- 3. Pine Island Exchange: Useppa Island
 - a. Except as otherwise provided, the rates and regulations contained in the General Exchange Tariff apply in this exception area.
 - b. The telephone rates specified hereunder entitle the subscriber to an unlimited number of local telephone messages to all stations bearing the designation of Pine Island, Fort Myers, Fort Myers Beach, North Fort Myers, Cape Coral, North Cape Coral, and Sanibel-Captiva Islands exchanges.
 - c. A map showing the Exception Area is filed in Supplemental Section A3.
 - d. Each customer will be required to make a contribution for construction for the first five years that customer location has service. This contribution for construction will apply for service provided through the originally placed, or replaced, cable pairs which number 100.
 - e. Within this Exception Area, the following access line rates apply:

J. LIFELINE ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

- 1. General
 - a. Effective August 1, 2012, the Lifeline Assistance Program provides for a federal credit of \$9.25 per month, and an additional Company provided subsidy of \$7.00 per month for qualified customers. Effective October 1, 2000, eligible applicants living on federally recognized Native American reservations will receive an additional credit of up to \$25.00 sufficient to reduce the monthly rate for local service to no less than \$1.00 inclusive of the subscriber line charge.
 - b. The federal and Company credits are applied to the local service bills for qualified residential recipients of public assistance who apply for the credits and authorize agency verification of their participation in, or authorize agency verification that one or more of the residential recipient's dependents participation in, and/or authorize verification that a member of the residential recipient's household participates in at least one of the following programs: Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid, Supplementary Security Income (SSI), Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Federal Public Housing Assistance (Section 8), Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) and National School Lunch Program (free meals program only).
 - c. An applicant living on federally recognized Native American reservations is eligible for additional credit as outlined in J.1.a. preceding, if he/she is currently a recipient of benefits from one of the following assistance programs: Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), Medicaid, Supplementary Security Income (SSI), Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Federal Public Housing Assistance (Section 8), Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP), Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA) General Assistance, Tribally Administered Temporary Assistance for Needy Families, Head Start (only for those meeting its income qualifying standard), National School Lunch Program (free meals program only), and Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations.
 - d. Additionally, customers not receiving benefits under one of the preceding programs, and whose total gross annual income does not exceed 150% of the federal poverty guidelines, meet the requirements of a State established means test and may apply directly to the Office of Public Counsel (OPC) for eligibility certification.
 - e. Lifeline Assistance is available for one telephone line per residence, at the customer's principle place of residence.
