The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your March 25, 2012, correspondence regarding Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the PSC. The PSC has authority in the telephone industry which is limited to the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. We appreciate the opportunity to assist you.

You expressed concerns about FPL's storm surcharge. The PSC conducted four customer service hearings from March 1, 2006, to March 3, 2006, in connection with Docket Number 060038-EI regarding FPL's petition for issuance of a storm recovery financing order related to the 2004 and 2005 storm seasons. The customer service hearings were held in Fort Myers, Fort Lauderdale, West Palm Beach, and Miami. During the course of the docket proceedings, the PSC also received customer comments by telephone, fax, mail, and email.

On May 16, 2006, the PSC approved a 12-year bond issue, the first approved under a law passed in 2005, to reimburse Florida Power & Light for hurricane losses incurred in 2004 and 2005. The PSC set FPL's recovery at \$708 million, which was a reduction on the requested amount of \$1.050 billion.

On May 22, 2007, the PSC announced the successful sale of \$652 million FPL storm recovery bonds. The bonds were purchased by Wachovia Capital Markets, LLC with an interest rate of 5.23 percent. The bonds are rated Aaa by Moody's, AAA by Standard & Poor's and AAA by Fitch Ratings.

The PSC authorized the securitization financing technique on May 15, 2006, and consistent with its statutory responsibility issued a comprehensive financing order detailing the terms of the bond issuance including a "lowest cost objective." The PSC included this provision to achieve the lowest storm recovery charges consistent with the law and the prevailing market conditions at the time of the offering and pricing of the bonds.

As required by the PSC's financing order, a Bond Team was established, comprised of representatives of FPL, the PSC, and both their designated advisors and legal counsel. The Bond Team took the following actions to protect FPL's customers and achieve a successful result:

- Received an assurance from FPL that the storm recovery bonds would price
 at least as well as the most recent and most favorable transactions in this
 asset class. Specifically, FPL's storm recovery bonds priced more favorably
 than both the 2006 American Electric Power securitization transaction in
 Texas and the 2007 Monongahela Power securitization transaction in West
 Virginia.
- Developed rating agency presentations and worked actively with the rating agencies to achieve Aaa and AAA ratings from the major rating agencies.
- Solicited a wide range of potential bidders to pursue competitive pricing for the bonds.
- Held group conference calls for potential bidders to describe the legislative, political and regulatory framework and the bond structure.

The bonds' scheduled maturity is August 1, 2019. The legal maturity is August 1, 2021. However, the bonds may be paid more swiftly. The PSC receives and reviews monthly progress reports from FPL on its bond repayment schedule.

You expressed a concern about FPL's petition to recover prudently incurred preconstruction costs associated with nuclear power plants. To encourage the development of nuclear power, the Florida Legislature enacted a law in 2006 to permit utilities to recover some nuclear plant project costs during the construction process. The PSC then adopted a rule on how to evaluate those costs annually. Annual PSC nuclear cost recovery hearings, held on August 10-19, 2011, allow Commissioners to hear testimony from the utilities, consumer groups, and the public on recovery of actual and estimated project costs.

On October, 24, 2011, to help secure a diversified and stable energy for Florida, the PSC approved cost recovery amounts for construction of planned nuclear generating plants and additions to existing nuclear plants for FPL. FPL's approved recovery includes costs associated with construction of its planned Turkey Point Units 6 and 7 and adding capacity to existing Turkey Point Units 3 and 4 and St. Lucie Units 1 and 2. Over the life of the generating units, the additional capacity projects are expected to save customers an estimated

\$155 million to \$1.5 billion. When completed, these projects will add approximately 2,614 MW of new nuclear base load generation to FPL's system, enough energy to power 1.4 million homes. I will add your comments to the correspondence side of Docket Nos. 110009-EI and 120009-EI and regarding FPL's petition for nuclear cost recovery

You also expressed a concern about FPL's petition for a rate increase. I will add your comments to the correspondence side of Docket No. 120015-EI regarding FPL's petition for an increase in its base rate.

Finally, you expressed a concern about smart meters, which are replacing traditional analog meters. Smart meters are similarly designed to record a customer's electricity consumption in order to accurately bill the customer. Smart meters, however, allow utilities to collect a customer's electricity consumption data remotely through radio frequency. FPSC rules ensure these meters are accurate and the Federal Communications Commission establishes standards for radio frequency.

Complaints serve as a valuable source of information; therefore, your complaint will remain on file with the PSC. We monitor complaints very closely and track any trends which indicate there may be a problem and further action is needed.



WHEREAS, in 2006, the Florida Legislature adopted Section 366.93, Florida Statutes, to allow electric utilities to charge customers in advance of operation for the costs of planning, lobbying for and constructing nuclear power plants (known as "Early Cost Recovery"); and

WHEREAS, the Early Cost Recovery statute allows a utility to impose and collect a charge, yet never complete the project, thus charging the rate payer for improvements and infrastructure that may never be provided; and

WHEREAS, Florida Power and Light ("FPL") has currently charged, collected from its customers and spent approximately \$268 million in Early Cost Recovery funds and is seeking approval from the Public Service Commission for an additional \$186 million in 2012 for new nuclear-related projects, including the construction of two additional nuclear reactors at Turkey Point in south Miami-Dade County, for which it never received approval for a license by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission; and

 WHEREAS, the additional funds requested by FPL may represent a dramatic increase in the customer's monthly utility bill at a time when consumers are struggling to pay current bills; and

WHEREAS, FPL executives have stated that nuclear reactors are too expensive to build, yet FPL continues to collect money from rate payers under Early Cost Recovery to finance other infrastructure projects listed under FPL's Nuclear Combined Operating License Application; and

WHEREAS, publicly traded utilities receiving money from rate payers under Early Cost Recovery are not obligated to pay back funds received if their nuclear generation projects are not completed; and

WHEREAS, publicly traded utilities receiving money from rate payers under Early Cost Recovery can and do use those moneys to lobby and litigate against the public to pursue projects the rate payers oppose; and

The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your correspondence regarding Progress Energy Florida, Incorporated (Progress Energy) to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the PSC. The PSC has limited authority in the telephone industry to include the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. You expressed a concern about nuclear cost recovery and requested closure of the Crystal River nuclear plant.

By Florida Statute and established Commission policy, electric utilities may recover certain expenses from customers through cost recovery charges adjusted annually by the PSC. Cost recovery is allowed on fuel and purchased power, capacity (including nuclear), conservation, and environmental requirements. Utilities may not, however, make a profit on fuel charges.

On November 22, 2011, the PSC approved Progress Energy's petition to recover replacement power costs for its Crystal River 3 (CR3) nuclear plant outage, subject to refund, and the PSC also approved environmental recovery costs for the utility's self-generated replacement power resulting from the extended outage.

At a hearing in early November, the PSC deferred a decision on Progress Energy's 2012 cost recovery amounts to allow time for all parties to file comments on the utility's CR3 replacement fuel costs. A separate hearing is scheduled for June 11, 2012 to determine whether Progress Energy's decisions on, or associated with, the CR3 steam generator repairs leading up to the October 2, 2009 delamination and resulting outage were reasonable and prudent.

On July 28, 2008, Progress Energy Florida, Inc. (PEF), tendered a combined license (COL) application for two AP1000 advanced passive pressurized water reactors to be located in Levy County, Florida. The reactors are to be identified as Levy Nuclear Plant (LNP) Units 1 and 2. The application is currently under review by the NRC staff.

In that July 28, 2008, letter, PEF stated that it was submitting the COL application pursuant to the requirements of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Part 52, "Licenses, Certifications, and Approvals for Nuclear Power Plants," Subpart C, "Combined Licenses," and requesting the associated materials licenses under 10 CFR Parts 30, 40, and 70. In addition, PEF stated that the COL application incorporates by reference Appendix D to 10 CFR Part 52 and the Westinghouse Electric Corporation's (Westinghouse's) application for amendment to portions of the Design Control Document (DCD) Revision 16 (submitted May 26, 2007), including Westinghouse Technical Report APP-GW-GLR-134, Revision 1, "AP1000 DCD Impacts to Support COLA Standardization" (submitted December 12, 2007). Since the initial submission of the COL application, PEF has updated it to reference Revision 19 of the AP1000 DCD amendment application.

In accordance with the requirements found in 10 CFR 50.43(a)(1), the staff is providing this written notification to you because the staff has determined that your agency may have jurisdiction over the rates and services that are incident to the possible licensing by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission of LNP Units 1 and 2.

The application is also available via the Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Public Electronic Reading Room on the Internet at http://www.nrc.gov/reading-rm/adams.html. The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your E-mail regarding Progress Energy Florida, Incorporated (Progress Energy) to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those countles which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the PSC. The PSC has limited authority in the telephone industry to include the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. You expressed a concern about Progress Energy's fuel cost.

By Florida Statute and established Commission policy, electric utilities may recover certain expenses from customers through cost recovery charges adjusted annually by the PSC. Cost recovery is allowed on fuel and purchased power, capacity (including nuclear), conservation, and environmental requirements. Utilities may not, however, make a profit on fuel charges.

On November 22, 2011, the PSC approved Progress Energy's petition to recover replacement power costs for its Crystal River 3 (CR3) nuclear plant outage, subject to refund, and the PSC also approved environmental recovery costs for the utility's self-generated replacement power resulting from the extended outage.

