This letter is in response to your public records request to the Florida Public Service Commission dated June 1, 1999. You have requested records, documents, reports, and investigative findings pertaining to alleged improper activities of the Florida Department of Corrections and collect pay phone providers. Pursuant to Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, access to public records is the policy of the State of Florida and the Public Service Commission.

Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act and the Florida Public Records Act, this is a request for documents.

This is a request for records, documents, reports, and investigative findings pertaining to improper and/or illegal activities of the Florida Department of Corrections and collect phone service providers that

provide collect phone service in Florida Correctional Institutions operated by the Florida Department of Corrections.

I feel I have been unfairly overcharged by phone companies operating in Florida under contract with the Florida Department of Corrections (D.O.C.), dating back to 1990. I feel that the D.O.C. and the phone companies have conspired to inflate the Collect phone rates in order to profit from the collect phone calls made by prisoners unfairly and improperly limit phone calls in order to cause more calls to be made.

I am also specifically requesting the reports, documents and investigative findings of the Commission concerning the kickback sceme employed by representatives of the D.O.C. that the Commission uncovered in 1994 or 1995. Top ranking officials of the D.O.C. were fired and demoted and the Commission ordered the phone companies

to pay a fine and reimburse Florida prisoners for being overcharged.

Also, kindly include a allowable rate schedule for phone companies in charging for collect phone calls. I believe to this day that prisoners are still being overcharged and the D.o.c. and the phone companies are still price fixing, monopolizing, and targeting for overcharging, inmates within the institutions operated by the D.O.C.

I don't believe it would be a docket. We asked Koch to send the letter to straighten up some discrepancies about regulatory assessment fees and about the correct company name for the MCD. We wanted Koch to specifically address the concerns raised by Nonnye Grant about the correct company name and contact person. Unfortunately, they only sent the information regarding the dissolution of Five Flags. Five Flags is dissolved; their assets are now owned by Koch, and Koch already has a Company Code in the MCD because they have other facilities in Florida that we review for safety purposes. Since the company is no longer in existence, there is no one to represent the company in a docket before the Commission. I really think this is just an administrative thing.
