

HERRON: -- the Commission put out 20 documentation that listed the options, I think, 21 differently than the way they're listed in this 22 23 Prehearing Order. Because I went to the Tallahassee

hearing and you had them listed as 1, 2 and 3 there;

and here there's 1, 2. And I don't know how all

that's going to fit together when you come read the public hearing transcripts versus the testimony versus 2 what we have got in this Prehearing Order. 3 COMMISSIONER KIESLING: Well --MR. MERRON: I don't know how we are going 5 to make -- I mean, is there going to be a translation that somebody's going to make if somebody spoke 7 that --8 COMMISSIONER KIESLING: I think the place 9 for the translation is going to be in here. So if 10 there's a clarification needed and if you all need to 11 12 in some way change your references --MR. HERRON: See, we all know them as 1, 1A 13 and 2. But when you guys did the public documents, it went out as 1, 2 and 3 as the options. (Pause) 15 COMMISSIONER EIESLING: And while Staff is 16 discussing, I mean, you know, I think that it's also 17 clear that these are three options. It doesn't mean that there may not be some other options that may come 19 out of this. 20 MR. MERRON: We heard about that this 21 22 morning. 23 MR. PELLEGRIMI: Perhaps what we can do in

15	And 3 in the handout is the same as 2?
16	Okay. Well, make sure that somewhere in the
17	Prehearing Order that's clarified.
18	MR. PELLEGRINI: Yes.
19	MR. WANLEN: Is that just going to be stated
20	in the Prehearing Order, or are you anticipating going
21	through and changing the references.
22	COMMISSIONER RIESLING: We can't change the
23	transcript once it's been done.
24	MR. WANLEN: Well, maybe I didn't
25	understand, but I thought he was contemplating

yesterday there were a number of things asked for by

Staff of Mr. Mayne, and I don't know whether some of

those will -- the Staff would want to make exhibits or

just exactly how they want to handle that. But there

were eight or nine or ten different late-filed

exhibits, deposition exhibits, asked for yesterday,

some of which, it occurs to me, may be pertinent to

this proceeding when the information comes in.

Staff will have a Staff exhibit, or they will come in as part of a deposition, one way or the other.

MR. PELLEGRIMI: Staff's present position is to introduce all of them as exhibits.

COMMISSIONER RIESLING: But you don't have them yet?

MR. PELLEGRIMI: We don't have them yet. They are scheduled for Thursday.

COMMISSIONER RIESLING: Okay. And are there any stipulations? Have we tried to reach any stipulations?

MR. WARLEN: The camps are pretty well divided, it looks to me like.

COMMISSIONER RISSLING: Okay. I've already

dealt with the pending motions. So are there any other matters that need to come before us?

Okay. I would just remind the parties that in the Broward County area code change, in our final order on that, we set out the criteria that we were going to use a pretty good amount of detail. And just so everyone is on notice, those are going to be the criteria we are going to apply again here with any additions that may become apparent and needed to resolve this case.

so in terms of looking at what everyone's burden is and what they should be addressing, those are the criteria that we have established, and we'll be applying them again.

MR. MERROW: Commissioner Kiesling, I have one question.

COMMISSIONER KIESLING: Yes.

MR. MERROW: Prior to the hearing

Mr. Pellegrini informed us that three-way split may be
an issue that we need to be looking at. Is that your

view of where the case is going?

COMMISSIONER KIESLING: Ny view of where the case is going is that we are not limited to the three options that are proposed. That if the data is in the record, the population data and the projected growth

data and all of that, that we are not -- that there's no artificial limitation to divisions on LATA boundaries or anything else. So it's anything that's 3 possible. MR. MERRON: Okay, thank you. 5 COMMISSIONER EXESLING: And that's certainly 6 not because I have spoken with anyone else about it, 7 but just -- I mean, you need to know that anything is possible as long as the data is in the record to support it. 10 Anything further? If not, we're concluded. 11 Oh, I do have one question: Does anybody 12 have any doubts about the amount of time we have set aside for hearing?
