8 Q. PLEASE STATE YOUR NAME AND BUSINESS ADDRESS.

9

10 A. I AM NANCY H. SIMS. MY BUSINESS ADDRESS IS 675  
11 WEST PEACHTREE STREET, N.E., ATLANTA, GEORGIA.

12

13 Q. BY WHOM ARE YOU EMPLOYED?

14

15 A. I AM EMPLOYED BY BELLSOUTH TELECOMMUNICATIONS,  
16 INC. D/B/A SOUTHERN BELL (COMPANY OR SOUTHERN  
17 BELL).

18

19 Q. PLEASE GIVE A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF YOUR BACKGROUND  
20 AND EXPERIENCE.

21

22 A. I GRADUATED FROM NORTH CAROLINA STATE UNIVERSITY  
23 IN 1971 WITH A BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE. IN  
24 1973 I WAS EMPLOYED BY SOUTHERN BELL INITIALLY IN  
25 THE NORTH CAROLINA HEADQUARTERS ORGANIZATION.

1 SINCE THAT TIME I HAVE HELD VARIOUS POSITIONS WITH  
2 THE COMPANY AND AT&T. I AM CURRENTLY AN  
3 OPERATIONS MANAGER WITH RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE  
4 PRICING AND TARIFFING OF A VARIETY OF LOCAL  
5 EXCHANGE SERVICES FOR THE NINE STATE REGION.

6

7 Q. WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF YOUR TESTIMONY?

8

9 A. THE PURPOSE OF THIS TESTIMONY IS TO UPDATE THE  
10 TESTIMONY THAT I PREVIOUSLY FILED ON JULY 2, 1993.  
11 ESSENTIALLY, I HAVE REVISED THE REVENUE EFFECT OF  
12 THE REMOVAL OF CERTAIN EAS ADDITIVES, AND I HAVE  
13 REVISED THE RATE REDUCTIONS TO SWITCHED ACCESS.  
14 MY EXHIBITS HAVE BEEN UPDATED TO REFLECT THESE  
15 CHANGES AS WELL AS SOME MINOR TARIFF CLEANUP AND  
16 CLARIFICATION.

17

18 OTHERWISE, THE PURPOSE OF MY TESTIMONY REMAINS THE  
19 SAME, AND THAT IS TO ADDRESS THE CHANGES IN RATES,  
20 RATE STRUCTURE AND ACCOMPANYING TARIFFS, AS WELL  
21 AS NEW SERVICE OFFERINGS THAT SOUTHERN BELL IS  
22 PROPOSING IN CONJUNCTION WITH OUR REQUEST TO  
23 EXTEND THE INCENTIVE SHARING PLAN. IN ADDITION, I  
24 WILL DESCRIBE THE RATE REDUCTIONS THAT ARE  
25 RECOMMENDED FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE COMMISSION

1 ORDERED CUSTOMER CREDIT OF APPROXIMATELY \$49  
2 MILLION.

3  
4 Q. WHAT NEW SERVICES ARE BEING PRESENTED AND WHAT  
5 EXISTING RATES AND SERVICES WILL BE AFFECTED BY  
6 SOUTHERN BELL'S PROPOSAL?

7  
8 A. IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE EXTENSION OF THE INCENTIVE  
9 SHARING PLAN, SOUTHERN BELL OFFERS THE FOLLOWING  
10 PROPOSALS:

11  
12 - AN OPTIONAL EXPANDED LOCAL  
13 SERVICE PLAN (ELS)

14 - A RESTRUCTURE OF THE LOCAL EXCHANGE  
15 MESSAGE RATE SERVICE TARIFF

16 - THE ADDITION OF A CHARGE FOR HUNTING  
17 SERVICE PROVIDED TO FOREIGN EXCHANGE (FX)  
18 SUBSCRIBERS

19 - A REDUCTION IN SWITCHED ACCESS  
20 RATES

21  
22 I WILL DISCUSS EACH OF THESE IN MORE DETAIL LATER  
23 IN MY TESTIMONY.

24  
25 Q. WHAT IS THE COMPANY'S PROPOSAL FOR PERMANENT RATE

1 REDUCTIONS TO DISPOSE OF THE EXISTING \$49 MILLION  
2 CUSTOMER CREDIT?

3

4 A. IN ORDER TO DISTRIBUTE THE ESTIMATED \$49 MILLION  
5 CUSTOMER CREDIT THAT WAS ORDERED BY THE  
6 COMMISSION, SOUTHERN BELL PROPOSES THE FOLLOWING  
7 RATE CHANGES:

8

9 - A REDUCTION AND RESTRUCTURE OF SERVICE  
10 CONNECTION CHARGES (\$14.0M)

11 - A REDUCTION IN FLAT RATE PBX TRUNK,  
12 NETWORK ACCESS REGISTER (NAR) AND HUNTING  
13 CHARGES FOR BUSINESS CUSTOMERS (\$29.6M)

14 - THE ELIMINATION OF ALL EXISTING FLAT RATE  
15 EXTENDED AREA SERVICE (EAS) ADDITIVES (\$.17M)

16 - A REDUCTION IN CUSTOM CALLING SERVICES  
17 (\$4.3M)

18

19 IN ADDITION TO THE ABOVE PROPOSALS TO BE USED FOR  
20 THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE CUSTOMER CREDIT, SOUTHERN  
21 BELL HAS ALREADY FILED WITH THE COMMISSION TWO  
22 TARIFFS WHICH WILL ACCOUNT FOR AN ESTIMATED \$1.5  
23 MILLION OF THE CUSTOMER CREDIT DURING THE FIRST  
24 YEAR THAT THE TARIFFS ARE EFFECTIVE. THE PENDING  
25 TARIFFS INCLUDE A LIFELINE OFFERING WHICH WILL

1 GIVE A REDUCTION IN BASIC CHARGES FOR QUALIFIED  
2 LOW INCOME SUBSCRIBERS, AND A STATEWIDE ECONOMIC  
3 DEVELOPMENT PLAN TO ASSIST IN STIMULATING NEW  
4 BUSINESS GROWTH AND EXPANSION IN SOUTHERN BELL  
5 SERVING AREAS THAT ARE DESIGNATED AS ENTERPRISE  
6 ZONES BY THE FLORIDA ENTERPRISE ZONE STATUTE.

7

8 AGAIN, I WILL DISCUSS THESE PROPOSALS IN MORE  
9 DETAIL BELOW.

10

11 Q. PLEASE START BY DESCRIBING SOUTHERN BELL'S  
12 PROPOSAL FOR AN OPTIONAL EXPANDED LOCAL SERVICE  
13 (ELS) PLAN FOR LOCAL CALLING.

14

15 A. SOUTHERN BELL'S PROPOSAL FOR LOCAL CALLING  
16 INCLUDES AN EXPANDED LOCAL SERVICE (ELS) OPTIONAL  
17 TARIFF WHICH PROVIDES RESIDENTIAL AND BUSINESS  
18 CUSTOMERS WITH LOCAL CALLING CAPABILITY OUT TO  
19 FORTY MILES FROM THE RATE CENTER THAT SERVES THEIR  
20 EXCHANGE. THE TARIFF DOES NOT EXPAND ANY LOCAL  
21 CALLING AREA BEYOND LATA OR STATE BOUNDARIES.

