In response thereto, Southern Bell is providing the requested cost study to Staff on this date.

- b) Please provide the fiber completion percentage and the projected date for 100% fiber completion for Southern Bell's feeder routes.

Response: **Feeder Fiber**

Currently 11% of all circuits are served on feeder fiber facilities. By year end 2005, 99-100% of circuits will be served on feeder fiber facilities.

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Request: Fiber Completion Percentages

- c) What is the average mix of interoffice versus feeder cable circuits?

Response: Southern Bell does not have a study which shows the average central office mix of interoffice versus feeder cable circuits. However, Southern Bell can provide a total working DS-1 equivalent ratio for Florida. This includes all DS-1s in Florida, not just fiber DS-1s. The ratio of interoffice DS-1 equivalents to feeder (loop) DS-1 equivalents is approximately 1:5.