At a hearing in early November, the PSC deferred a decision on Progress Energy's 2012 cost recovery amounts to allow time for all parties to file comments on the utility's CR3 replacement fuel costs. A separate hearing is scheduled for June 11, 2012 to determine whether Progress Energy's decisions on, or associated with, the CR3 steam generator repairs leading up to the October 2, 2009 delamination and resulting outage were

reasonable and prudent.

Starting in January 2012, monthly bill charges for Progress Energy's residential customers using 1,000 kilowatt hours will increase from \$119.34 to \$123.19, a change of \$3.85.

We appreciate your comments regarding the petition and will add your correspondence to Docket Nos. 110001-EI, 110009-EI, and 100437-EI.

You also expressed a concern about the customer charge. The costs associated with the customer charge can be classified as either customer accounting costs or fixed operating expenses incurred in providing certain transmission and distribution facilities. For instance, meter reading and customer billing are done monthly regardless of the customer's kilowatthour consumption level. As a result, Progress Energy bills the usage separately, as this amount may fluctuate each month. Other expenses included are depreciation on certain utility installed equipment such as meters, distribution lines from the pole to the customer's premises, line transformers, and other expenses incurred in the maintenance and operation of these items.

Progress Energy's tariff, 6.120, allows the company to bill a monthly customer charge of \$8.76 to your residential account. You may review the company's tariff by using the following link:

Rule 25-6.100, Florida Administrative Code, requires electric utilities to bill the customer charge separately from the energy charge. I have also enclosed a copy of the rule for your review.

This is in response to your inquiry with the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) regarding Florida Power & Light Company (FPL). You expressed a concern with recovery charges on your monthly electric bill.

On November 2, 2011, the PSC set recovery charges beginning in January 2012 for FPL. By Florida Statute and established PSC policy, electric utilities may recover certain expenses from customers through cost recovery charges adjusted annually by the PSC. Cost recovery is allowed on fuel and purchased power, capacity (including nuclear), conservation, and environmental requirements. Utilities may not, however, make a profit on fuel charges.

The majority of the charges approved by the PSC are related to fuel and are included in the fuel charge on a customer's monthly electric bill. All other approved charges are included in the energy charge, which also includes the utilities' base rate charge.

Starting in January 2012, a monthly electric bill for a FPL residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours (kWh) will increase from \$96.54 to \$99.04, a difference of \$2.50. The recovery amounts included in a residential bill using 1,000 kWh will include fuel and purchased power charges of \$37.96, capacity charges of \$9.69, including nuclear, conservation charges of \$2.87; environmental charges of \$1.92, and Gross Receipts Tax of \$2.48.

Progress Energy customers moved a step closer to having to pay \$140 million next year for electricity the utility purchases while its broken Crystal River nuclear plant sits offline.

The state Public Service Commission's staff recommended this week that Progress customers keep paying instead of waiting to see whether the utility should shoulder the financial responsibility for the costs caused by a troubled repair project.

Those extra costs are a part of the reason the average Progress customer's bill is expected to increase about 3 percent to \$123.19 for 1,000 kilowatt hours of usage, starting Jan. 1.

The five-member Public Service Commission is expected to vote on the staff recommendation during its meeting Nov. 22.

The state Office of Public Counsel and several other groups advocating for consumers — including the Florida Retail Federation — oppose having customers pay the \$140 million now. They say the commission first should determine whether Progress mishandled a maintenance and upgrade project at the nuclear plant that led to the expenses.

The project was supposed to years and won't return to service

cost \$230 million to replace old steam generators. But the concrete nuclear reactor containment building cracked after Progress Energy made the unprecedented decision to manage the project itself, instead of hiring an outside specialist. When the utility tried to repair the building and bring the plant back online, the wall cracked again.

The reactor has sat idle for two years and won't return to service for at least two more. And the repair bill and related costs are expected to exceed \$2.5 billion, with Progress asking customers to pick up a quarter of those costs, including the \$140 million recommended by the PSC staff for next year.

The PSC will review Progress' handling of the Crystal River project during a hearing in June.



Good day Commissioners:

During October 2011, the area of Altamonte Springs in which I live, experienced four electric power outages. The events happened in good weather, day and night.

When the lights go out, I always put a phone call to Progress Energy as I have come to realize, from Progress Energy employees, they do not know when power goes out in a community of about 330 homes.

The most recent outage of about 90 minutes on October 27 had me waiting on the line for about 25 minutes before the complaint call was accepted. This area was NOT in an emergency weather condition. Three were rollouts that stopped power flow necessitating consumers adjusting electrical equipment accordingly. (October 9, 17, 27 at 4 am).

We were advised one of the reason for outages are squirrels eat wire coverings and, of course, are electrocuted. If Progress Energy cannot manage this natural problem, how can they possibly handle the complexities of nuclear power generators?

Yet with this poor quality of providing electric power, our electric power bills continue to be increased and will continue to do so if we are forced to pay for constructing and making operational safe nuclear power stations.

Power companies using investor money for constructing new power sources are obligated to protect investors' investment and provide a reasonable return on investment. However, investors do not want to make their money available on such a highly questionable pursuit.

Consumers are legally promised nothing, no accountability or transparency, no nuclear power.

The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your E-mail regarding Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the PSC. The PSC has limited authority in the telephone industry to include the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. You expressed a concern about FPL's petition to recover prudently incurred preconstruction costs associated with nuclear power plants.

To encourage the development of nuclear power, the Florida Legislature enacted a law in 2006 to permit utilities to recover some nuclear plant project costs during the construction process. The PSC then adopted a rule on how to evaluate those costs annually. Annual PSC nuclear cost recovery hearings, held this year on August 10-19, allow Commissioners to hear testimony from the utilities, consumer groups, and the public on recovery of actual and estimated project costs.

On October, 24, 2011, to help secure a diversified and stable energy for Florida, the PSC approved cost recovery amounts for construction of planned nuclear generating plants and additions to existing nuclear plants for FPL. FPL's approved recovery includes costs associated with construction of its planned Turkey Point Units 6 and 7 and adding capacity to existing Turkey Point Units 3 and 4 and St. Lucie Units 1 and 2. Over the life of the generating units, the additional capacity projects are expected to save customers an estimated \$155 million to \$1.5 billion. When completed, these projects will add approximately 2,614 MW of new nuclear base load generation to FPL's system, enough energy to power 1.4 million homes.

The estimated 2012 nuclear cost recovery is about \$2.20 per month for the first 1,000 kilowatt hours (kwh) for FPL customers. The approved amount for FPL customer bills will be recovered through the fuel and capacity cost recovery charge on customer bills beginning

next year.

I will add your comments to the correspondence side of Docket No. 110009-El.

You also expressed a concern about about FPL's storm surcharge. The PSC conducted four customer service hearings from March 1, 2006, to March 3, 2006, in connection with Docket Number 060038-EI regarding FPL's petition for issuance of a storm recovery financing order related to the 2004 and 2005 storm seasons. The customer service hearings were held in Fort Myers, Fort Lauderdale, West Palm Beach, and Miami. During the course of the docket proceedings, the PSC also received customer comments by telephone, fax, mail, and email.

On May 16, 2006, the PSC approved a 12-year bond issue, the first approved under a law passed in 2005, to reimburse Florida Power & Light for hurricane losses incurred in 2004 and 2005. The PSC set FPL's recovery at \$708 million, which was a reduction on the requested amount of \$1.050 billion.

On May 22, 2007, the PSC announced the successful sale of \$652 million FPL storm recovery bonds. As a direct result of the bond issuance, FPL reduced the monthly storm cost recovery surcharge each residential customer pays from \$1.65 to \$1.02 per 1000 kilowatt hours. The effective interest rate is 5.23 percent. The interest is remitted to the bond holders. The bonds were purchased by Wachovia Capital Markets, LLC with an interest rate of 5.23 percent. The bonds are rated Aaa by Moody's, AAA by Standard & Poor's and AAA by Fitch Ratings.

The PSC authorized the securitization financing technique on May 15, 2006, and consistent with its statutory responsibility issued a comprehensive financing order detailing the terms of the bond issuance including a "lowest cost objective." The PSC included this provision to achieve the lowest storm recovery charges consistent with the law and the prevailing market conditions at the time of the offering and pricing of the bonds.

As required by the PSC's financing order, a Bond Team was established, comprised of representatives of FPL, the PSC, and both their designated advisors and legal counsel. The Bond Team took the following actions to protect FPL's customers and achieve a successful result:

• Received an assurance from FPL that the storm recovery bonds would price at least as well as the most recent and most favorable transactions in this asset class. Specifically, FPL's storm recovery bonds priced more favorably than both the 2006 American Electric Power securitization transaction in Texas and the 2007 Monongahela Power securitization

transaction in West Virginia.

- Developed rating agency presentations and worked actively with the rating agencies to achieve Aaa and AAA ratings from the major rating agencies.
- Solicited a wide range of potential bidders to pursue competitive pricing for the bonds.
- Held group conference calls for potential bidders to describe the legislative, political and regulatory framework and the bond structure.

The bonds' scheduled maturity is August 1, 2019. The legal maturity is August 1, 2021. However, the bonds may be paid more swiftly. The PSC receives and reviews monthly progress reports from FPL on its bond repayment schedule.

Complaints serve as a valuable source of information; therefore, your complaint will remain on file with the PSC. We monitor complaints very closely and track any trends which indicate there may be a problem and further action is needed.