22

23 REGULAR FLAT OR MESSAGE RATE LOCAL SERVICE WITH  
24 TOLL CALLING AS CURRENTLY APPROVED BY THIS  
25 COMMISSION WILL CONTINUE TO BE AVAILABLE FOR

1 EXISTING AS WELL AS NEW CUSTOMERS WHO DO NOT  
2 SELECT LOCAL SERVICE FROM THE ELS TARIFF. IN  
3 ADDITION, "LOCAL CALLING PLUS" (TWENTY-FIVE CENT  
4 PLAN) AND "EXTENDED CALLING SERVICE" (ECS) WILL  
5 CONTINUE TO BE AVAILABLE WITH FLAT AND MESSAGE  
6 RATE SERVICE ON PREVIOUSLY ORDERED ROUTES FOR  
7 EXISTING AS WELL AS NEW CUSTOMERS.

8  
9 BEFORE I EXPLAIN THE LOCAL CALLING OPTIONS  
10 INCLUDED IN THE ELS TARIFF, IT IS IMPORTANT TO  
11 UNDERSTAND THE LOCAL CALLING AREA AS DEFINED BY  
12 THE PROPOSAL. FIRST, THERE IS THE BASIC LOCAL  
13 CALLING AREA (BLCA) WHICH IS THE SAME AS THE  
14 EXISTING LOCAL CALLING AREA APPLICABLE WITH  
15 REGULAR FLAT RATE SERVICE AND MESSAGE RATE  
16 SERVICE. IN ADDITION, THERE IS THE EXPANDED LOCAL  
17 CALLING AREA (ELCA) WHICH ENCOMPASSES THOSE  
18 EXCHANGES BEYOND THE BASIC LOCAL CALLING AREA  
19 HAVING RATE CENTERS WITHIN FORTY AIRLINE MILES OF  
20 THE RATE CENTER OF THE ORIGINATING EXCHANGE. AN  
21 ILLUSTRATION OF THESE AREAS IS CONTAINED IN MY  
22 EXHIBIT NHS-1.

23  
24 RESIDENCE AND BUSINESS CUSTOMERS WILL EACH HAVE  
25 TWO OPTIONS UNDER THE ELS TARIFF: A STANDARD

1           OPTION AND A PREMIUM OPTION.   FIRST, I WILL  
2           EXPLAIN HOW THE ELS TARIFF WILL WORK FOR A  
3           RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMER AND COMPARE IT TO TODAY'S  
4           FLAT RATE SERVICE OPTION, AND THEN I WILL DO THE  
5           SAME FOR A MULTILINE BUSINESS CUSTOMER.   MY  
6           ILLUSTRATIONS WILL ASSUME A RATE GROUP 12  
7           CUSTOMER, SUCH AS ONE IN THE MIAMI/FORT LAUDERDALE  
8           AREA.   THE DETAILED TARIFF PROPOSAL FOR ELS IS  
9           FOUND IN MY EXHIBIT NHS-2.

11

RESIDENCE CUSTOMERS

12

13           THE PROPOSED ELS FIXED ACCESS LINE CHARGE FOR A  
14           RATE GROUP 12 CUSTOMER IS \$7.75 PER MONTH FOR BOTH  
15           THE STANDARD AND PREMIUM OPTIONS.

16

17           FOR THE STANDARD OPTION, USAGE CHARGES ARE \$0.02  
18           PER MINUTE FOR CALLS WITHIN THE BLCA AND \$0.08 PER  
19           MINUTE FOR CALLS TO THE ELCA.   HOWEVER, THE ACCESS  
20           LINE CHARGE INCLUDES A MONTHLY USAGE ALLOWANCE AND  
21           A USAGE CAP ON CHARGES FOR CALLS WITHIN THE BLCA.  
22           THE ALLOWANCE AND CAP HAVE THE COMBINED EFFECT OF  
23           HOLDING THESE USAGE BASED CHARGES TO NO MORE THAN  
24           \$7.00 ABOVE THE MONTHLY LINE CHARGE.   THIS MEANS  
25           THAT AN ELS CUSTOMER WILL PAY A MAXIMUM OF \$14.75

1 PER MONTH FOR CALLS WITHIN THE BLCA COMPARED TO  
2 \$10.65 FOR TODAY'S FLAT RATE SERVICE.  
3 IMPORTANTLY, IF A RESIDENCE CUSTOMER SELECTS THIS  
4 OPTION, IN THE WORST CASE (WHERE A CUSTOMER  
5 REACHES THE BLCA USAGE CAP), THE ELS RESIDENCE  
6 CUSTOMER SHOULD BREAK EVEN IF HE OR SHE MAKES  
7 ABOUT FOURTEEN ELCA CALLS PER MONTH. THIS  
8 CONCLUSION ASSUMES AN AVERAGE CALL DURATION OF  
9 FIVE MINUTES AND AN AVERAGE TOLL CHARGE OF \$0.14  
10 PER MINUTE FOR TOLL CALLS WITHIN FORTY MILES.  
11 OBVIOUSLY, THE IMPACT ON EACH INDIVIDUAL CUSTOMER  
12 WILL VARY WHICH IS WHY THIS PLAN IS OPTIONAL.  
13 NEVERTHELESS, AS THIS ILLUSTRATES, THE ELS  
14 STANDARD OPTION WILL BE OF BENEFIT TO CUSTOMERS  
15 WHO MAKE RELATIVELY FEW CALLS IN THE ELCA, EVEN IF  
16 THEY REACH OR EXCEED THEIR BLCA USAGE CAP.  
17  
18 IN FACT, THE STANDARD OPTION COULD EVEN BE OF  
19 BENEFIT TO CUSTOMERS WHO DO NOT MAKE ANY OUTGOING  
20 CALLS WITHIN THE ELCA, BECAUSE OF THE LOWER  
21 MONTHLY FIXED ELS ACCESS LINE CHARGE. FOR  
22 EXAMPLE, CUSTOMERS MAKING FEWER THAN 295 MINUTES  
23 PER MONTH OF BLCA CALLS (OR 98 CALLS PER MONTH  
24 ASSUMING A BLCA CALL DURATION OF THREE MINUTES)  
25 WILL BENEFIT WHEN SUBSCRIBING TO ELS, EVEN WITHOUT

1 MAKING ANY CALLS TO THE ELCA. AS AN ADDED BENEFIT  
2 FOR THESE CUSTOMERS, THEIR FIRST ELCA CALL, AND  
3 EACH CALL THEREAFTER, WILL PRODUCE AN AVERAGE  
4 SAVINGS OF SIX CENTS PER MINUTE.

5  
6 THE OTHER OPTION FOR RESIDENCE CUSTOMERS CONSISTS  
7 OF A FIXED MONTHLY \$20.00 USAGE CHARGE, IN  
8 ADDITION TO THE MONTHLY ELS ACCESS LINE RATE, AND  
9 PROVIDES FOR UNLIMITED CALLING WITHIN THE BASIC  
10 AND EXPANDED LOCAL CALLING AREAS. ESSENTIALLY,  
11 THIS OPTION WILL GIVE CUSTOMERS "FLAT RATE"  
12 CALLING OUT TO FORTY MILES FOR A TOTAL MONTHLY  
13 AMOUNT OF \$27.75 PER MONTH IN RATE GROUP 12. THIS  
14 OPTION IS DESIGNED FOR HEAVIER RESIDENTIAL ELCA  
15 CALLERS (THOSE MAKING ON AVERAGE MORE THAN 24 ELCA  
16 CALLS PER MONTH ASSUMING THE SAME CALL DURATION  
17 AND AVERAGE TOLL RATE PER MINUTE AS IN THE  
18 PREVIOUS ILLUSTRATION) AND FOR THOSE WHO WISH TO  
19 BUDGET THE SAME MONTHLY AMOUNT FOR THEIR TOTAL  
20 LOCAL CALLING.

