PEOPLES' RESPONSE TO STAFF DATA REQUEST

Peoples Gas System ("Peoples" or the "Company"), by its undersigned counsel, submits the following response to the Commission Staff's Data Request made by letter to undersigned counsel dated June 18, 2009:

1. In reference to Original Volume No. 3, First Revised Sheet No. 6.101-3 effective January 16, 2003, please provide the territory Docket No(s). and Order No(s). that granted the utility the Stuart area and unincorporated Martin County?

The Referenced Tariff Sheet

The referenced tariff sheet was approved as a result of Order No. PSC-03-0038-FOF-GU, issued January 6, 2003 in Docket No. 020384-GU (*In re: Petition for rate increase by Peoples Gas System*). See Attachment A. The sheet replaced Original Sheet No. 6.101-3, which had an effective date of June 9, 2000. See Attachment B. Original Sheet No. 6.101-3 also identified Stuart and Unincorporated Martin County as the areas served in Martin County.

Original Volume No. 3, of which the sheets mentioned above were a part, replaced Peoples' Original Volume No. 1, which was filed and approved following the merger of Peoples Gas System, Inc., into Tampa Electric Company, and Peoples' Original Volume No. 2, which was the tariff of West Florida Natural Gas Company, which was merged into Tampa Electric Company in 1997. First Revised Sheet No. 6.101-2 of Original Volume No. 1, with an effective date of April 1, 2000 (see

Attachment C), also identified Stuart (which was misspelled on the tariff sheet) and Unincorporated Martin County as the areas served in Martin County.

When Tampa Electric Company adopted, and reissued as Original Volume No. 1 in the name of Peoples as a division of Tampa Electric, the tariff of Peoples that was in effect at the time (as it was required to do by Rule 25-9.044, *Florida Administrative Code*), it made no changes in the tariff, which did not list in Section 6 areas in Martin County. However, the tariff did include Original Sheets Nos. 3.213 through 3.213-2, which included a map and description of the areas then served in Martin County. See Attachment D. The map and metes and bounds description on Attachment D, which were effective September 12, 1992, included Stuart and areas in unincorporated Martin County, including the Canopy Creek area where FPUC many years later installed its propane block system.¹ Original Sheets Nos. 3.213 through 3.213-2 were filed and approved pursuant to Order No. PSC-92-0924-FOF-GU in Docket No. 911150-GU (*In re: Application for a rate increase by Peoples Gas System, Inc.*). Peoples later abandoned the specific descriptions of territories in which it held itself out to provide natural gas service and instead included in Section 3 of its tariff a map of Florida depicting those areas generally. See Attachment E (Original Sheet No. 3.000, effective June 9, 2000, which is substantially the same as First Revised Sheet No. 3.000,

¹ If FPUC's propane operations were conducted by a separate entity, as opposed to being conducted by FPUC (*i.e.*, the utility) with the investment, revenues and expenses removed for regulated ratemaking purposes, there would be no question that no territorial dispute exists in this docket. That is, if the underground propane block system installed by FPUC in the Canopy Creek development had been installed by a non-regulated propane company (many of which operate in Florida), FPUC would not be able to make the assertions it is making in this docket. Despite the fact that FPUC conducts both natural gas and propane operations, those propane operations are not subject to the Commission's jurisdiction, and should not provide a "bootstrap" for FPUC's contentions in this docket, which are simply unsupported by the facts.

substantially the same as First Revised Sheet No. 3.000, effective April 23, 2001, and shows all of Martin County as Peoples' service territory).

Thus, Peoples has, through its tariff on file with the Commission, held itself out as providing natural gas service in Martin County since at least September 12, 1992.

"Grant" of Territory


None of the orders referenced above "granted" to Peoples the right to serve Stuart and unincorporated Martin County. A service area map and list of communities served is required to be a part of Peoples' natural gas tariff by Rules 25-9.007, 25-9.023 and 25-9.028, *Florida Administrative Code*.

