SSU'S ELEVENTH MOTION FOR TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER

Southern States Utilities, Inc. ("SSU"), pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, moves the Florida Public Service Commission for a Temporary Protective Order in this docket, and as grounds therefor, states as follows:

- 1. On February 23, 1996, SSU provided the Office of Public Counsel ("OPC") with a copy of a letter dated December 14, 1993 from Laura A. Holquist to Ronald Sorenson as required by the Prehearing Officer pursuant to Order No. PSC-96-0240-PCO-WS. SSU maintains that the letter contains information relating to the competitive interests of Lehigh Corporation and that public disclosure of the letter would impair the competitive interests of Lehigh Corporation. Accordingly, SSU asserts that the letter contains proprietary confidential business information within the scope of Section 367.156(3), Florida Statutes, and must be afforded protection from public disclosure.
- 2. By this Motion, SSU requests that the information and materials identified above and provided to OPC be granted the DOCUMENT HUMBER-DATE

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protection of a Temporary Protective Order as provided for by Rule 25-22.006(5)(c), Florida Administrative Code. This Temporary Protective Order will protect the materials and information from disclosure until OPC completes its review of the materials and information. Once the review is completed, OPC will notify SSU of the materials and information it intends to use in this docket, and SSU, in accordance with Rule 25-22.006(5)(a) and (c), Florida Code, Administrative will request proprietary confidential treatment of those portions of the materials and information which are, in its opinion, entitled to such treatment. The remainder of any such materials and information which OPC has taken possession of pursuant to this Temporary Protective Order will be returned to SSU by OPC pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(5)(c).

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WHEREFORE, SSU respectfully moves the Commission for a Temporary Protective Order covering the above described documents provided to OPC.