21

22 BUSINESS CUSTOMERS

23

24 BUSINESS CUSTOMERS ALSO WILL HAVE TWO OPTIONS  
25 WHICH ARE DESIGNED TO BE ATTRACTIVE TO DIFFERENT

1           GROUPS OF BUSINESS CUSTOMERS.   IMPORTANTLY, UNDER  
2           EITHER OPTION, THE MAXIMUM OUT-OF-POCKET CHARGES  
3           FOR CALLS WITHIN THE BLCA WOULD BE \$58.35.  I WILL  
4           DESCRIBE THE COMMON FEATURES AND THE DIFFERENCES  
5           BETWEEN THE OPTIONS BELOW.

6  
7           ADDRESSING THE BUSINESS SERVICE STANDARD OPTION  
8           FIRST, THE PROPOSED FIXED RATE GROUP 12 INDIVIDUAL  
9           BUSINESS ACCESS LINE CHARGE IS \$28.35 PER MONTH  
10          FOR A MULTILINE CUSTOMER WITH HUNTING.  THE USAGE  
11          RATE SCHEDULE FOR THE BUSINESS SERVICE STANDARD  
12          OPTION IS IDENTICAL TO THAT OF RESIDENCE SERVICE.  
13          HOWEVER, THE ASSOCIATED USAGE CAP FOR BLCA CALLS  
14          IS \$30.00 PER LINE.  THUS, AN ELS MULTILINE  
15          BUSINESS CUSTOMER WITH HUNTING WILL PAY A MAXIMUM  
16          OF \$58.35 PER LINE PER MONTH FOR CALLS WITHIN THE  
17          BLCA COMPARED TO \$39.29 FOR FLAT RATE SERVICE.  
18          FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ILLUSTRATION, I HAVE USED OUR  
19          PROPOSED FLAT RATE HUNTING CHARGE WHICH IS \$4.64  
20          LOWER THAN THE EXISTING RATE.

21  
22          AGAIN, AND TO ILLUSTRATE THE BENEFIT OF THIS  
23          OPTION, IN THE WORST CASE (WHERE AN ELS SUBSCRIBER  
24          REACHES THE BLCA USAGE CAP), AN ELS MULTILINE  
25          BUSINESS CUSTOMER WITH HUNTING WILL ON AVERAGE

1           SAVE MONEY WHEN MAKING MORE THAN 80 ELCA CALLS PER  
2           LINE PER MONTH. THIS CONCLUSION ASSUMES AN  
3           AVERAGE CALL DURATION OF THREE MINUTES AND AN  
4           AVERAGE TOLL CHARGE OF \$0.16 PER MINUTE FOR A TOLL  
5           CALL WITHIN FORTY MILES (THE AVERAGE TOLL CHARGE  
6           FOR BUSINESS IS HIGHER THAN THE AVERAGE TOLL  
7           CHARGE FOR RESIDENCE BECAUSE OF THE DIFFERENCES IN  
8           PEAK AND OFF-PEAK CALLING). AGAIN, THE IMPACT ON  
9           EACH INDIVIDUAL CUSTOMER WILL VARY.

10

11           BUSINESS CUSTOMERS MAKING FEWER THAN 550 MINUTES  
12           PER MONTH OF BLCA CALLS (OR ABOUT 275 CALLS PER  
13           MONTH ASSUMING A TWO MINUTE BLCA CALL DURATION)  
14           WILL ALSO BENEFIT WHEN SUBSCRIBING TO THE ELS  
15           STANDARD OPTION BECAUSE OF THE LOWER ELS ACCESS  
16           LINE CHARGE. AS WAS THE CASE WITH RESIDENCE  
17           CUSTOMERS MAKING FEW BLCA CALLS, THESE CUSTOMERS  
18           WILL SAVE AN AVERAGE OF EIGHT CENTS PER MINUTE ON  
19           THEIR ELCA CALLING STARTING WITH THEIR FIRST CALL.

20

21           THE OTHER OPTION FOR BUSINESS CUSTOMERS PROVIDES  
22           FOR A 50% DISCOUNT ON BLCA USAGE (OR \$0.01 PER  
23           MINUTE) FOR AN ADDITIONAL \$12.00 PER LINE PER  
24           MONTH. THIS ADDITIONAL CHARGE IS USED AS A  
25           MONTHLY ALLOWANCE ON BLCA CALLS; THEREFORE, THE

1 MOST A BUSINESS CUSTOMER IN RATE GROUP 12 WOULD  
2 PAY FOR THE ACCESS LINE AND BLCA USAGE WOULD BE  
3 THE SAME \$58.35 PAID UNDER THE FIRST OPTION.

4

5 BECAUSE THE BLCA USAGE RATE IS NOW CUT IN HALF,  
6 PREMIUM CUSTOMERS CAN MAKE TWICE AS MANY CALLS AS  
7 STANDARD CUSTOMERS BEFORE THEY REACH THE BLCA  
8 USAGE CAP.

9

10 THEREFORE, A BUSINESS CUSTOMER MAKING VERY FEW  
11 BLCA CALLS AND ONLY A MODERATE NUMBER OF ELCA  
12 CALLS WILL PROBABLY TAKE THE FIRST OPTION. A  
13 BUSINESS CUSTOMER WITH A HIGH NUMBER OF BLCA CALLS  
14 AND THE SAME AMOUNT OF ELCA CALLING WILL TAKE THE  
15 SECOND OPTION. THE CHOICE WILL DEPEND ON THE  
16 CALLING CHARACTERISTICS OF EACH INDIVIDUAL  
17 BUSINESS.

18

19 Q. ARE THERE ANY OTHER BENEFITS OF THE ELS PLAN?

20

21 A. YES. IN ADDITION TO THE ECONOMIC BENEFITS I  
22 ILLUSTRATED IN MY PREVIOUS EXAMPLES, ELS CUSTOMERS  
23 WILL GENERALLY ENJOY SEVEN-DIGIT DIALING, WITHIN  
24 EACH NUMBER PLAN AREA AND LATA, TO ELCA EXCHANGES.  
25 ANOTHER BENEFIT IS THAT ELS PLAN SUBSCRIBERS WILL

1 ALSO RECEIVE A MULTI-FEATURE DISCOUNT PLAN (MFDP)  
2 CREDIT OF \$1.50 PER MONTH IF THEY ALSO SUBSCRIBE  
3 TO FOUR OR MORE VERTICAL SERVICES INCLUDED IN THE  
4 MFDP TARIFF.

5

6 Q. WHY IS SOUTHERN BELL PROPOSING TO OFFER THE ELS  
7 PLAN TO ITS CUSTOMERS?

8

9 A. COMBINED WITH EXISTING FLAT AND MESSAGE RATE LOCAL  
10 EXCHANGE SERVICE, THE ELS PLAN WILL GIVE SOUTHERN  
11 BELL'S CUSTOMERS A BROADER CHOICE OF LOCAL SERVICE  
12 OFFERINGS TO MEET THEIR INDIVIDUAL NEEDS.  
13 CUSTOMERS WHO WISH TO RETAIN THEIR EXISTING BASIC  
14 FLAT OR MESSAGE RATE LOCAL SERVICE CAN CONTINUE TO  
15 DO SO UNDER THIS PROPOSAL. THESE SAME OPTIONS  
16 WILL ALSO CONTINUE TO BE AVAILABLE TO NEW  
17 CUSTOMERS. ELS WILL MERELY AUGMENT THESE CHOICES  
18 AND WILL ALLOW CUSTOMERS TO OPTIMIZE THEIR  
19 ECONOMIC BENEFIT BASED ON THEIR OWN NEEDS AND  
20 CALLING PATTERNS.