On October, 24, 2011, to help secure a diversified and stable energy for Florida, the PSC approved cost recovery amounts for construction of planned nuclear generating plants and additions to existing nuclear plants. PEF's approved recovery includes cost associated with construction of its proposed nuclear power plants, Levy Units 1 and 2, and adding capacity to its existing nuclear generating plant at Crystal River. When completed, these projects will add approximately 2,380 megawatts (MW) of new nuclear base load generation to PEF's system, enough energy to power 1.3 million homes.

Estimated 2012 nuclear cost recovery is about \$2.93 per month for the first 1,000 kilowatt hours (kwh) for PEF customers. The approved amount for PEF customer bills will be recovered through the fuel and capacity cost recovery charge on customer bills beginning next year.





Gentlemen:

My client, the AP1000 Oversight Group consists of state, regional and national nonprofit organizations concerned about the safety and reliability of the Westinghouse-Toshiba AP1000 reactor design and operating procedures. Utilities in each of your states have proposed to use this design. I am writing to you to point out a potentially serious design flaw with the reactor and urge you to investigate its cost impacts on your state's ratepayers.

The AP1000 Oversight Group has submitted several sets of comments on the rulemaking certification for the AP1000 reactors before the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Docket NRC-2010-0131, pointing out safety issues as soon as we discover them. The attached supplemental comments describe a newly disclosed design flaw in which the larger AP1000 design is being "shoehorned" into the smaller AP600 design. This could have a significant impact on the safety and reliability of the reactor. Outages could be prolonged as even routine maintenance could necessitate major structural changes, even to the point of removing walls and buildings. Any upfront cost savings in using the AP600-designed turbine building could be overwhelmed by the continuing costs of maintaining and operating the reactor. These high costs of maintenance and operation could be forced on ratepayers after the building was constructed.

The "shoehorn" issue is just another unresolved problem with the design that may lead to extended delays in the certification process. In an October 3, 2011 letter to Westinghouse-Toshiba, the NRC stated that Westinghouse-Toshiba has "failed to effectively demonstrate the ability of the shield building to withstand an aircraft impact." This issue has been unresolved for years and cannot be resolved by pushing it into the operating license stage without entailing potentially significant costs and redesign, and again, causing ratepayers to bear the financial burden.

Several other unresolved issues stem from the Fukushima disaster, and lessons learned about containment pressure, loss of ultimate heat sinks, the inability of the so-called passive system to operate if debris is present and the dangers of the densely-packed spent fuel rods in the AP1000 design will potentially lead to other major costly delays and redesigns.

The commissions in the Southeast need to take extreme caution before arbitrarily accepting the AP1000 reactors without full cost analysis. The ratepayers need to be protected from the impacts of uncontrolled costs over the lifetime of the proposed AP1000 reactors.

SUPPLEMENTAL COMMENTS BY THE AP1000 OVERSIGHT GROUP ET AL. (NEWLY DISCLOSED DESIGN FLAW)

NOW COME the AP1000 Oversight Group, the North Carolina Waste Awareness and Reduction Network (NC WARN) and Friends of the Earth (collectively the "Oversight Group") with supplemental comments on the certification of the AP1000 reactor design and operating procedures, Docket NRC-2010-0131, relating to a newly disclosed design flaw.

In its Memorandum and Order, CLI-11-05, September 9, 2011, the Commission addressed the Oversight Group's concerns by referring its comments and petitions to the Staff to be resolved in the Rulemaking Docket, NRC-2010-0131. In its Order the Commission ruled that

[we] Refer to the NRC Staff those elements of the Petition that relate specifically to design certification, for consideration as rulemaking comments. Refer to the NRC Staff for resolution as comment sin the AP1000 rulemaking proceeding, all additional filings relevant to the AP1000 rulemaking proceeding.

The Oversight Group has diligently submitted comments into the rulemaking record as issues affecting the safety and reliability of the AP1000 reactors come to our attention.

NEWLY DISCLOSED DESIGN FLAW

According to newly disclosed information provided to the Oversight Group by a nuclear industry insider, Westinghouse-Toshiba and the NRC have failed to identify a design flaw in the AP1000's turbine building. The information that was received indicated a major structural flaw in the turbine building at the proposed Plant Vogtle reactors, although this flaw relates more broadly to the AP1000 design and its possible certification. The Oversight Group retained Fairewinds Associates and its chief engineer, Arnie Gundersen, to review this new information and these comments reflect his review.

According to the nuclear industry insider, Westinghouse-Toshiba will attempt to install critical safety and generating equipment into the smaller turbine building designed for the AP600, i.e., the AP1000 equipment will be "shoehorned" into the smaller AP600 building. Because the equipment cannot safely fit into the AP600 building, the current AP1000 design ignores safety concerns by limiting access to critical equipment. The reactor designers are allegedly being forced to relocate many essential pieces of equipment into side buildings and add-on buildings not feasible for long-term operations or reliability.

Although the NRC certified the AP600 design, Westinghouse-Toshiba was reportedly unable to sell this smaller-sized reactor to the utility industry, and thus reapplied to the NRC for the scaled up AP1000. In its rush to be eligible for federal subsidies and loan guarantees and in order to lower initial construction costs, Plant Vogtle's turbine building, as well as other proposed reactors utilizing the AP1000 design, was not designed for the expanded AP1000 reactor, and instead Westinghouse-Toshiba has allegedly attempted, albeit unsuccessfully, to shoehorn its equipment into the much smaller AP600 design. According to Mr. Gundersen, the shoehorn design may significantly increase maintenance and repair costs that will be borne by ratepayers of the utilities who wish to use the AP1000 reactors.

According to Mr. Gundersen, the restricted equipment access congruent with the AP1000 redesign would restrict crucial access to the condenser, turbine, and feedwater heater that were integral components of the AP600 design. The shoehorned AP1000 design will limit access to essential equipment, increase operating downtime and outages, and lead to increased ratepayer costs because the shoehorned AP1000 design will make condenser retubing, turbine overhauls, and feedwater heater replacements/repairs impossible without disassembling entire buildings.

Moreover, in addition to higher operating costs and downtime borne by Plant Vogtle's ratepayers, the AP1000 Oversight Group believes shoehorning large AP1000 equipment into the smaller AP600 blueprint would create three unreviewed safety problems the NRC must evaluate:

- 1. Limited access and cramped equipment may affect the reliability of a nuclear power plant as unreliable systems negatively impact operations by causing frequent breakdowns and burdening safety systems. Frequent plant shutdowns for unanticipated problems challenge reactor safety systems and thus the AP1000 may potentially have its safety systems challenged much more frequently due to the shoehorn design.
- Shoehorning the larger AP1000 turbine in the smaller AP600 turbine building has the potential for unanalyzed turbine missiles to damage essential safety-related equipment.
- 3. The auxiliary feedwater system is a nuclear plant's first line of defense to cool the steam generators when it shuts down. With significant portions of the AP1000 auxiliary feedwater system located in the undersized AP600 turbine building the AP1000's auxiliary feedwater system will be challenged to operate as intended.

Finally, in order to conduct a thorough technical analysis of what it believes to be unreviewed and significant safety concerns, the Oversight Group and its consulting engineer attempted to review and analyze building drawings in the AP1000 Design Certification Document Revision 19, Volume 2, Chapter 1, Section 1.2.8 et al., but much

of the detailed descriptions of the turbine building were not available for engineering review because they were marked "Security-Related Information, Withhold Under 10 CFR 2.390d." It is therefore up to the Commission, NRC Staff and Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards to fully investigate these potentially serious safety concerns and promptly determine if the AP1000 is shoehorned into the AP600.

CONCLUSION

Until the safety issues associated with the impact of the shoehorned AP1000 design are addressed prior to the delivery of the "rulemaking package" by the NRC Staff to the Commission for consideration of certification of the AP1000 reactor design and operating procedures, the Oversight Group requests that approval of the AP1000 design be suspended. As part of this request and prior to any consideration of certification of the AP1000 reactor, all other features of the AP1000 which have been upscaled from the AP600 design should be reviewed in order to guarantee that proper and validated calculations have been made when basing AP1000 design features on the AP600 model. Lastly, the NRC Staff should immediately apprize the public if the serious safety issue we have raised is accurate and if it is, we recommend that an investigation be conducted to determine how any flawed turbine building design could have been overlooked by Westinghouse-Toshiba or the NRC staff during the AP1000 review process.

