OBJECTIONS


COMES NOW, Florida Public Utilities Company ("FPUC") and files this Objection to Discovery served by the Office of Public Counsel ("OPC") in this docket and as basis says:

1. On March 17, 2009 and March 19, 2009, FPUC filed objections to discovery served by the Office of Public Counsel in this docket and requested entry of a protective order that discovery not be had at this time given the posture of this docket. FPUC also reserved the opportunity to submit specific objections should the discovery be allowed. There has been no ruling on the objections and request but FPUC would raise a specific objection to the discovery at this time rather than later in the event that the discovery is allowed.

2. Rule 1.340(a), Florida Rules of Civil Procedure, Interrogatories to Parties, limits the number of interrogatories to parties to 30. To date, the OPC has served 81 interrogatories and 30 requests for production of documents and FPUC would enter it objection to the number of interrogatories served by OPC.

3. Section 350.0611 (1), Florida Statutes, gives the Public Counsel the power to recommend by petition the commencement of any action or to appear in any action and "... utilize therein all forms of discovery available to attorneys in civil actions generally, subject to protective orders of the commission . . .". Should the Commission allow the OPC to conduct discovery, it is clear that they must do so subject to the limits contained in Rule 1.340(a).

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