21

22 SOUTHERN BELL'S PROPOSED ELS PLAN IS ONE THAT  
23 OFFERS OPTIONS THAT CUSTOMERS CAN SELECT FROM  
24 BASED ON THEIR OWN CALLING CHARACTERISTICS. AS  
25 DEMONSTRATED IN MY ILLUSTRATIONS, THE STANDARD ELS

1           OPTION PROVIDES A LOWER COST ALTERNATIVE TO  
2           TRADITIONAL FLAT RATE SERVICE FOR THOSE WHO HAVE  
3           LOWER REQUIREMENTS FOR OUTGOING CALLING. IT MAY  
4           ALSO BE OF BENEFIT TO THOSE MESSAGE RATE CUSTOMERS  
5           WHOSE CALLS ARE USUALLY OF SHORT DURATION. ELS  
6           ALSO OFFERS LOWER USAGE RATES FOR THOSE CUSTOMERS  
7           WHO HAVE A FREQUENT NEED TO PLACE CALLS WITHIN THE  
8           ELCA. ADDITIONALLY, IT INCLUDES A PREMIUM OPTION  
9           WITH UNLIMITED "FLAT RATED" CALLING FOR  
10          RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS. AS MENTIONED EARLIER,  
11          THIS OPTION WILL BE OF BENEFIT TO THOSE WHO  
12          ORIGINATE MANY CALLS WITHIN THEIR NEW EXPANDED  
13          LOCAL CALLING AREA, AND TO THOSE WHO WISH TO  
14          BUDGET THE SAME AMOUNT EVERY MONTH FOR THEIR LOCAL  
15          TELEPHONE SERVICE.

16

17 Q.       ARE THERE ANY OTHER REASONS WHY THE COMPANY IS  
18           PROPOSING THE ELS PLAN?

19

20 A.       YES. THE ELS PLAN WILL ALSO HELP TO ALLEVIATE  
21           FUTURE PRESSURES FOR NEW EXTENDED AREA SERVICE  
22           (EAS) ROUTES, PARTICULARLY IN AREAS WHERE THE  
23           COMMUNITY OF INTEREST DOES NOT MEET THE  
24           COMMISSION'S STANDARDS FOR NON-OPTIONAL TWO-WAY  
25           FLAT RATE CALLING. UNLIKE NON-OPTIONAL FLAT RATE

1 EAS, SOUTHERN BELL'S OPTIONAL PLAN FOR EXPANDING  
2 LOCAL CALLING GIVES CUSTOMERS A CHOICE AND DOES  
3 NOT FORCE CUSTOMERS TO PAY FOR CALLING THEY MAY  
4 NEITHER WANT NOR NEED. ALSO, IMPLEMENTATION OF  
5 THIS PLAN WILL ALLOW SOUTHERN BELL TO BETTER ALIGN  
6 LOCAL AND EXPANDED LOCAL RATES WHILE GIVING  
7 CUSTOMERS THE FLEXIBILITY TO SAVE ON LOCAL AND  
8 EXPANDED LOCAL SERVICE.

9  
10 THE GEOGRAPHIC SCOPE OF THE ELS TARIFF WILL ALSO  
11 MITIGATE THE NEED FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENTS TO  
12 PETITION THE COMMISSION FOR PIECEMEAL TOLL RELIEF  
13 ON A ROUTE BY ROUTE BASIS. THE PROCESS OF  
14 CONDUCTING TRAFFIC STUDIES, TRAFFIC DATA ANALYSES  
15 AND CUSTOMER BALLOTING WILL BE ELIMINATED FOR ALL  
16 PRACTICAL PURPOSES. LIFTING OF THESE  
17 ADMINISTRATIVE BURDENS WILL TRANSLATE INTO  
18 ADMINISTRATIVE SAVINGS TO SOUTHERN BELL AND THE  
19 COMMISSION ALIKE. THE ULTIMATE BENEFICIARIES WILL  
20 BE BOTH THE RATEPAYERS AND THE TAXPAYERS OF THE  
21 STATE OF FLORIDA.

22

23 Q. WHEN DOES SOUTHERN BELL EXPECT IMPLEMENTATION OF  
24 THIS PLAN AND HOW WILL ANNUAL REVENUES BE AFFECTED  
25 BY THIS PROPOSAL?

1

2 A. SOUTHERN BELL EXPECTS THE OPTIONAL ELS TARIFF, IF  
3 APPROVED AS FILED, TO BECOME EFFECTIVE SIX MONTHS  
4 FROM THE FINAL COMMISSION ORDER OR SOMETIME IN  
5 EARLY 1995. WHEN THE SERVICE IS FULLY MATURE, THE  
6 IMPACT ON SOUTHERN BELL'S REVENUES WILL BE  
7 SUBSTANTIAL. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS FILING, A  
8 MATURE REVENUE IMPACT HAS BEEN CALCULATED AND  
9 INCLUDED IN THE MINIMUM FILING REQUIREMENTS TO  
10 DEMONSTRATE THE PLAN'S ANNUAL REVENUE EFFECT.

11

12 Q. WILL THE ELS PLAN BE AVAILABLE TO ALL CUSTOMERS?

13

14 A. YES. THIS PLAN WILL BE OFFERED TO ALL RESIDENTIAL  
15 AND BUSINESS CUSTOMERS INCLUDING CUSTOMERS WHO  
16 HAVE PBX TRUNKS, ESSX<sup>R</sup> SERVICE, ISDN, MEGALINK<sup>R</sup>  
17 CHANNEL SERVICE AND LIGHTGATE<sup>R</sup> SERVICE.

18

19 THE ELS BUSINESS OPTIONS WILL ALSO BE AVAILABLE TO  
20 NON-LOCAL EXCHANGE COMPANY PUBLIC ACCESS SERVICE  
21 (NPATS) PROVIDERS, SHARED TENANT SERVICE PROVIDERS  
22 WHO ARE AUTHORIZED RESELLERS OF LOCAL SERVICE IN  
23 FLORIDA AND TO HOTEL CUSTOMERS. HOWEVER, CAPS

24

25 <sup>R</sup>REGISTERED SERVICE MARK OF BELLSOUTH CORPORATION

1 WILL NOT APPLY TO THEIR BLCA USAGE. SEVEN DIGIT  
2 DIALING WILL NOT APPLY ON CALLS MADE TO THE ELCA  
3 FROM ANY NPATS OR COMPANY PROVIDED PAY TELEPHONE,  
4 AND NO CHANGE IS PROPOSED TO THE RATES CHARGED TO  
5 END USERS OF PUBLIC TELEPHONES.

6

7 IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT THE EXISTING NETWORK  
8 ACCESS SERVICE (NAS) TARIFF OFFERED TO ISDN  
9 CUSTOMERS IS VERY SIMILAR TO THE PROPOSED ELS

10

11 PREMIUM OPTION FOR BUSINESS CUSTOMERS, EXCEPT THAT  
12 NAS CUSTOMERS WILL NOW GET DISCOUNTED RATES FOR  
13 THEIR ELCA CALLING. THEREFORE, THE NAS TARIFF  
14 WILL BE OBSOLETE AND THESE CUSTOMERS WILL BE  
15 CONVERTED TO THE ELS PREMIUM OPTION FOR BUSINESS.

16

17 Q. COULD YOU DESCRIBE HOW SOUTHERN BELL'S PROPOSAL  
18 WOULD AFFECT EXISTING AND FUTURE AVAILABILITY OF  
19 NON-OPTIONAL AND OPTIONAL EXTENDED AREA SERVICE  
20 (EAS) AS WELL AS AVAILABILITY OF OTHER LOCAL  
21 EXCEPTION TARIFFS?