The Commission does not "grant" natural gas or electric utilities the right to serve territories. The Commission does have statutory authority to "approve territorial agreements between and among natural gas utilities,"² and to "resolve . . . any territorial dispute involving service areas between and among natural gas utilities."³ Thus, only in the context of approving a territorial agreement or resolving a territorial dispute does the Commission "grant" to one utility the right to serve any particular area. The "grant" comes -- in the case of a territorial agreement -- via a contract between two or more utilities that is approved by the Commission. It comes -- in the case of the Commission's resolution of a territorial dispute between or among two or more utilities -- through an order resolving the dispute. In either case, the territorial agreement or the Commission's resolution of the dispute is binding only on the parties to the contract or the dispute.

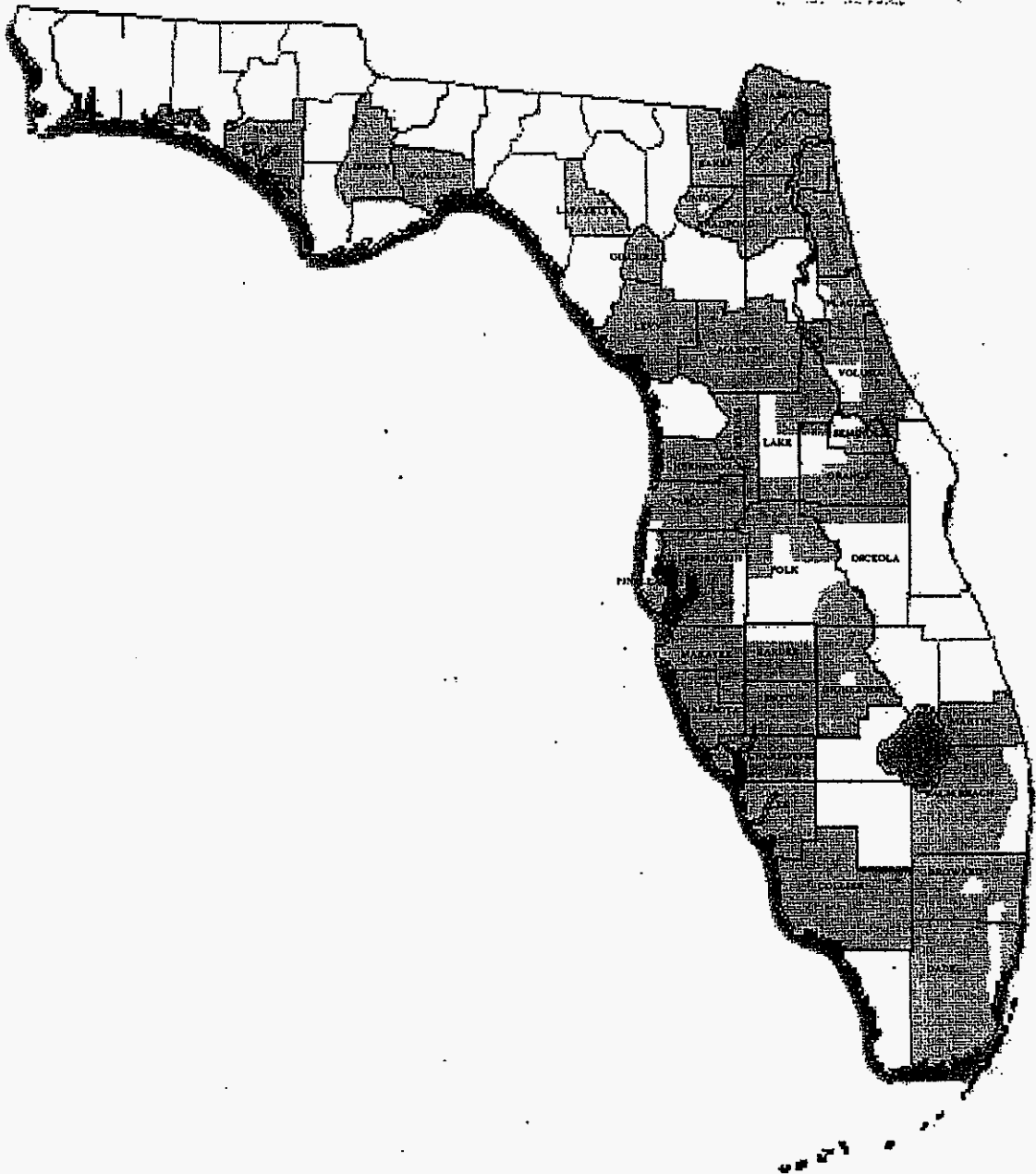
