEF respectfully requests that this Second Request for Extension of Confidential Classification be granted.

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority duly authorized to administer oaths, personally appeared Anthony Salvarezza, who being first duly sworn, on oath deposes and says that:

1. My name is Anthony Salvarezza. I am over the age of 18 years old, and I have been authorized by Duke Energy Florida (hereinafter "DEF" or the "Company") to give this affidavit in the above-styled proceeding on DEF's behalf and in support of DEF's Second Request for Extension of Confidential Classification (the "Request"). The facts attested to in my affidavit are based upon my personal knowledge.

2. I am the General Manager of Regional Services. I am responsible for leading and directing project engineering, project management, outage management, business planning and specialized maintenance in Regulated and Renewable Energy. My major duties and responsibilities include providing safe, reliable, efficient, economic, environmental, and regulatory compliant maintenance activities through the development and implementation of processes and programs.

3. DEF is seeking its second extension of confidential classification for certain information contained in the Division of Administrative Hearings' Transcripts and Exhibits from the February 4 and 5, 2020 hearing, filed on March 10, 2020 in docket number 20200001-EI. There are no changes to the information contained in DEF's confidential Exhibit A, redacted Exhibit B, and justification matrix C. The referenced Exhibits are on file with the Clerk. DEF is requesting an extension of confidential classification of this information because it contains sensitive business information, the disclosure of which would impair the Company's competitive business interests.

4. The confidential information at issue is confidential proprietary information. In order to contract with third-party vendors and Original Equipment Manufacturers on favorable terms, DEF must keep contractual terms and third-party proprietary information confidential. The information contains drawings, evaluations and information of both DEF and third-party companies, the disclosure of which would impair the Company's competitive business interests and efforts to contract for goods or services on favorable terms. DEF has not publicly disclosed the information. Without DEF's measures to maintain the confidentiality of this sensitive business information, DEF's ability to contract with third parties could detrimentally impact DEF's ability to negotiate favorable contracts, thereby harming its competitive interests, ultimately to its customers' detriment.

5. Upon receipt of its own confidential information, strict procedures are established and followed to maintain the confidentiality of the terms of the documents and information provided, including restricting access to those persons who need the information to assist the Company, and restricting the number of, and access to the information and contracts. At no time


since receiving the information in question has the Company publicly disclosed that information.

6. This concludes my affidavit.