22

23 A. YES. I MENTIONED EARLIER IN MY TESTIMONY THAT  
24 REGULAR FLAT OR MESSAGE RATE SERVICE AS CURRENTLY  
25 APPROVED BY THIS COMMISSION WILL CONTINUE TO BE

1 AVAILABLE TO ALL CUSTOMERS, EXISTING AS WELL AS  
2 NEW, WHO DO NOT SELECT LOCAL SERVICE FROM THE  
3 OPTIONAL ELS TARIFF. THE LOCAL CALLING AREA  
4 AVAILABLE WITH AN EXCHANGE'S FLAT RATE SERVICE  
5 ALREADY INCLUDES OTHER EXCHANGES THAT HAVE BEEN  
6 ADDED AS PART OF NON-OPTIONAL TWO-WAY FLAT RATE  
7 EAS ORDERS; THEREFORE, THERE WILL BE NO CHANGE IN  
8 THE AVAILABILITY OF FLAT RATE EAS FOR THOSE  
9 CUSTOMERS WHO SELECT FLAT RATE SERVICE. THIS IS  
10 ALSO TRUE FOR MESSAGE RATE SERVICE SINCE THE SAME  
11 ADDITIONAL EXCHANGES ARE ALSO AVAILABLE TODAY WITH  
12 THAT SERVICE. AS A MATTER OF FACT, WE ARE ALSO  
13 PROPOSING THAT NON-OPTIONAL TWO-WAY FLAT RATE EAS,  
14 WITH REGROUPING WHERE REQUIRED, BE ADDED ON FIVE  
15 ROUTES.

16  
17 I ALSO MENTIONED EARLIER THAT "LOCAL CALLING PLUS"  
18 AND "EXTENDED CALLING SERVICE" TARIFF RATES WILL  
19 CONTINUE TO APPLY TO THOSE CUSTOMERS HAVING FLAT  
20 OR MESSAGE RATE LOCAL EXCHANGE SERVICE ON ROUTES  
21 PREVIOUSLY ORDERED BY THIS COMMISSION. THEREFORE,  
22 THE PROPOSED ELS TARIFF WILL HAVE NO IMPACT ON  
23 THESE CUSTOMERS. HOWEVER, FOR CUSTOMERS  
24 SUBSCRIBING TO THE OPTIONAL ELS TARIFF, ELS RATES  
25 WILL APPLY ON ALL ROUTES LESS THAN 40 MILES.

1

2 FLAT RATE OPTIONS AVAILABLE WITH OPTIONAL EAS  
3 PLANS WILL CONTINUE TO BE AVAILABLE TO FLAT RATE  
4 NON-ELS CUSTOMERS. OTHER OPTIONS AVAILABLE WITH  
5 THESE PLANS WILL BE GRANDFATHERED TO EXISTING  
6 CUSTOMERS. HOWEVER, CUSTOMERS WILL NOT BE ABLE TO  
7 SUBSCRIBE TO ELS AND TO ANOTHER OPTIONAL EAS PLAN  
8 SIMULTANEOUSLY.

9

10 FOR THE MOST PART, SOUTHERN BELL PROPOSES THAT  
11 EXISTING OPTIONAL MEASURED SERVICE PLANS BE  
12 OBSOLETE. MY EXHIBIT NHS-3 EXPLAINS IN DETAIL  
13 HOW THESE PLANS AND THEIR SUBSCRIBERS WILL BE  
14 AFFECTED BY OUR PROPOSAL. THE SAME EXHIBIT ALSO  
15 PROVIDES MORE DETAIL ON THE EFFECTS ON EXISTING  
16 OPTIONAL EAS PLANS AND INCLUDES THOSE ROUTES  
17 PROPOSED FOR CONVERSION TO NON-OPTIONAL TWO-WAY  
18 FLAT RATE EAS.

19

20 Q. ANOTHER ONE OF YOUR PROPOSALS IS TO RESTRUCTURE  
21 THE LOCAL EXCHANGE MESSAGE RATE TARIFF. WHY IS  
22 SOUTHERN BELL PROPOSING CHANGES TO ITS  
23 MESSAGE RATE TARIFF?

24

25 A. THE PRESENT TARIFF STRUCTURE FOR LOCAL EXCHANGE

1 MESSAGE RATE SERVICE HAS NEEDED MODIFICATION FOR  
2 SOME TIME. FOR EXAMPLE, THE PRESENT MONTHLY  
3 RECURRING MESSAGE RATE CHARGES FOR "ADDITIONAL"  
4 PBX TRUNKS ARE WELL BELOW THE CORRESPONDING  
5 MONTHLY RECURRING MESSAGE RATE CHARGE FOR BUSINESS  
6 LINES. ADDITIONALLY, BUSINESS FLAT RATE CUSTOMERS  
7 PAY A SEPARATE CHARGE FOR HUNTING SERVICE, WHILE  
8 THERE IS PRESENTLY NO CHARGE FOR THE SAME SERVICE  
9 FOR BUSINESS MESSAGE RATE CUSTOMERS.

10

11 THIS RESTRUCTURE WILL MORE APPROPRIATELY ALIGN THE  
12 RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE MESSAGE RATE CHARGES FOR  
13 BUSINESS LINES AND PBX TRUNKS THROUGH ADJUSTMENTS  
14 IN THE FIRST AND ADDITIONAL TRUNK CHARGES AND  
15 ASSOCIATED MESSAGE ALLOWANCES.

16

17 OUR PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE LOCAL EXCHANGE MESSAGE  
18 RATE TARIFF WILL CORRECT THESE INCONSISTENCIES,  
19 AND WILL ALIGN THE TARIFF WITH THE MODIFICATIONS  
20 THAT WE ARE PROPOSING FOR FLAT RATE SERVICE AND  
21 FOR ELS.

22

23 Q. PLEASE DESCRIBE SOUTHERN BELL'S PROPOSED CHANGES  
24 TO THE LOCAL EXCHANGE MESSAGE RATE SERVICE TARIFF.

25

1 A. THE PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE LOCAL EXCHANGE MESSAGE  
2 RATE TARIFF INCLUDE THE ADDITION OF A CHARGE FOR  
3 HUNTING SERVICE AND CHANGES IN THE CHARGE FOR  
4 ADDITIONAL PBX TRUNKS AND THE ASSOCIATED USAGE  
5 ALLOWANCE.  
6  
7 MORE SPECIFICALLY, BUSINESS MESSAGE RATE HUNTING  
8 CHARGES WILL BE CALCULATED AT 35% OF THE  
9 APPROPRIATE MONTHLY CHARGE FOR A MESSAGE RATE  
10 BUSINESS LINE. THIS CHARGE WILL RANGE FROM \$5.15  
11 TO \$7.59 PER MONTH, DEPENDING ON THE RATE GROUP,  
12 AND IT WILL APPLY TO EACH MESSAGE RATE BUSINESS  
13 LINE, PBX TRUNK OR NETWORK ACCESS REGISTER (NAR)  
14 IN A CUSTOMER'S ACCOUNT EQUIPPED WITH THE HUNTING  
15 FEATURE.  
16  
17 TO FURTHER ALIGN THE MESSAGE RATE OFFERINGS FOR  
18 BUSINESS LINES AND PBX TRUNKS, SOUTHERN BELL IS  
19 PROPOSING TO CHARGE THE SAME MONTHLY RECURRING  
20 RATE FOR AN ADDITIONAL MESSAGE RATE PBX TRUNK AS  
21 IT DOES FOR THE FIRST MESSAGE RATE PBX TRUNK. IN  
22 ADDITION, THE CURRENT 75 CALL ALLOWANCE THAT IS  
23 GIVEN ONLY ON THE FIRST TRUNK WILL NOW BE EXTENDED  
24 TO ALL OF THE CUSTOMER'S OUTDIAL AND COMBINATION  
25 TRUNKS. THEREFORE, FOR CUSTOMERS EXCEEDING THE

1 ALLOWANCE, THE NET MONTHLY CHANGE WILL RANGE FROM  
2 -\$1.37 TO \$2.12 FOR OUTDIAL TRUNKS AND FROM \$3.78  
3 TO \$9.71 FOR COMBINATION TRUNKS WITH HUNTING.

