BELLSOUTH CORPORATION'S RESPONSE AND OBJECTION TO THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION'S AUDIT DOCUMENT/RECORD REQUEST NOTICE OF INTENT AND MOTION FOR A TEMPORARY PROTECTIVE ORDER

BellSouth Corporation (BSC) pursuant to Rule 25-22.034, Florida Administrative Code and Rule 1.350, Florida Rules of Civil Procedure, files its Response to the Public Service Commission's Audit Document/Record Request Notice of Intent dated October 21, 1997 and, pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(5)(c), Florida Administrative Code, files its Motion for Temporary Protective Order and states:

1. Some of the documents that will be made available for review by the PSC contain proprietary, confidential business information that should not be publicly disclosed. Pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(5)(c), Florida Administrative Code, BSC moves the Prehearing Officer to issue a Temporary Protective Order exempting these documents from Section 119.07(1), Florida Statutes. These documents contain, among other things, nonregulated operations information, and other proprietary confidential business information. Such information is "proprietary confidential busines information" pursuant to Section 364.183(3)(f), Florida Statutes. If the Public Service Commission subsequently notifies BSC that any of the proprietary documents are to be used in a proceeding before the Commission, BSC will, in accordance with Rule 25-22.006. Florida Administrative Code, file a Motion for Protective Order specifically addressing each of the documents identified.

The Public Service Commission, through its record request, is attempting to obtain information in the possession, custody, or control of an entity that is neither a party to this docket nor regulated by the PSC. Requests for Production may only be directed to parties, and any attempt by the PSC to obtain discovery from non-parties should be prohibited. See 1.340, Florida Rules of Civil Procedure; Broward v. Kerr, 454 So.2d 1068 (4th D.C.A. 1984).
- 3. Subject to the response and Motion for Temporary Protective Order herein, documents to be made available will be produced for inspection and review at the office of undersigned counsel upon reasonable notice.
