## OPPOSITION OF METROPOLITAN FIBER SYSTEMS OF FLORIDA, INC. TO BELLSOUTH'S TELECOMMUNICATIONS INC.'S REQUEST FOR ORAL ARGUMENT

Pursuant to Rules 25-22.058 and -22.060, Florida Administrative Code, Metropolitan Fiber Systems of Florida, Inc. ("MFS"), by its undersigned attorneys, hereby files this Opposition to BellSouth Telecommunications, Inc.'s ("BellSouth") Request for Oral Argument accompanying its Motion for Reconsideration of Order No. PSC-96-0445-FOF-TP ("Order") issued on March 29, 1996.

Oral argument is granted in the sole discretion of the Commission. Rule 25-22.060(1)(f). To guide the Commission's exercise of its discretion, BellSouth can assert only that its Motion for Reconsider takes up issues "extremely important to the Company" and that the Order failed to address many of BellSouth's concerns. The Commission's prior evidentiary hearing in the proceeding attests to the importance of the issues. That BellSouth's presentation failed to persuade the Commission in the first instance is no basis upon which to permit BellSouth a second opportunity in which to rehash the same evidence. BellSouth's Motion is unable to make a threshold showing that the Commission either ignored, misinterpreted or misapplied the law applicable to the evidence in this proceeding, or overlooked and failed to consider the significance

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of significant docket evidence. Diamond Cab Co. v. King, 146 So.2d 889 (Fla. 1962).

Accordingly, MFS respectfully submits that BellSouth's Request for Oral Argument be denied.