4

5 Q. WHAT IS THE REVENUE IMPACT OF THE CHANGES PROPOSED  
6 IN THE LOCAL EXCHANGE MESSAGE RATE TARIFF?

7

8 A. BASED ON 1993 DEMAND, IT IS ESTIMATED THAT THE  
9 ANNUAL REVENUE INCREASE ASSOCIATED WITH THE  
10 PROPOSED MESSAGE RATE TARIFF CHANGES WILL BE \$2.8  
11 MILLION. EXHIBIT NHS-2 INCLUDES THE DETAILED  
12 TARIFF CHANGES.

13

14 Q. SOUTHERN BELL IS PROPOSING TO MODIFY THE FOREIGN  
15 EXCHANGE (FX) TARIFF. WOULD YOU PLEASE EXPLAIN  
16 YOUR PROPOSAL?

17

18 A. SOUTHERN BELL PROPOSES TO REINSTATE THE CHARGE FOR  
19 HUNTING SERVICE TO FOREIGN EXCHANGE CUSTOMERS. IN  
20 1992 FLORIDA FX SERVICE WAS RESTRUCTURED FROM A  
21 FLAT RATE SERVICE TO A MEASURED RATE SERVICE.  
22 PRIOR TO THE RESTRUCTURE, FLAT RATED FX CUSTOMERS  
23 SUBSCRIBED TO HUNTING SERVICE FROM SECTION A3.6 OF  
24 THE GENERAL SUBSCRIBER SERVICE TARIFF (GSST) JUST  
25 AS ANY OTHER CUSTOMER. WHEN THE FX RESTRUCTURE

1 WAS FILED, THE CHARGE FOR HUNTING SERVICE ON AN FX  
2 LINE WAS OMITTED. THEREFORE, FX CUSTOMERS WITH  
3 HUNTING SERVICE WERE NO LONGER CHARGED.

4  
5 IN ORDER TO CORRECT THIS, SOUTHERN BELL IS  
6 PROPOSING TO INCLUDE A UNIFORM RATE ELEMENT FOR  
7 HUNTING SERVICE IN THE FX TARIFF SECTION A9. THIS  
8 PROPOSED RATE OF \$7.35 IS LOWER THAN THE HUNTING  
9 RATE CHARGED PRIOR TO THE RESTRUCTURE OF FX  
10 SERVICE. THE ESTIMATED ANNUAL REVENUE IMPACT IS  
11 \$.4 MILLION (SEE EXHIBIT NHS-4).

12  
13 Q. AS A PART OF SOUTHERN BELL'S RATE DESIGN PROPOSAL,  
14 ARE YOU REQUESTING SWITCHED ACCESS RATE CHANGES?

15  
16 A. YES. SOUTHERN BELL IS PROPOSING TO REDUCE  
17 SWITCHED ACCESS RATES BY APPROXIMATELY \$10 MILLION  
18 ANNUALLY. THE REDUCTION WILL BE IN THE LOCAL  
19 TRANSPORT RATE ELEMENT WHICH WILL BE REDUCED FROM  
20 \$.01540 TO \$.01289 OR APPROXIMATELY 16%.

21  
22 THE LOCAL TRANSPORT CHANGE ADDRESSES ONE OF THE  
23 MOST COMPETITIVE ELEMENTS OF ACCESS. THE  
24 RESULTING COMPOSITE FEATURE GROUP D SWITCHED  
25 ACCESS RATE WILL BE REDUCED FROM \$.11207 TO

1           \$.10705 (SEE EXHIBIT NHS-5).

2

3           SOUTHERN BELL HAS INCLUDED THE IMPACT OF  
4           STIMULATION IN THE SWITCHED ACCESS PRICE-OUT.  
5           HOWEVER, THIS STIMULATION IS CONTINGENT ON THE  
6           IXC'S FLOWING THROUGH THE ACCESS REDUCTION IN  
7           THEIR TOLL RATES. IF FLOW THROUGHS ARE NOT DONE,  
8           THE SWITCHED ACCESS IMPACT ON SOUTHERN BELL COULD  
9           BE NEARLY \$12 MILLION.

10

11 Q.       ARE THE LOCAL TRANSPORT RATES IDENTIFIED ABOVE,  
12           THE CURRENT RATES?

13

14 A.       NO. THE RATES USED ABOVE ASSUME THAT DURING 1993  
15           TIME-OF-DAY DISCOUNTS HAVE BEEN ELIMINATED AND  
16           THAT SOUTHERN BELL HAS FILED TO MIRROR THE  
17           INTERSTATE APPLICATION OF CARRIER COMMON LINE  
18           CHARGES ON 700, 800 AND 900 ACCESS SERVICES. AS A  
19           RESULT OF THESE CHANGES, THE LOCAL TRANSPORT RATE  
20           SHOULD HAVE BEEN REDUCED FROM \$.0160 TO \$.01540,  
21           THE FEATURE GROUP D ORIGINATING CARRIER COMMON  
22           LINE RATE REDUCED FROM \$.02660 TO \$.02600, AND THE  
23           FEATURE GROUP D TERMINATING CARRIER COMMON LINE  
24           RATE REDUCED FROM \$.03660 TO \$.02927.

25

1 Q. WILL YOU NOW DESCRIBE THE CHANGES SOUTHERN BELL  
2 PLANS TO MAKE IN ORDER TO DISTRIBUTE THE ESTIMATED  
3 \$49 MILLION CUSTOMER CREDIT?  
4

5 A. YES. ONE OF THE PROPOSALS IS A RESTRUCTURING OF  
6 SERVICE CONNECTION CHARGES WHICH REDUCES THE  
7 RATES, THEREBY BRINGING THEM MORE IN LINE WITH  
8 COSTS AND SIMPLIFIES THE EXISTING STRUCTURE SO  
9 THAT IT WILL BE EASIER FOR OUR CUSTOMERS TO  
10 UNDERSTAND. THE NEW STRUCTURE MAKES A DISTINCTION  
11 BETWEEN THE CHARGES FOR THE FIRST AND ADDITIONAL  
12 LINES, AND CONSISTS OF THREE MAJOR CATEGORIES:  
13 LINE CONNECTION CHARGE, LINE CHANGE CHARGE AND  
14 SECONDARY SERVICE CHARGE. THESE CHARGES WILL  
15 REPLACE THE EXISTING PRIMARY SERVICE ORDERING  
16 CHARGE, SECONDARY SERVICE ORDERING CHARGE, CENTRAL  
17 OFFICE WORK, NEW LINE CONNECTION, NUMBER CHANGE  
18 AND RESTORATION CHARGES.  
19

20 THE LINE CONNECTION CHARGE WILL APPLY TO EACH NEW  
21 LINE THAT IS BEING CONNECTED. THE PROPOSED RATES  
22 ARE \$40.00 FOR RESIDENCE AND \$60.00 FOR BUSINESS  
23 COMPARED TO THE CURRENT RATES OF \$76.00 AND  
24 \$86.00, RESPECTIVELY. THE FIRST LINE CHARGE WILL  
25 APPLY IF ONLY ONE LINE IS ORDERED. IF MORE THAN

