PROXY STATEMENT

This Proxy Statement has been prepared and is furnished by the Management of CITY GAS COMPANY OF FLORIDA (the "Issuer") for use in the solicitation of proxies for the Annual Meeting of Stockholders of the Issuer to be held on July 21, 1982, for the purposes set forth in the accompanying notice of meeting.

All proxies, in the form solicited hereby, that are received by the Management will be voted at the meeting. A proxy may be revoked at any time before it is voted. The form of proxy vests, in the persons named therein as proxies, discretionary authority to vote on any matter not known to Management at the present time that may properly come before the meeting. Management is not aware of any matter, other than the election of Directors, that may be presented to the meeting.

The cost of preparing, assembling and mailing the proxy material is to be borne by the Issuer. The Issuer will also reimburse brokers, nominees or other fiduciaries for reasonable expenses incurred in obtaining instructions from their principals.

As at March 31, 1982, the end of the Issuer's fiscal year, there were issued and outstanding and entitled to vote, a total of 1,012,000 shares of the common stock of the Issuer, and the same number of shares are issued and outstanding and entitled to vote as of the date of the mailing of this Proxy Statement.

The Directors and Officers as a group, consisting of ten individuals, own a total of 142,542 shares, representing 14.1% of the total issued and outstanding shares of the common stock of the Issuer.

Jack Weiner owns 42,810 shares of the common stock of the Issuer in his own name. This is less than 5% of the total issued and outstanding shares of the common stock of the Issuer. Additionally, Jack Weiner and Anne Weiner, who are husband and wife, hold 17,809 shares of the common stock of the Issuer as Trustees for D. Weiner, and Jack Weiner and Anne Weiner hold 17,809 shares of common stock of the Issuer as Trustees for R. Weiner. The Management of the Issuer does not know whether or not Jack Weiner and Anne Weiner have any beneficial ownership in the shares held in trust, but compositely the shares held by Jack Weiner, individually, and by Jack Weiner and Anne Weiner, as Trustees, amount to 7.7% of the total issued and outstanding shares of the common stock of the Issuer. Jack Weiner and Anne Weiner reside at 3004 Brickell Avenue, Miami, Florida 33129.

Sid Weiner owns 62,620 shares of the stock of the Issuer, which amounts to 6.2% of the total issued and outstanding shares of the common stock of the Issuer. Sid Weiner resides at 11 Island Avenue, Miami Beach, Florida 33139.

The Management of the Issuer does not know of any other person who owns beneficially or of record 5% or more of the common stock of the Issuer which is outstanding and entitled to vote. The Directors of the Issuer do not have any beneficial interest in and disclaim ownership of the holdings of their wives or children, which holdings are hereinafter set forth.

ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

The persons named in the form of proxy solicited hereby intend to vote all proxies received in favor of the election of each of the persons named below as Directors. Discretionary authority is reserved to the persons named in the form of proxy solicited hereby to vote for substitute nominees, in the event that any of the persons named below as nominees shall be unable or unwilling to serve. Management is not aware that such an event will occur. The term of each Director elected will expire at the next Annual Meeting of Stockholders or upon the election and qualification of his successor. The Board of Directors of the issuer does not have a standing nominating committee.

ACTIVITIES OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors held five meetings during the fiscal year. The Issuer has an Executive Committee which has the authority to act between meetings of the Board. The Issuer does not have standing Audit, Compensation or Nominating Committees. No Director attended less than 75% of the total of all Board Meetings during the year. All Nominee Directors, with the exception of Mr. Blumenthal, are officers of the Issuer, but three of these (Messrs. Blumin, David Langer and Roberts) have other principal occupations. Messrs. Blumin and Roberts are each paid a salary of \$12,000.00 per year. David Langer is paid a salary of \$24,000.00 per year as a part time employee. Mr. Blumenthal receives a director's fee of \$750.00 for each meeting attended by him, plus reimbursement for travel expenses. The three full-time employees who are Nominee Directors do not receive extra compensation for serving on the Board. Mr. S. W. Langer, Chairman of the Board, is the father of Jack Langer (a Nominee Director and President of the Issuer) and David Langer (a Nominee Director and Senior Vice President of the Issuer).

No amount is included for insurance benefits, because such benefits are available generally to Department Heads and to non-bargaining unit employees.