RESOLUTION NO. 2011-2

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE MIAMI-DADE COUNTY LEAGUE OF CITIES, INC. URGING THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO DENY APPROVAL OF ANY FURTHER "EARLY COST RECOVERY" AND URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO REPEAL THE "EARLY COST RECOVERY" STATUTE RELATING TO ELECTRIC UTILITY CHARGES FOR SITING, DESIGN, LICENSING, AND CONSTRUCTION OF NUCLEAR PLANTS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, F.S. 366.93, known as "Early Cost Recovery," was adopted by The Florida Legislature in 2006 and provides that utilities may charge customers in advance of operation for the costs of planning, lobbying for, and constructing nuclear power plants; and

WHEREAS, the Early Cost Recovery statute provides that the utility may impose and collect the charge but never actually complete the project, thus charging the rate payer for improvements and infrastructure they will never actually provide to customers, and

WHEREAS, FPL has currently charged, collected from its customers and spent \$268 million in Early Cost Recovery funds and is seeking approval from the Public Service Commission for an additional \$186 million in 2012 new nuclear-related projects including the construction of two additional nuclear reactors at Turkey Point in South Miami-Dade, but which have never received approval for a license by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, and

WHEREAS, the additional funds requested by FPL may represent a dramatic increase in the customer's monthly bill at a time when consumers are struggling to pay current bills; and

WHEREAS, FPL executives have stated that nuclear reactors are too expensive to build, yet FPL continues to collect money from the ratepayers under "Early Cost Recovery" to finance other infrastructure projects listed under their nuclear Combined Operating License Application; and

TOTAL PROPERTY

WHEREAS, publicly traded utilities receiving money from ratepayers under "Early Cost Recovery" are not obliged to pay back those funds if their nuclear generation projects are not completed; and

WHEREAS, publicly traded utilities receiving money from ratepayers under "Early Cost Recovery" can and do use those moneys to lobby and litigate against the public to pursue projects the ratepayers oppose; and

WHEREAS, improvements in domestic energy efficiency are the best energy investments available, are carbon-free, safe, and can provide more jobs to Floridians than any other investment, but "Early Cost Recovery" monies are not permissible for such investments; and

Miami, Oct. 16 —Headline: 'Fukushima disaster can happen here' Today's Miami Herald has an article warning South Florida residents they "should take little comfort in assurances that a Fukushima-type catastrophe could not happen here." It notes that the Miami-area nuclear power plant, Turkey Point, "is just as reliant as Fukushima on offsite electricity, emergency electrical generators and batteries."

Yet, Florida Power & Light (FPL) is trying to build two new reactors at the site, making a total of four.

These two proposed reactors, the AP1000 design, are essentially "experimental" and "have never been tested or operated commercially at full scale".

The reactor design has "drawn substantial criticism on safety issues". The article reviews three of these:

- 1) "One major issue is that the steel inner-containment structure is barely strong enough to keep radioactivity from escaping during a 'design basis accident.' This leaves little margin for error when the steel containment structure eventually corrodes and loses strength. Such corrosion is a common problem in older reactors."
- 2) "The British Nuclear Installations Inspectorate has criticized Toshiba/Westinghouse for not sufficiently demonstrating that the outer concrete shield can withstand an external shock, such as an earthquake, hurricane, tornado or impact from a commercial aircraft crash."
- 3) "Perhaps, the most damaging criticism comes from Dr. John Ma, the lead structural reviewer evaluating the outer concrete shield for the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC). Dr. Ma submitted a 'nonconcurrence statement of dissent' stating that the outer shield could shatter like a 'glass cup' in an earthquake or commercial aircraft crash.

Despite these concerns and others, the NRC is rushing to certify this new nuclear reactor design. The American public cannot be confident that the AP1000 will not fail, exactly as these experts predict it could.

To ensure public safety, President Obama should not continue to tacitly approve this flawed certification process. To impose financial discipline, he needs to publicly stop all future loan guarantees for the AP1000 until the designs are thoroughly vetted for safety and all valid criticisms have been addressed.

The cost of building FPL's new nuclear reactors is likely to be astronomical. Guesstimates for the total price tag now range from \$12 billion up to \$25 billion. As a monopoly regulated by the Florida Public Service Commission, FPL's allowed return on equity is 11 percent of the utility's \$17.5

billion adjusted rate base. Thus, if the new Turkey Point reactors cost an additional \$17.5 billion, a large portion of FPL customers' electric bills could double.

At a time when governments, businesses and families are struggling to reduce their debts, it is irresponsible to ask American taxpayers to provide billions of dollars in federal loan guarantees for unsafe nuclear power plants — plants that private investors will not fund because they are just too risky.

As the U.S. economy teeters on the brink of a second recession, President Obama needs to realize how out of step the nuclear loan guarantee has become. We need to do better.

Another Insider Raises Concerns about Westinghouse Nuclear Design

Alleged flaws in turbine building design could cost customers dearly and compromise safety, groups say in legal filing with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and state utility commissions

Durham, NC – Another insider has signaled concerns about corners being cut with Westinghouse's new nuclear plant design that could compromise safety, lead to construction delays and cause expensive outages if new plants ever become operational. Public interest groups NC WARN and Friends of the Earth today called on the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to confirm whether major structural changes were properly made to the turbine building when the AP1000 was being scaled up from an earlier and smaller Westinghouse plant design.

The allegations follow two sets of extended delays for AP1000 projects revealed last week.

Today, the groups requested that NRC suspend its review of the AP1000 pending open resolution of multiple problems including the new allegations. Construction and operating licenses for the AP1000 are being sought by Georgia Power, South Carolina Electric and Gas (SCE&G) and three other southeastern utilities. Licensing is contingent upon "certification" of the AP1000 design, and because Georgia Power and SCE&G are already performing extensive pre-licensing construction, the NRC is under great pressure to finalize the design approval despite continuing exposure of design problems.

Today's legal motion cites an industry insider who passed along concerns due to the "wake up call" posed by the Fukushima disaster. The insider, who must remain anonymous, alleges that in order to lower construction costs, Westinghouse intends to cram critical safety and generating equipment into a building that had been designed for the smaller AP600 plant design.

The insider said the turbine building was designed for the AP600 plant and carried forward, without proper scaling, for the AP1000, and that the larger turbine and related equipment simply won't fit in the building. Allegedly, at Georgia Power's Vogtle project, engineers already must redesign the turbine building to relocate equipment into add-on buildings, a problem for which budgeting and licensing implications have not been publicized by either the NRC or Georgia Power.

The allegations cannot be confirmed because Westinghouse claims the related documents are security sensitive, but the watchdog groups believe the source is reliable. They retained nuclear engineer Arnie Gundersen of Fairewinds Associates to review the new information. If the charges are true, Gundersen says, the shoehorned AP1000 design ignores safety concerns involving access to critical equipment, and could significantly increase repair costs that will later be borne by ratepayers.

"If true, it's as if Westinghouse tried to fit a spare tire from an 18-wheeler into the trunk of a Volkswagen," said Gundersen today, "and the Westinghouse's cost-cutting approach will have backfired because additional buildings must now be constructed to house overflowing equipment." He said worker access to essential equipment could be restricted, which could increase operating down-time and future costs to ratepayers for maintenance of equipment such as turbines, condensers, and feedwater components.

MONTHS OF DELAY ALREADY CERTAIN: The new allegations follow last week's revelations, reported by Reuters, that final design of the AP1000 has been delayed at least three months due to changes that could stem from the Fukushima disaster. The NRC staff had stated in an August 2011 letter that full documentation on the AP1000 would be turned over to NRC commissioners by October 5 for a "certification" vote. That deadline was missed and no new schedule has been established.

Even more problematic is an October 3 NRC "notice of violation" found last week by Friends of the Earth. In it, the NRC said Westinghouse has "failed to effectively demonstrate the ability of the shield building to withstand an aircraft impact." The company has 30 days to respond, but because it has been haggling with NRC staff over the problem for more than a year, design certification is no longer certain, the watchdogs say.

The insider who passed along the turbine building allegations said the Fukushima disaster was a reminder that severe accidents can happen here, so known problems must be corrected. A number of outside industry experts and insiders from both Westinghouse and the NRC have, over the past year, voiced concerns regarding serious design flaws uncovered with the AP1000 design.

Engineer Gundersen explained that the auxiliary feedwater system is a nuclear plant's first line of defense to cool the steam generators when a plant shuts down, and that if significant portions of the system are within an undersized building, safety systems would be challenged to operate as intended.

"These safety concerns must be thoroughly and openly analyzed by the NRC," said Gundersen.

The groups also intend to alert utility regulators and Georgia and South Carolina about the latest design problem because, if true, it will likely impact construction schedules and costs to ratepayers.

NC WARN's Jim Warren said today, "The industry's attempt to push past numerous design flaws creates

immeasurable risk to public safety and public dollars. It looks like the Vogtle project is already suffering serious cost overruns. The NRC must openly resolve all design flaws now — not relegate them to the 'cost plus' mindset that's inevitable after construction officially begins."

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Trying to build nuclear plants is making climate change worse – by squandering many years and billions of dollars instead of ramping up energy efficiency and safe, clean generation.



At approximately 10:05 a.m. today I attempted to confirm that your recommendation is that the state legislature consider \$337,000,000 utilities rate increases, of which \$196.1 million to Florida Power and Light for St. Lucie and Miami-Dade nuclear plants will cost clients \$2.00 for billing at 1000 KWH; and \$140.9 million for Progress Energy toward two new nuclear reactor plants in Levy County to add \$4.68 per monthly billing for the 1,000 KWH rate. This action toward legislative consideration is a red flag to consumers.

In calling for information and confirmation, I could as well have asked a chipmunk with receptionist training. Time to ask a question completely, time to make note of information I received at staccato rate, time to grasp fully what was being asked of her, any perception that she is paid to serve the public: none. I got the staccato re-hash of legislative authority to grant rate increases, and an adequate response describing the machinations to get information from the internet to answer my question.

Not only do I firmly object to the proposed rate increases and to the staff member I encountered: I think you should resign in protest of accommodating this fiscal extraction that the legislature will duly consider as your acquiescence. Corporations able to issue bonds when interest rates are at a historic low flout corporate ethics and human decency in asking Florida citizens to pay for private enterprise, for-profit projects. Legislative approval of such utility rate increases is outrageous provision of corporate funding by extracting money from clients for a necessary service. Approve their bond issues!