1 ONE LINE IS REQUESTED ON THE SAME ORDER, THE NEW  
2 LOWER RATED ADDITIONAL LINE CHARGE WILL APPLY TO  
3 EACH ADDED LINE.  
4  
5 THE LINE CHANGE CHARGE WILL APPLY PER LINE FOR A  
6 VARIETY OF CUSTOMER REQUESTED CHANGES, SUCH AS  
7 NUMBER CHANGES AND TEMPORARY SUSPENSIONS, AND ALSO  
8 FOR RESTORALS AFTER SERVICE IS INTERRUPTED FOR  
9 NON-PAYMENT.  
10  
11 THE SECONDARY SERVICE CHARGE WILL APPLY TO EACH  
12 CUSTOMER REQUEST FOR ADDING OR REARRANGING  
13 SERVICES SUCH AS CUSTOM CALLING FEATURES,  
14 TOUCH-TONE SERVICE, ETC. THIS CHARGE WILL ALSO  
15 APPLY TO DIRECTORY LISTING CHANGES AND TRANSFERS  
16 OF RESPONSIBILITY.  
17  
18 FINALLY, THE PREMISES VISIT CHARGE WILL BE  
19 COMBINED INTO THE FIRST 15 MINUTE INCREMENT OF THE  
20 PREMISES WORK CHARGE, WHICH WILL NOT AFFECT THE  
21 TOTAL CHARGE. EXHIBIT NHS-6 PROVIDES A DETAILED  
22 COMPARISON OF THE CURRENT AND PROPOSED RATES.  
23  
24 Q. HOW WILL THE COMPANY'S REVENUES BE AFFECTED BY THE  
25 RESTRUCTURE OF THESE CHARGES?

1

2 A. BASED ON 1993 DEMAND, THE COMPANY WILL REALIZE  
3 REDUCED ANNUAL REVENUES OF APPROXIMATELY \$14.0  
4 MILLION. (SEE EXHIBIT NHS-6).

5

6 Q. ANOTHER CHANGE WHICH SOUTHERN BELL PROPOSES IS TO  
7 MAKE ADJUSTMENTS IN THE FLAT RATE RELATIONSHIPS OF  
8 THE LINE, PBX TRUNK, AND NETWORK ACCESS REGISTER  
9 (NAR), ALONG WITH AN UNBUNDLING OF HUNTING  
10 SERVICES. WOULD YOU EXPLAIN THIS ASPECT OF THE  
11 COMPANY'S PROPOSAL?

12

13 A. IN ORDER TO BRING FLAT PBX TRUNK RATES CLOSER TO  
14 PARITY WITH LINE RATES, HUNTING SERVICE UNDER THE  
15 PROPOSED RATE SCHEDULE WILL BE DISAGGREGATED FROM  
16 ALL FLAT RATE PBX TRUNKS. THE DISAGGREGATED  
17 HUNTING CHARGE FOR PBX TRUNKS WILL BE THE SAME AS  
18 THE HUNTING CHARGE FOR BUSINESS LINES (SEE EXHIBIT  
19 NHS-2 FOR DETAILED TARIFF CHANGES).

20

21 BUSINESS FLAT RATE TRUNKS, UPON DISAGGREGATION,  
22 WILL BE REDUCED TO 170% OF THE INDIVIDUAL FLAT  
23 RATE BUSINESS LINE CHARGE. FOR EXAMPLE, IN RATE  
24 GROUP 12, THE NET REDUCTION PER TWO WAY TRUNK WITH  
25 HUNTING IS \$5.57 AND THE REDUCTION PER OUTGOING

1 TRUNK WITHOUT HUNTING IS \$15.76.  
2  
3 BUSINESS FLAT RATE HUNTING SERVICE WILL BE REDUCED  
4 FROM 50% TO 35% OF THE INDIVIDUAL FLAT RATE  
5 BUSINESS LINE. THE MONTHLY RATE REDUCTION PER  
6 LINE WILL BE \$4.64 IN RATE GROUP 12. RESIDENCE  
7 FLAT RATE HUNTING SERVICE WILL REMAIN AT 50% OF  
8 THE INDIVIDUAL FLAT RATE LINE.  
9  
10 NETWORK ACCESS REGISTER (NAR) RATES WILL BE  
11 REDUCED BY APPROXIMATELY THE SAME PERCENTAGE AS  
12 PBX TRUNKS. IN ADDITION, HUNTING SERVICE WILL BE  
13 DISAGGREGATED FROM NARS. FOR EXAMPLE, IN RATE  
14 GROUP 12, THE NET REDUCTION PER TWO WAY NAR WITH  
15 HUNTING IS \$2.56 AND THE REDUCTION PER OUTGOING  
16 NAR WITHOUT HUNTING IS \$12.75.  
17  
18 Q. WHAT IS THE REVENUE IMPACT OF THE PBX, NAR AND  
19 HUNTING DISAGGREGATION AND REDUCTION?  
20  
21 A. SOUTHERN BELL ESTIMATES THAT THESE CHANGES WILL  
22 RESULT IN A \$29.6 MILLION ANNUAL REDUCTION IN  
23 REVENUES BASED ON 1993 DEMAND. THIS REVENUE  
24 IMPACT IS BASED ON THE TARIFF REVISIONS BEING  
25 APPROVED AS FILED ALONG WITH THE PROPOSED ELS

1 TARIFF PROPOSAL. IF A CHANGE IS MADE TO EITHER OF  
2 THESE PROPOSALS, THE REVENUE IMPACT COULD BE

5 Q. ARE THERE ANY OTHER PROPOSALS BY SOUTHERN BELL TO  
6 ACCOUNT FOR THE \$49 MILLION CUSTOMER CREDIT?

7

8 A. YES. THE COMMISSION HAS ALREADY TAKEN ACTION TO  
9 ELIMINATE THE EXISTING EAS FLAT RATE ADDITIVES FOR  
10 CENTURY, MUNSON AND YULEE. THE RESULT OF THE  
11 ELIMINATION OF THESE ADDITIVES AND THE REGROUPING  
12 OF THE THREE EXCHANGES IS AN ESTIMATED ANNUAL  
13 REVENUE LOSS OF \$.17 MILLION.

14

15 Q. WHAT REDUCTIONS ARE PROPOSED IN THE COMPANY'S  
16 CUSTOM CALLING RATES IN ASSOCIATION WITH THE  
17 ESTIMATED \$49 MILLION CUSTOMER CREDIT?

18

19 A. OVERALL, THE COMPANY IS PROPOSING AN ANNUAL  
20 REDUCTION OF REVENUES DERIVED FROM CUSTOM CALLING  
21 SERVICE OF \$4.3 MILLION IN 1993 (SEE EXHIBIT  
22 NHS-7). THE MONTHLY RATE FOR RESIDENCE CALL  
23 WAITING WILL BE REDUCED FROM \$3.50 TO \$3.35. THE  
24 MONTHLY RATE FOR RESIDENCE CALL FORWARDING  
25 VARIABLE WILL BE REDUCED FROM \$2.45 TO \$2.20.

THE TARIFFED RATES FOR CUSTOM CALLING FEATURES ARE CURRENTLY BANDED WITH A PRICE FLOOR AND A PRICE CEILING. THE CHANGES PROPOSED ARE CLOSELY ALIGNED WITH THE RATES THAT WERE IN EFFECT PRIOR TO THE INTRODUCTION OF THE MULTI-FEATURE DISCOUNT PLAN.

Q. WHAT SHOULD BE THE EFFECTIVE DATE(S) OF ANY RATE CHANGES APPROVED IN THIS DOCKET?

A. THE EFFECTIVE DATE FOR ANY RATE CHANGE WILL DEPEND UPON THE TYPE OF CHANGE THAT IS ORDERED AND TO WHAT DEGREE THE CHANGE DIFFERS FROM THAT PROPOSED IN SOUTHERN BELL'S FILING. IF THE SIMPLE RATE CHANGES AND THE STRUCTURAL CHANGES TO SERVICE ORDERING CHARGES ARE APPROVED AS PROPOSED BY SOUTHERN BELL, THEY SHOULD BECOME EFFECTIVE TWO MONTHS FOLLOWING THE FINAL ORDER.

