On April 14, 2025, Florida Power & Light Company (FPL or Company) filed a request for confidential treatment of Document No. 02819-2025. This document contains confidential information in response to OPC's Sixth Set of Interrogatories (ROG), No. 153 and OPC's Sixth Request for Production of Documents (POD), Nos. 67-71. On May 20, 2025, FPL filed a notice of partial withdrawal of its request for confidential classification of the information provided in Document No. 02819-2025, specifically the material included as Attachment 1 of the Company's response to OPC's Interrogatory No. 153. Therefore, this memo only pertains to the remaining material included as FPL's response to OPC's Sixth PODs, Nos. 67-71. This information can be described as contracts, contract pricing, and negotiated terms between FPL and vendors regarding FPL's nuclear projects.

In its request for confidentiality, FPL asserts that disclosure of this information would harm FPL, as the information relates to contractual data and competitive interests. Furthermore, FPL states that the Company treats the highlighted information provided in Document No. 02819-2025 as private and has not publicly disclosed it. If disclosed, it may impair the Company's ability to contract for goods and services on favorable terms and also impair the competitive business of the provider of the information.

Staff has reviewed the documents and concurs with FPL that the nature of the information meets the requirements set forth in Section 366.093(3)(d) and (e), Florida Statutes, whereby disclosure of the information would impair the ability to contract for goods or services on favorable terms of FPL, and impair its competitive business interests. Therefore, staff recommends the request for confidential classification of FPL's response to OPC's Sixth PODs (Nos. 67-71) in Document No. 02819-2025 be approved.