Because the information I tried to confirm with the commission was undoubtedly a press release which the electronic newsletter quoted, I am incensed that the commission staff cannot confirm accuracy of public information. Checking a press release should be within the skills of a trained chipmunk.



RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE BISCAYNE PARK, FLORIDA, URGING THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO DENY APPROVAL OF ANY FURTHER "EARLY COST RECOVERY" AND URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO REPEAL THE "EARLY COST RECOVERY" STATUTE RELATING TO ELECTRIC UTILITY CHARGES FOR THE SITING. WHEREAS, F.S. 366.93, known as "Early Cost Recovery," was adopted by The Florida Legislature in 2006 and provides that utilities may charge customers in advance of operation for the costs of planning, lobbying for, and constructing nuclear power plants; and

WHEREAS, the Early Cost Recovery statute provides that the utility may impose and collect the charge but never actually complete the project, thus charging the rate payer for improvements and infrastructure they will never actually provide to customers; and

WHEREAS, FPL has currently charged, collected from its customers and spent \$268 million in Early Cost Recovery funds and is seeking approval from the Public Service Commission for an additional \$186 million in 2012 new nuclear-related projects including the construction of two additional nuclear reactors at Turkey Point in South Miami-Dade, but which have never received approval for a license by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission; and

WHEREAS, the additional funds requested by FPL may represent a dramatic increase in the customer's monthly bill at a time when consumers are struggling to pay current bills; and

WHEREAS, FPL executives have stated that nuclear reactors are too expensive to build, yet FPL continues to collect money from the rate-payers under "Early Cost Recovery" to finance other infrastructure projects listed under their nuclear Combined Operating License Application; and

WHEREAS, publicly traded utilities receiving money from ratepayers under "Early Cost Recovery" are not obliged to pay back those funds if their nuclear generation projects are not completed; and

WHEREAS, publicly traded utilities receiving money from ratepayers under "Early Cost Recovery" can and do use those moneys to lobby and litigate against the public to pursue projects the rate payers oppose; and

WHEREAS, improvements in domestic energy efficiency are the best energy investments available, are carbon-free, safe, and can provide more jobs to Floridians than any other energy investment, but "Early Cost Recovery" monies are not permissible for such investments; and



This is in response to your inquiry with the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) regarding Progress Energy Florida, Incorporated (Progress Energy). You expressed a concern about Progress Energy's petition to recover prudently incurred preconstruction costs associated with nuclear power plants.

Florida Statute 366.93 indicates that after a petition for determination of need is granted, a utility may petition the commission for cost recovery for the siting, design, licensing, and construction of nuclear and integrated gasification combined cycle power plants.

In compliance with the Florida Statute the PSC enacted a rule in February 2007 that adheres to the statute. Rule 25-6.0423, Florida Administrative Code, allows investor-owned utilities to recover costs for nuclear and coal gasification plants. Upon PSC approval of a utility's need for a nuclear plant upgrade or new plant construction, the utility can petition for cost recovery.

Progress Energy's approved cost recovery includes costs associated with the uprate of its existing nuclear generating plant at Crystal River, and the construction of its proposed nuclear power plants, Levy Units 1 and 2. These completed projects will add 2,380 MWs of new nuclear base load generation to Progress Energy's system, enough energy to power 1.3 million homes.

The next hearing in which the PSC will decide the nuclear cost recovery for Progress Energy will begin on October 24, 2011. You may use the following link to view and listen to the hearings:



I am writing to protest the rate increase requested by Progress Energy/Florida Power and Light which is currently before the Commission, on Reference Docket 110009.

In prior years, the Commission has granted two rate increases to Progress Energy/Florida Power and Light to be taken from electricity customers in anticipation of construction of modified nuclear facilities at Turkey Point and two new reactors in Levy County.

As you well know, cost estimates for this type of construction are rising annually. In light of the ongoing events at Fukushima, the issues of public safety are truly grave. The cost of constructing nuclear power facilities will continue to rise dramatically--if such facilities are permitted to be constructed at all. In other words, we may anticipate that in future, nuclear power will not be profitable.

The timeline for the construction of the Levy County reactors has been pushed back twice already, which has increased the projected overall cost of construction. In June of 2010, the President of Florida Power and Light met with the Orlando Sun Sentinel editorial board and admitted that FPL may never build these new reactors due to licensing, economic, design and/or safety issues.

I am definitely opposed to the rate increase and ask that the request not be approved.

Should the Commission decide to grant this increase despite opposition by the public and despite all the circumstances which indicate they ought not to grant it, and if Progress Energy/FPL does not complete all construction in a timely way upon which such rate increases were approved; I ask that the Commission require the repayment of all three rate increases to those from whom they were taken.

1) Nuclear Cost Recovery: Florida law (FL Statute 366.93) authorizes electric utilities to incur expenses such as licensing and planning expenses costs for new nuclear or gas plants and to recover these costs from their customers immediately (over one year) whether or not the plants are ever built. Carrying charges (interest) on infrastructure construction expenses may be charged to customers immediately (for over ten years at least for Turkey Point 6 & 7) until the plant is constructed or the project is cancelled and then the customers pay the full cost of the infrastructure. The cost is paid by the rate payers whether or not the plants are ever built!

Through 2011, the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) has authorized Florida Power & Light (FPL) to spend \$248 million and Progress Energy Florida (PEF) to spend \$615 million. This year they are requesting another \$196 million (FPL) and \$20 million (PEF) for 2012, a total of \$1.079 Billion dollars toward nuclear reactors which may never be built but for which rate payers must pay now. This is in addition to approximately \$205 million which PE is requesting for Crystal River Plant uprate. And all of this occurs with no input or comment from private citizens; organized advocacy groups can petition to comment on the process.

2) No True Intent to build the Turkey Point or Levy Reactors

FPL has set dates of 2022 and 2023 the construction of Turkey Point 6 & 7, over ten years away. PEF says Levy reactors are now scheduled for 2021 and 2023; there is some

information that this might be delayed until 2027! Will they ever be built? See quotes below. The Statute implies that there should be a true plan and intent by the utility to build the plants for which they are seeking and spending funds well in advance of their planned construction. FPL senior management has stated publicly that Turkey Point 6 & 7 would be so expensive they probably will never be built.

Mr. Lew Hay, chairman and CEO of FPL, said, "If our cost estimates are even close to being right, the cost of a two-unit plant will be on the order of magnitude of \$13 to \$14 billion. That's bigger than the total market capitalization of many companies in the U.S. utility industry and 50 percent or more of the market capitalization of all companies in our industry with the exception of Exelon. ... This is a huge bet for any CEO to take to his or her board. (http://thinkprogress.org/romm/2008/06/13/202742/nuclear-power-part-2-the-price-is-not-right/).

That statement was made in 2007. Current cost estimates are much higher making the likelihood that Turkey Point 6 & 7 very slim; and those are overnight costs; you can increase their cost estimates by at least 50% for the actual cost of building the reactors and related infrastructure. And, if the AP1000 reactors are not used, FPL is saying the alternative reactors will cost \$24 Billion. How high is up? How can the PSC continue to spend rate payers money for ghost reactors? Here is further evidence of lack of intent to build Turkey Point 6 & 7:

Statement From FPL Website: (http://www.fpl.com/environment/nuclear/faq.shtml)

Will FPL begin construction soon after it receives state and federal approval? The state and federal licenses and approvals provide FPL the opportunity, but not the obligation, to proceed with construction of the project. (emphasis added). Today's applications are part of a stepwise approach that will create the option to build additional nuclear generation for the benefit of our customers. To that end, we continue to monitor many factors that affect the appropriate timing and cost of the project. Some of the factors include the pace of regulatory reviews; federal and state energy policy initiatives; and the cost and availability of necessary materials, services and labor. At present, the current schedule would have Unit 6 providing electricity by 2022 and Unit 7 by 2023.

Clearly, FPL is not showing the intent to build. We can only assume that FPL is keeping the possibility alive so they can draw down funds under NCR to finance the building of power lines and the cost of seeking the licenses.

The cost of natural gas is declining and the technology for renewable energy is moving forward leading us to ask if nuclear energy and fossil fuels have not served their purpose but it is

time to move on to decentralized production of renewable energy. Solar, wind, geothermal, biomass and other evolving ways of producing energy are already having an impact; nuclear and fossil fuels usage is only being sustained by excessive lobbying in and heavy handed political and devious economic pressures. FPL is already one of the largest producers of solar energy in the world but they still persist in seeking licensure for Turkey Point 6 & 7 and an uprate for creaky 40 year old Turkey Point 3 & 4 which are being held together by a wish and a prayer. Some say the concrete might be as brittle as an egg shell. Much has and will change in the economy, technology and demand for energy established years prior to construction, 15 years earlier for Turkey Point. At present Turkey Point is only using 65% of its generating capacity from all sources of energy; PEF is only using 75% of its capacity from all sources. Does this indicate a need for additional production capacity. Current studies show that energy conservation and efficiency will eliminate the need for any more power plants in Florida.

3) The Feasibility Study related to Turkey Point 6 & 7 is based on questionable calculations.