PENSION PLAN-TARGET BENEFIT

Non-bargaining unit employees of the Issuer who have completed one year of service become participants in the Issuer's non-contributory Target Benefit Pension Plan. (Bargaining unit employees have a separate plan, to which Issuer contributes in accordance with the Union contract). Pensions are

paid through the Manufacturer's Life Insurance Company, financed by contributions of the Issuer. The normal retirement date is the Plan anniversary date closest to the Participant's 65th birthday, or the Plan anniversary on which the Participant completes ten years of participation in the Plan, whichever is later, but in no event later than the Plan anniversary closest to the Participant's 75th birthday. Participants in the Pension Plan may take early retirement at age 59, with reduced benefits. The Target Benefit is a monthly pension for life amounting to 10% of the Participant's average monthly compensation, plus 33.33% of the Participant's monthly compensation in excess of the monthly covered compensation from the following table:

If the Participant has less than 35 years of service at normal retirement, the Target Benefit described above will be reduced proportionately for each year of service less than 35. The actual monthly pension may be more or less than the Target Benefit described above. The actual monthly pension will depend upon the total value of the accrued benefit when the Participant retires. The Plan assumes 5½% interest is earned each year to retirement on the contributions made by the Issuer, but if the actual earnings are more than or less than 5½%, then the amount of pension will be raised or lowered accordingly. Participants become 40% vested after 4 years of service plus 5% for the next two years, then 10% for each additional year, thereafter, reaching 100% after 11 years of service. If the Participant dies while employed, and is vested, but is not eligible for retirement, the amount in his account is paid to his beneficiary including the amount of his life insurance carried by the Plan. To purchase the life insurance, 45% of the Issuers contributions for each Participant is used for this purpose. The following table illustrates approximate annual pensions under the Pension Plan expressed in terms of single life annuities, based on the indicated assumptions (the illustrations are intended to be examples of the Pension formula as applied to various pay levels at various ages):

PENSION PLAN (OLD PLAN)

The prior defined benefit Plan will be continued so as to pay to eligible Participants and Retirees benefits provided thereunder and specifically including retirement benefits accrued up to and through December 31, 1980, but without any further accrual of retirement benefits from said prior Plan following December 31, 1980. Each Retiree's accrued monthly retirement benefit under the Old Plan shall be increased by a 3% cost of living increase annually on June 1 of each year beginning June 1, 1982, both prior to and following retirement, until such time as the Retiree or his beneficiary shall cease to be entitled to retirement benefits under the Plan. It is not expected that any further contributions to this Old Plan will be required of the Issuer in order to fund the Plan, including the 3% cost of living increase.

INDEPENDENT PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT OF THE COMPANY

Touche Ross & Co., Certified Public Accounts, 444 Brickell Avenue, Miami, Florida 33131, was the independent public accountant for the Issuer for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1982. No independent public accountant has been selected by the Issuer for the current year, since it is and has been for many years the practice of the issuer to have its independent public accountant selected at the Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors, which is held immediately after the Annual Meeting of Stockholders. It is contemplated that independent public accountants for the Issuer for the current year will be selected in accordance with established practice. A representative of Touche Ross & Co. is

expected to be present at the Annual Meeting of the Stockholders of the Issuer to be held July 21, 1982, with the opportunity to make a statement if such representative desires to do so; additionally, he is expected to be available to respond to appropriate questions.

In addition to performing the annual audit for the Issuer and certifying to the annual financial statement for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1982, the above-named public accountants also certified Issuer's data required to be filed with the Florida Public Service Commission. The above-named public accountants did not perform any other services for the Issuer during the fiscal year ended March 31, 1982.

In selecting the independent public accountants for the Issuer for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1982, the Board considered the independence of the aforementioned independent accountants.

EXCERPTS FROM THE LAW

(Natural Gas Act, 15 U.S.C. 717-717w)

"Sec. 10(a). Every natural gas (sic) company shall file with the Commission such annual and other periodic or special reports as the Commission may by rules and regulations or order prescribe as necessary or appropriate to assist the Commission in the proper administration of this act. The Commission may prescribe the manner and form in which such reports shall be made, and require from such natural gas companies specific answers to all questions upon which the Commission may need information. The Commission may require that such reports shall include, among other things, full information as to assets and liabilities, capitalization, investment and reduction thereof, gross receipts, interest due and paid, depreciation, amortization, and other reserves, costs of facilities, cost of maintenance and operation of facilities for the production, transportation, or sale of natural-gas (sic), cost of renewal and replacement of such facilities, transportation, delivery, use, and sale of natural-gas (sic)...."

"Sec. 16. The Commission shall have power to perform any and all acts, and to prescribe, issue, make, amend, and rescind such orders, rules, and regulations as it may find necessary or appropriate to carry out the provisions of this act. Among other things, such rules and regulations may define accounting, technical, and trade terms used in this act; and may prescribe the form or forms of all statements declarations, applications, and reports to be filed with the Commission, the information which they shall contain, and time within which they shall be filed...."

GENERAL PENALTIES

"Sec. 21(b). Any person who willfully and knowingly violates any rule, regulation, restriction, condition, or order made or imposed by the Commission under authority of this act, shall, in addition to any other penalties provided by law, be punished upon conviction thereof by a fine of not exceeding \$500 for each and every day during which such offense occurs."