CHANGES TO THE RATES AND TARIFFS THAT ARE ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROPOSED EXPANDED LOCAL SERVICE PLAN SHOULD BE EFFECTIVE UPON IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PLAN. AS STATED PREVIOUSLY, IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT IF THE PLAN IS APPROVED AS FILED, IMPLEMENTATION WOULD OCCUR SIX MONTHS AFTER

1 THE ORDER BECOMES FINAL. IF A PLAN OTHER THAN THE  
2 ONE PROPOSED BY SOUTHERN BELL IS ORDERED, THE  
3 IMPLEMENTATION COULD TAKE AS LONG AS TWELVE TO  
4 FIFTEEN MONTHS DEPENDING UPON THE PARAMETERS OF  
5 THE PLAN.

6

7 Q. WOULD YOU PLEASE SUMMARIZE YOUR TESTIMONY?

8

9 A. IN CONJUNCTION WITH SOUTHERN BELL'S REQUEST FOR AN  
10 EXTENSION OF ITS INCENTIVE SHARING PLAN, SOUTHERN  
11 BELL REQUESTS THAT THE COMMISSION APPROVE THE  
12 FOLLOWING PROPOSALS:

13

14 - AN OPTIONAL EXPANDED LOCAL SERVICE PLAN WHICH  
15 PROVIDES RESIDENTIAL AND BUSINESS CUSTOMERS WITH  
16 LOCAL CALLING CAPABILITY OUT TO FORTY  
17 MILES AT DISCOUNTED RATES. THE TARIFF PROPOSAL  
18 GIVES BOTH RESIDENCE AND BUSINESS CUSTOMERS A  
19 CHOICE OF TWO OPTIONAL OFFERINGS. RESIDENCE OR  
20 BUSINESS CUSTOMERS MAY CHOOSE THE STANDARD OPTION  
21 WHICH COMBINES USAGE BASED PRICING FOR THE  
22 EXISTING BASIC LOCAL CALLING AREA WITH REDUCED  
23 USAGE RATES FOR CALLING INTO THE EXPANDED LOCAL  
24 CALLING AREA (40 MILES). RESIDENCE CUSTOMERS MAY  
25 CHOOSE THE PREMIUM OPTION WHICH, FOR AN ADDITIONAL

1 FLAT MONTHLY FEE, WILL ALLOW THEM UNLIMITED

3 CALLING AREAS. THE PREMIUM OFFERING FOR BUSINESS

6 ALSO APPLIED AS A CREDIT TOWARD BLCA USAGE.  
7 EXISTING AND FUTURE CUSTOMERS WILL CONTINUE TO BE  
8 ABLE TO SUBSCRIBE TO EXISTING BASIC FLAT OR  
9 MESSAGE RATE LOCAL SERVICE WITH TOLL CALLING.  
10 WHEN THE SERVICE IS MATURE, THE IMPACT ON SOUTHERN  
11 BELL'S REVENUES WILL BE SUBSTANTIAL.

13 - A RESTRUCTURE OF THE LOCAL EXCHANGE MESSAGE RATE  
14 OFFERING TO ALIGN THE MESSAGE RATE BUSINESS LINE  
15 AND MESSAGE RATE PBX TRUNK CHARGES THROUGH  
16 ADJUSTMENTS IN THE RATES FOR THE "ADDITIONAL"  
17 TRUNKS, CHANGES IN THE ALLOWANCES PER TRUNK AND  
18 THE ADDITION OF HUNTING. THE ESTIMATED ANNUAL  
19 REVENUE INCREASE IS \$2.8 MILLION.

21 - THE REINSTATEMENT OF HUNTING CHARGES FOR FX  
22 SERVICE WITH AN ESTIMATED ANNUAL REVENUE GAIN OF

25 - A REDUCTION IN THE LOCAL TRANSPORT RATE ELEMENT

1 OF SWITCHED ACCESS. THE ANNUAL REVENUE LOSS IS  
2 ESTIMATED TO BE \$10 MILLION IN 1993.

4 SOUTHERN BELL ALSO REQUESTS THAT THE COMMISSION  
5 APPROVE OUR PROPOSAL TO DISTRIBUTE THE 1993  
6 CUSTOMER CREDIT OF APPROXIMATELY \$49 MILLION AS  
7 FOLLOWS:

8

9 - A REDUCTION AND RESTRUCTURE OF SERVICE  
10 CONNECTION CHARGES. THE ANNUAL REVENUE IMPACT IS  
11 ESTIMATED TO BE A LOSS OF \$14.0 MILLION IN 1993.

ALL EXISTING BASIC OPTIONAL EXTENDED AREA SERVICE (OEAS) AND TOLL-PAC PLAN ROUTES AS WELL AS ENHANCED OEAS OPTIONS WILL BE GRANDFATHERED EXCEPT FOR THE PREMIUM OPTION OF ENHANCED OEAS WHICH WILL CONTINUE TO BE AVAILABLE TO CURRENT AND NEW FLAT OR MESSAGE RATE SUBSCRIBERS. RESIDENCE AND BUSINESS COMBINATION (UNMEASURED AND MEASURED) CUSTOMERS SERVED FROM THE MIAMI METRO CENTRAL OFFICE AS WELL AS BUSINESS COMBINATION CUSTOMERS SERVED FROM THE HOLLYWOOD PEMBROKE PINES CENTRAL OFFICE WILL BE CONVERTED TO FLAT RATE SERVICE. ADDITIONALLY, NON-OPTIONAL TWO-WAY FLAT RATE EAS IS PROPOSED BETWEEN GREEN COVE SPRINGS AND THE FOLLOWING EXCHANGES: ORANGE PARK, JACKSONVILLE, JULINGTON, MAXVILLE AND MIDDLEBURG. **SERVICE CHARGE**

Service Charge is a nonrecurring charge or charges applying to the ordering, installing, moving, changing, rearranging or furnishing of telecommunication services or facilities. Service Charges are categorized as:

- Line Connection Charge
- Line Change Charge
- Secondary Service Charge
- Premises Work Charge

Line Connection Charge (First Line and/or Additional Line) applies for establishing an exchange access line or trunk. The charge includes service ordering, central office work, exchange access line work and a standard voice miniature six position network interface.

Line Change Charge (First Line and/or Additional Line) applies per line to miscellaneous customer requested changes on existing service for, but not limited to, number change and suspend/restore.

Secondary Service Charge applies per customer request for the receiving, recording, and processing of customer requests to change services or add new or additional services.

Premises Work Charge is a nonrecurring charge based on the labor time and miscellaneous materials required to rearrange the drop wire, protector and/or network interface or to install semi-public telephone service.

**CUSTOMER REQUEST**

The term "per customer request" as used in this section shall be defined as a customer request for service that is ordered at the same time to be provided on the same date, the same premises, the same system, and the same account.

**NETWORK INTERFACE**

The network interface is a FCC approved standard registration program jack which is used at the demarcation point as a means of connection between the telecommunications network and the customer's inside wire and/or equipment.

**DEMARCATIION POINT**

The point of demarcation and/or interconnection between Company communications facilities and the customer's terminal equipment, protective apparatus or wiring at a subscriber's premises.<sup>2</sup> Company-installed facilities at, or constituting, the demarcation point shall consist of wire or a jack conforming to Subpart F of Part 68 of the Federal Communications Commission's rules.