In a message to the current writers, the Office of Public Counsel stated:

"In this year's Nuclear Cost Recovery hearing, our office is challenging, not the feasibility of the uprate projects, but the methodology that FPL has employed in calculating its annual feasibility analysis. The reason we are doing this is because of the rising or increasing costs of the uprate projects. And, coincidentally, the methodology we propose should be used is the same methodology that FPL currently is using for its new nuclear projects. If the PSC accepts our argument, FPL will have to use the new methodology and we can then access the feasibility of the uprates. We are not contesting whether the uprates should be done; we are contesting the feasibility methodology that FPL is employing."

Utility companies are required to update the justification for nuclear facilities every year projected ten years into the future, termed a feasibility study. The Office of Public Counsel challenges the way FPL does the calculations. The Fort Lauderdale Sun Sentinal reported, August 7, 2011, FPL should not have abandoned getting bids "with price-assured contracts" and other traditional construction practices meant to control costs for construction work related to the proposed expansions of four existing reactors, according to the Office of Public Counsel (OPC), the state's advocate for utility customers. FPL implemented this "fast-tracked" approach to meet it goals for completion but the OPC argues that

the move is leading to "rapidly increasing estimates of the cost to complete the...projects" and they may end up costing more than FPL's alternative plan, not to do them.

The OPC contends that FPL withheld information. The OPC recommends that the PSC fine FPL ... for allegedly violating a rule that requires utilities that want to charge customers for nuclear planning costs to report estimated costs to regulators. An investigator hired by FPL found last year that the utility provided "inaccurate and incomplete" information to regulators about the growing costs of its nuclear expansions. The consumer advocate's office examined the issue itself and found that FPL's cost estimates increased by \$444 million in the months before it testified on costs but it did not report the changes.

(The OPC contends that) Progress Energy Florida is allegedly violating a rule that requires utilities that want to charge customers for planning costs of nuclear projects to actually have an intent to build them, according to the Southern Alliance for Clean Energy. Last year, both PE and FPL announced "delaying major capital expenditures" to build new reactors last year – and instead, just focusing on the getting the required licenses – because of the uncertainty and risk of U.S. nuclear growth, which was exacerbated by the Japan disaster.

The Florida Industrial Power Users Group, a group that represents consumers that are businesses, said utilities should prove the projects are the most reasonable and cost-effective way to serve customers given the uncertainty and risks.

But Commissioner Ron Brisé, who was in charge of deciding which questions to allow the agency to consider, ruled that whether or not the total project costs are "reasonable" should not be considered. A PSC employee said state law doesn't require the commission to consider whether the overall costs of new reactors or proposed reactor expansions are reasonable.

A PSC staff audit in May of FPL's nuclear costs last year found that FPL wanted to charge customers for costs related to going before Miami-Dade County. The utility is not allowed to charge customers for lobbying costs. FPL said the costs were not for political lobbying and were needed to obtain the licenses and approvals needed for its nuclear projects but that it would pay the costs itself anyway.

At the hearings, the PSC will also evaluate \$81 million in nuclear planning costs it approved last year without full hearings. The PSC adopted the costs by a 3 to 2 vote after FPL and consumer groups struck a deal allowing FPL to pass nuclear costs to customers in 2011before a full hearing. For full explanation, visit:

for Turkey Point 6 & 7, was in established in 2007 based on earlier figures, years prior to construction, 15 years earlier for Turkey Point. At present Turkey Point is only using 65% of its generating capacity from all sources of energy; PEF is only using 75% of its capacity from all sources. With a 10% increase in energy conservation and efficiency we could avoid the need to ever build another power plant. Decentralized/distributed production of renewable energieson our homes and business is the future of energy, not building monolithic plants and sending energy out on wires.

Undue and unjustified burden on the ratepayers.

Proposed NCR funds being request for 2012 are excessive. FPL is requesting \$196 million in addition to the \$248 million they have already spent. PE is requesting \$20 million in addition to the \$615 million it has already been authorized to spend in NCR funds toward the Levy project to be absorbed by only 1.7 customers; FPL has 4.4 million customers. And these funds are added immediately over 12 months to their customers electric bills. Added together, these two utility companies will have spent \$1.079 Billion in NCR funds toward engineering and infrastructure for reactors which have little chance of ever being built. Elders who will only live another one, two or three decades are being charged now for the cost of power plants that will never provide them with any power. NCR is effectively "delegated" taxation on these people. FPL and PEF should only charge people for services currently being rendered.

Mayor Philip Stoddard, South Miami Florida, wrote: (Published in the Fort Lauderdale Sun Sentinel, August xx, 2011):

"Here in Florida, the big publicly-traded utilities are drawing up nuclear plans to take full advantage of (Nuclear) Cost Recovery, plans that include new four-lane access roads across southeastern Everglades wetlands and new transmission lines across the Everglades and eastern Miami-Dade County. How much could FPL charge ratepayers up front for this project? FPL hasn't said yet, but we can make an educated guess based on how much Progress Energy plans to charge their customers for a similar nuclear project

in Levy County. Progress Energy has submitted an early cost recovery schedule that peaks out at \$69 per 1000 KWH. Adjusted for the difference in number of customers, FPL's monthly rate increases would come to about \$50 per 1000 KWH. This charge would add 48 percent to my family's monthly electric bill."

5) No COL's (Combined Operating Licenses) have been yet been issued by the NRC for FPL Turkey Point 6 & 7 or for the PE Levy plants.

There is no guarantee that they will ever be issued; many problems exist with both the sites. So ECR funds are being authorized by the Florida PSC on the assumption that the licenses will be issued. And if they are not? No funds should be authorized or spent until the licenses are issued; these are public funds for a private company. They should not be committed frivolously.

5) Only ratepayers will finance nuclear.

Because Wall Street will not finance nuclear energy, it is too risky, it requires Federal loan guarantees to obtain the funds to build nuclear plants in the U.S. And these are only loan guarantees; the loans must eventually be repaid by the utility's customers.

6) Future need

Power companies have gone bankrupt because the anticipated need did not materialize. Right now Turkey Point is only using 65% of the energy in can produce from all sources currently on site; Progress Energy is only using 75% of its total production capacity. And current reports show the actual energy usage in the nation is declining. So who pays for the dis-orderly deconstruction of a \$20 to \$35 billion nuclear plant if the need is not there. And who continues to pay for building the un-needed plant? The rate payers, of course, not the utilities.

7) FL Statute 366.92 requires promotion of renewable energy.

Is the PSC fulfilling this statutory requirement? Dependency on nuclear and fossil fuels will give way to renewable

energy sources; this is the trend all over the world. By not also encouraging investment in

8) Nuclear is dirty.

While most people are not concerned about a nuclear plant blowing up in normal circumstances, the problems come from threats to and from nature due the operation of the nuclear plants and the by-products thereof, terrorism, human error and unforeseen events. The operation of the nuclear plants has impacts on the environment that are anything but neutral. See 9 below.

Not one ounce of nuclear waste has been moved from Turkey Point since nuclear operations started in 1972. Disposal of low level radio active waste (equipment, clothes, tools) is a major concern and requires special handling and long term storage. And tons of radio active contaminated earth are being kept on the site at Turkey Point.

9) Nuclear increases salinity in the aquifer

The 165 miles of cooling canals have introduced saline water into the aquifer beneath it which supplies the water for Miami-Dade County and the entire Florida keys. And, if they build Turkey Point 6 & 7, it will use 90 Million Gallons per Day (MGD) of reclaimed water (in an area already on severe water restrictions) or 125 MGD of sea water to be drained from under Biscayne Bay with no real prediction of that will do to the interconnected South Florida aquifer; dangerous moves, unknown consequences.

10) NCR is an investment in 19th century technology.

Production of energy at one point and sending over wires is the same model T.A. Edison used in 1882 in Manhattan. Today, the 21st Century Model is to produce energy at the point of use on homes and business; distributed or decentralized production of energy. ECR is an investment in the past. We should be investing in renewable energies while natural gas

is declining in cost taking advantage of that reduced energy cost as a bridge to moving Florida forward toward decentralized production of renewable energy using emerging technology, an effort which could produce over \$100 billion in new business in Florida! Governor Scott, here are your jobs.

11) WATER

South Florida is surrounded by sea water but has little potable water. All of South Florida is on permanent water rationing. Most of the shoreline and much of the aquifer which supplies fresh water for the area is experiencing increased major salt water intrusion. Some communities have had to abandon wells they have depended on for years. Some are using reverse osmosis to provide water for golf courses and municipal parks and land. No board 700 or 1300 miles away should be able to commit limited water resources to nuclear reactors putting the local population at risk of not having sufficient water for everyday needs. The large amount of water proposed to be pulled from the unconfined Florida Aquifer in Levy Ccounty on a daily basis would reduce the amount of water available to many springs reducing the potable water supply in the area.

BOTTOM LINE: Ask the PSC Staff and Commissioners to deny FPL and PEF any new NCR funds until the questions above are answered and the proposed plants are licensed and assured of being built. It's our money, not the utilities! With authority comes responsibility; the PSC must begin to represent the people and not just the utilities. The perception is that the regulators are too closely aligned with the regulated. Economics, technology, need and times have changed; it is time for the PSC to change also.

The reason we are doing this is because of the rising or increasing costs of the uprate projects. And, coincidentally, the methodology we propose should be used is the same methodology that FPL currently is using for its new nuclear projects. If the PSC accepts our argument, FPL will have to use the new methodology and we can then access the feasibility of the uprates. We are not contesting whether the uprates should be done; we are contesting the feasibility methodology that FPL is employing."

