My name is Sally Philips, and I am a resident of Miami-Dade County. As a Florida Power & Light customer, I strongly oppose the rate increase request of almost \$10 billion — the largest in US history. This unjust and excessive increase would further cause everyday Floridians, especially Black, Brown, and fixed-income communities, to fall deeper into the difficulties caused by the current high costs of living.

During the public service hearings, we witnessed firsthand how real Floridians are currently struggling to pay their bills, rent, groceries, and medications. Community organizations are standing up against corporate greed and revealing the conditions that everyday Florida residents are currently experiencing.

What benefits to the consumer has FP&L provided since the last rate increase? What justifications have FP&L offered for this proposed increase? Are they planning to lower their carbon imprint significantly? What significant benefits to the public will FP&L be providing with this proposed increase? How much of this proposed increase have they ear-marked as campaign contributions to politicians who support corporate profit rather than the welfare of people and the planet.

The PSC should prioritize consumers by ensuring fair and affordable utility rates. I urge the Public Service Commission to reject this massive rate hike and stand by Floridians and not for-profit corporations. We need affordable and clean energy.
