Dear Mayor Burns:

I have received Resolutions 2006-98 and 2006-110 passed by the North Miami City Council. I will support both of these.

The Public Service Commission members will receive a copy of this letter.

The ability of Florida Power and Light (FPL) to insure that high voltage transmission lines above ground will not be downed by high winds is limited. It also does not have a good track record in the past years for making sure that power could be sustained in storms. I agree that the residents and businesses in North Miami will best be served by the placing the 138-kilowatt transmission lines underground.

The six-year trimming cycle would be a disaster if implemented. A six-year cycle would guarantee that above ground lines would come down in a storm. Too much growth would occur within the cycle. I agree that preventative measures are needed, but a six-year cycle would prevent nothing.

I understand that the provision of electric services must be provided at reasonable cost. However, the two measures brought forth in your resolutions seem to be dangerous and in the end will be more expensive.

Again, you have my support with regard to these resolutions.