Utility companies are required to update the justification for nuclear facilities every year projected ten years into the future, termed a feasibility study. The Office of Public Counsel challenges the way FPL does the calculations. The Fort Lauderdale Sun Sentinal reported, August 7, 2011, FPL should not have abandoned getting bids "with price-assured contracts" and other traditional construction practices meant to control costs for construction work related to the proposed expansions of four existing reactors, according to the Office of Public Counsel (OPC), the state's advocate for utility customers. FPL implemented this "fast-tracked" approach to meet it goals for completion but the OPC argues that

the move is leading to "rapidly increasing estimates of the cost to complete the...projects" and they may end up costing more than FPL's alternative plan, not to do them.

The OPC contends that FPL withheld information. The OPC recommends that the PSC fine FPL ... for allegedly violating a rule that requires utilities that want to charge customers for nuclear planning costs to report estimated costs to regulators. An investigator hired by FPL found last year that the utility provided "inaccurate and incomplete" information to regulators about the growing costs of its nuclear expansions. The consumer advocate's office examined the issue itself and found that FPL's cost estimates increased by \$444 million in the months before it testified on costs but it did not report the changes.

(The OPC contends that) Progress Energy Florida is allegedly violating a rule that requires utilities that want to charge customers for planning costs of nuclear projects to actually have an intent to build them, according to the Southern Alliance for Clean Energy. Last year, both PE and FPL announced "delaying major capital expenditures" to build new reactors last year – and instead, just focusing on the getting the required licenses – because of the uncertainty and risk of U.S. nuclear growth, which was exacerbated by the Japan disaster.

The Florida Industrial Power Users Group, a group that represents consumers that are businesses, said utilities should prove the projects are the most reasonable and cost-effective way to serve customers given the uncertainty and risks.

But Commissioner Ron Brisé, who was in charge of deciding which questions to allow the agency to consider, ruled that whether or not the total project costs are "reasonable" should not be considered. A PSC employee said state law doesn't require the commission to consider whether the overall costs of new reactors or proposed reactor expansions are reasonable.

A PSC staff audit in May of FPL's nuclear costs last year found that FPL wanted to charge customers for costs related to going before Miami-Dade County. The utility is not allowed to charge customers for lobbying costs. FPL said the costs were not for political lobbying and were needed to obtain the licenses and approvals needed for its nuclear projects but that it would pay the costs itself anyway.

At the hearings, the PSC will also evaluate \$81 million in nuclear planning costs it approved last year without full hearings. 4) Undue and unjustified burden on the ratepayers.

Proposed NCR funds being request for 2012 are excessive. FPL is requesting \$196 million in addition to the \$248 million they have already spent. NCR is effectively "delegated" taxation on these people. FPL and PEF should only charge people for services currently being rendered. Mayor Philip Stoddard, South Miami Florida, wrote: (Published in the Fort Lauderdale Sun Sentinel, August xx, 2011):

"Here in Florida, the big publicly-traded utilities are drawing up nuclear plans to take full advantage of (Nuclear) Cost Recovery, plans that include new four-lane access roads across southeastern Everglades wetlands and new transmission lines across the Everglades and eastern Miami-Dade County. How much could FPL charge ratepayers up front for this project? FPL hasn't said yet, but we can make an educated guess based on how much Progress Energy plans to charge their customers for a similar nuclear project

in Levy County. Progress Energy has submitted an early cost recovery schedule that peaks out at \$69 per 1000 KWH. Adjusted for the difference in number of customers, FPL's monthly rate increases would come to about \$50 per 1000 KWH. This charge would add 48 percent to my family's monthly electric bill."

5) No COL's (Combined Operating Licenses) have been yet been issued by the NRC for FPL Turkey Point 6 & 7 or for the PE Levy plants.





Florida State Representative Gary Aubuchon's office forwarded a copy of your E-mail regarding Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) and Progress Energy Florida, Incorporated (Progress Energy) to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the PSC. The PSC has limited authority in the telephone industry to include the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service.

You expressed a concern about FPL and Progress Energy's petitions to recover prudently incurred preconstruction costs associated with nuclear power plants.

Florida Statute 366.93 indicates that after a petition for determination of need is granted, a utility may petition the commission for cost recovery for the siting, design, licensing, and construction of nuclear and integrated gasification combined cycle power plants.

In compliance with the Florida Statute the PSC enacted a rule in February 2007 that adheres to the statute. Rule 25-6.0423, Florida Administrative Code, allows investor-owned utilities to recover costs for nuclear and coal gasification plants. Upon PSC approval of a utility's need for a nuclear plant upgrade or new plant construction, the utility can petition for cost recovery.

FPL's approved cost recovery includes costs associated with the uprate of its existing nuclear generating plants, Turkey Point Units 3 and 4 and St. Lucie Units 1 and 2, and the construction of its proposed nuclear power plants, Turkey Point Units 6 and 7. These completed projects will add 2,614 megawatts (MW) of new nuclear base load generation to FPL's system, enough energy to power 1.4 million homes.

Progress Energy's approved cost recovery includes costs associated with the uprate of its existing nuclear generating plant at Crystal River, and the construction of its proposed nuclear power plants, Levy Units 1 and 2. These completed projects will add 2,380 MWs of new nuclear base load generation to Progress Energy's system, enough energy to power 1.3 million homes.

The next hearing in which the PSC will decide the nuclear cost recovery for FPL and Progress Energy will begin on October 24, 2011. You may use the following link to view and listen to the hearings:







PSC to rule on future nuke plant charge

If Progress Energy gets its request for a fuel costs adjustment approved by state regulators, customers will see a 5 percent increase in their bills beginning in January. They can blame it on the Crystal River nuclear plant — which has not been running for the past two years.

The increase would be about \$6 a month for a 1,000 kilowatt-hour residential bill, raising that current bill for 1,000 watts a month from \$119 to about \$125. The average increase for commercial customers would be 4 percent to 5 percent and for industrial customers 5 percent to 7 percent.

The fuel charges are the actual cost of fuel during the year, which can turn out to be more or less than were originally anticipated when the current rates were set by regulators last year.

When fuel costs are higher than planned, the company is allowed to file to recover some or all of that cost in an annual settling-up process through the new rates for the coming year. The fuel costs cannot include a profit.

This year's increased fuel costs are mostly because of the extended outage of the Crystal River nuclear plant, which has been down since late 2009.

State regulators have approved a deal between Progress Energy Florida and U.S. EcoGen Polk LLC, in which the electric utility would purchase 60 megawatts of power from a planned EcoGen biomass plant.

since a crack was found in the containment building wall during a scheduled outage. The company has said it will repair the wall, but the plant won't be back online until 2014.

Nuclear plants generate electricity that is cheaper to produce and results in a lower rates than electricity produced by fossil fuels. When the company has to use natural gas or coal plants to pick up the slack when the nuclear plant is down, or when they have to buy power generated by those two fuels to meet demand, the price of electricity goes up.

The company said most of the increased fuel costs in this case are for the cost of natural gas, which is

the second least expensive fuel. Coal is the most expensive fuel of the three.

The company termed the requested increase as modest and noted that it would be coming after two years of decreases.

Progress Energy Florida, which serves 45,000 customers in Citrus County, filed the request with the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) as it normally does to recover the extra costs for fuel and purchased power, and the commission is scheduled to hold hearings on the request Nov. 1 to 3, after which the finalized bills for next year will be set.

Before that, however, on Oct. 24, the PSC will rule on another charge

in customers' bills, one for nuclear generation, which has created a controversy.

The controversy is over whether Progress Energy should be allowed to bill customers for planned future nuclea facilities that wouldn't come on line for many years.

The state legislature approved that charge a few years ago, and the company is in the preliminary stages of approval for two nuclear units in Levy County, but critics of the charge have protested in recent PSC hearings, saying that it is not even certain whether the plants will be become a reality.

The company is still asking for the fee but has filed for a lesser amount than it has been charging, which amounts to 85 cents less per 1000 kilowatts (from \$5.53 to \$4.68). Critics want larger reductions and some legislators such as Sen. Mike Fasano, R-New Port Richey, have said they will attempt in the next legislative session to repeal the law allowing the charge.

Progress Energy is also allowed to file to recover investments in environmental compliance projects. That proposed charge would add another 92 cents to the 1000 kilowatt bill if approved — which would basically offset the proposed reduction in the nuclear generation fee in bills, if both were approved.



This is in response to your inquiry with the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) regarding Progress Energy Florida, Incorporated (Progress Energy) You expressed a concern about Progress Energy's petition to recover prudently incurred preconstruction costs associated with nuclear power plants.

Florida Statute 366.93 indicates that after a petition for determination of need is granted, a utility may petition the commission for cost recovery for the siting, design, licensing, and construction of nuclear and integrated gasification combined cycle power plants.

In compliance with the Florida Statute the PSC enacted Rule 25-6.0423, Florida Administrative Code, in February 2007. This rule allows investor-owned utilities to recover costs for nuclear and coal gasification plants. Upon PSC approval of a utility's need for a nuclear plant upgrade or new plant construction, the utility can petition for cost recovery.

The next hearing in which the PSC will set the 2011 cost recovery charge will begin on November 1, 2011. You may use the following link to view and listen to the hearings:

On October 24, 2011 the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC) will vote on whether or not to authorize Floriida Power & Light (FPL) to spend \$196 million for licensure, planning and infrastructure for nuclear plants at least 10 years in the future. This is in addition to \$248 million approved previously for FPL. If all amounts are approved, the total spent in advance for FPL nuclear plants will total \$444 million. All of these funds are

billed to the ratepayers; some immediately, some interest only and then the principal, whether or not the plants are ever built.

