SOUTHERN BELL TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH COMPANY'S MOTION FOR A TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER FOR ITS RESPONSES TO PUBLIC COUNSEL'S THIRTY-FIRST SET OF INTERROGATORIES

COMES NOW BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc. d/b/a Southern Bell Telephone and Telegraph Company ("Southern Bell" or "Company") and files pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(5)(c), Florida Administrative Code, its Motion for Temporary Protective Order.

- 1. On June 15, 1993, the Office of Public Counsel ("Public Counsel") served upon Southern Bell its Thirty-First Set of Interrogatories in the above-captioned docket. The Thirty-First Set of Interrogatories contains Item Nos. 657, 658, 661, 662 and 663, all of which request information regarding revenues and marketing information of non-regulated services and affiliate companies. Southern Bell considers this information to be proprietary confidential business information pursuant to Section 364.183, Florida Statutes.
- 2. Pursuant to the Florida Public Service Commission's ("Commission") rule on confidentiality, Rule 25-22.006(5)(c), Florida Administrative Code, Southern Bell moves the Prehearing Officer to issue a Temporary Protective Order exempting this data from § 119.07(1), Florida Statutes. This information is entitled to confidential treatment because it contains material regarding revenues and marketing operations of non-regulated services and affiliate companies. This information is clearly confidential

and proprietary under Florida Statutes, § 364.183(e), which provides that "proprietary confidential business information" includes "information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of information."

3. If Public Counsel subsequently notifies Southern Bell that this proprietary information is to be used in a proceeding before the Commission, Southern Bell will, in accordance with Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, file a detailed Motion for Protective Order specifically addressing the information identified.

WHEREFORE, Southern Bell respectfully requests that the Prehearing Officer issue a Temporary Protective Order exempting Southern Bell's responses to Item Nos. 657, 658, 661 and 663 of Public Counsel's Thirty-First Set of Interrogatories from § 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, in accordance with Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code.