FPL's monthly rate increases would come to about \$50 per 1000 KWH. This charge would add 48 percent to my family's monthly electric bill."

There is no guarantee that FPL will ever be allowed to build the reactors at Turkey Point, especially following the Fucashima Nuclear distaster and Turkey Point's precarious position at sea level on Biscayne Bay. Projected sea level rise will place the plant at even greater risk.

There really is no additional energy need for FPL or it's customers. Turkey point is only operating at 65% and FPL regionally at 75%. Bringing online two new reactors at a cost of \$24 Billion, really socks it to the ratepayer. Energy efficiency would achieve even greater results with less harm to the environment. Over the life of the plants, sea level is expected to rise at least three feet in Miami Dade County, displacing over a million of FPL's customers. There will be significantly less demand for electricity in the region.

I would ask you to inform the Commissioners of the reality of the situation and ask them to do the responsible thing. Look out for the people of Florida rather than the utilities that they are sworn to regulate. Deny FPL's request. DO THE RIGHT THING!!



RESOLUTION 2011-56

RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE OF PINECREST, FLORIDA, URGING THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO DENY APPROVAL OF ANY FURTHER "EARLY COST RECOVERY" AND URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO REPEAL THE "EARLY COST RECOVERY" STATUTE RELATING TO ELECTRIC UTILITY CHARGES FOR THE SITING. DESIGN. LICENSING. AND CONSTRUCTION NUCLEAR PLANTS: PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, F.S. 366.93, known as "Early Cost Recovery," was adopted by The Florida Legislature in 2006 and provides that utilities may charge customers in advance of operation for the costs of planning, lobbying for, and constructing nuclear power plants; and

WHEREAS, the Early Cost Recovery statute provides that the utility may impose and collect the charge but never actually complete the project, thus charging the rate payer for improvements and infrastructure they will never actually provide to customers; and

WHEREAS, FPL has currently charged, collected from its customers and spent \$268 million in Early Cost Recovery funds and is seeking approval from the Public Service Commission for an additional \$186 million in 2012 new nuclear-related projects including the construction of two additional nuclear reactors at Turkey Point in South Miami-Dade, but which have never received approval for a license by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission: and

WHEREAS, the additional funds requested by FPL may represent a dramatic increase in the customer's monthly bill at a time when consumers are struggling to pay current bills; and

WHEREAS, FPL executives have stated that nuclear reactors are too expensive to build, yet FPL continues to collect money from the rate-payers under "Early Cost Recovery" to finance other infrastructure projects listed under their nuclear Combined Operating License Application; and

WHEREAS, publicly traded utilities receiving money from ratepayers under "Early Cost Recovery" are not obliged to pay back those funds if their nuclear generation projects are not completed; and

WHEREAS, publicly traded utilities receiving money from ratepayers under "Early Cost Recovery" can and do use those moneys to lobby and litigate against the public to pursue projects the rate payers oppose; and

WHEREAS, improvements in domestic energy efficiency are the best energy investments available, are carbon-free, safe, and can provide more jobs to Floridians than any other energy investment, but "Early Cost Recovery" monies are not permissible for such investments; and

WHEREAS, nuclear reactors financed through "Early Cost Recovery" have become the most expensive way to produce electricity; and

WHEREAS, the nuclear reactor designs currently being financed through "Early Cost Recovery" have never been deployed and may pose unforeseen risks to citizens of the Southeastern United States;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF PINECREST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section I. That the Village Council hereby urges the Florida Public Service Commission to deny FPL approval of any further Early Cost Recovery funding.

Section 2. That the Village Council hereby urges The Florida Legislature to repeal F.S. 366.93 relating to Early Cost Recovery.

The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your E-mail regarding Progress Energy Florida, Incorporated (Progress Energy) to the Florida Public Service Commission (PSC). The PSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the PSC. The PSC has limited authority in the telephone industry to include the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. You expressed a concern about Progress Energy's petition to recover prudently incurred preconstruction costs associated with nuclear power plants.

Florida Statute 366.93 indicates that after a petition for determination of need is granted, a utility may petition the commission for cost recovery for the siting, design, licensing, and construction of nuclear and integrated gasification combined cycle power plants.

In compliance with the Florida Statute the PSC enacted Rule 25-6.0423, Florida Administrative Code, in February 2007. This rule allows investor-owned utilities to recover costs for nuclear and coal gasification plants. Upon PSC approval of a utility's need for a nuclear plant upgrade or new plant construction, the utility can petition for cost recovery.

The next hearing in which the PSC will set the 2011 cost recovery charge will begin on November 1, 2011. You may use the following link to view and listen to the hearings:





We incorporate herein Roland Docal's Oral Testimony before the Commission and the Public Petition submitted to the Commission at Public Hearing held at the City of Saint Petersburg concerning Progress Energy Florida, Inc's (hereinafter "PEF") 31.5% base rate increase request. This e-mail message, together with the Oral Testimony and Public Petition previously presented, opposes any PEF rate increase for nuclear power production on four grounds:

- It is improper to approve current electric rate increases for the construction of new nuclear facilities or expansion of existing nuclear facilities when said construction of new nuclear facilities or expansion of existing nuclear facilities has not been approved or permitted by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission.
- 2. The possibility of a construction permit is not a guarantee. The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission has not approved a nuclear plant construction permit since January 27, 1978. The post-tsunami nuclear disaster in Japan is reverberating across the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission and communities in the U.S. where nuclear power plants are planned or under consideration. The environment for NRC approval of PEF's nuclear plans is not favorable and at high risk of NEVER coming to fruition.
- 3. Until construction or expansion is approved by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, the costs and risks of nuclear plant planning and permitting are more properly borne by PEF shareholders who ultimately stand to profit from said construction or expansion.
- 4. Generally accepted accounting principles for U.S. commercial corporations (and most companies throughout the world, as well) do not allow revenues to be recognized until a product or service has been delivered to the customer. Florida's utilities should not be exempted from the application of this principle. PEF should not be granted a nuclear construction or expansion rate increase until PEF is able to deliver (i.e., place online to the existing power distribution grid) a fully functional new nuclear power plant or the successful expansion of an existing plant.



State leaders see nuclear power as inevitable to Florida's energy future

Every time you pay your energy bill, a portion of it goes to build a nuclear power plant that won't produce power for at least another decade and, if opponents have any say, never will.

The state Legislature, the governor and the head of the state's utility board all say that Florida's future will include new nuclear facilities, setting aside concerns about the meltdown of the Fukushima reactor in Japan, reports of imperfect new reactor designs and rising construction costs.

In the next two weeks, the Florida Public Service Commission must decide in public hearings how much the state's two largest utilities - Florida Power & Light and Progress Energy Florida - will charge customers in 2012 for nuclear plants of tomorrow. It will be the fourth year the utilities will be allowed to collect money for nuclear costs. Together, they are asking customers for \$337 million next year.

FPL wants \$2.09 a month from each customer using an average of 1,000 kilowatt hours of electricity. Progress Energy wants more than twice that - \$4.80 per month for 1,000 kilowatt hours, about a 20-cent decrease from what customers are currently paying for nuclear projects.

The utility companies say that while it takes a long time to build a nuclear plant, the net savings to customers will be in the billions because the cost of nuclear fuel will be much lower. They also note that the construction process creates jobs.

But conservation groups, large commercial power users and lawyers representing consumers say it's time for regulators to hit the brakes and scale back how much the electric utilities are allowed to charge for uncertain projects. They argue that soaring costs, delayed timelines and safety concerns make it less likely that the power plants will be as cost-effective as projected.

"We believe the outlook for nuclear in Florida is dimmer now than when we started this," said Charles Rehwinkel of the Office of Public Counsel, which represents consumers before the state Public Service Commission, which regulates utilities. "The most customers are looking at is getting the opportunity to get a certificate [to build a plant] but to get one built cost-effectively doesn't look good."

What the PSC is not required to do is determine whether pursuing nuclear power is a good idea. The

Florida Legislature determined that in 2006 when, in the midst of a once-booming economy, it wanted to encourage utility companies to invest in nuclear power development to meet Florida's then-growing energy needs.

The Legislature ordered utility regulators to impose a new fee on electric bills to pay for the lengthy process of locating and constructing new nuclear plants - but it offered what few other states do: letting the power companies collect the money before, not after, the work was done.

The Legislature required the PSC to approve only "prudently incurred costs" for location, design, licensing and construction of nuclear power plants, but, at the urging of the utility companies, it sweetened the deal and did not require for the plants to ever be built.

The utilities have said that because of the Legislature's action, the PSC has an obligation to let them charge customers for the future plants, and it's not the agency's role to determine whether the plants are ultimately feasible or not.

It's a blank check that Sen. Mike Fasano, R-New Port Richey, and conservation groups bitterly oppose. Fasano says he now regrets his vote to support the 2006 law and has filed legislation in the past few years to repeal the so-called "nuclear cost recovery" provisions. But because of the industry's lobbying power, he said the measure never gets a hearing.

"The electricity demand they thought they are going to need in the future is not going to be there," Fasano said. He is hoping that the anti-tax Legislature will realize the added costs imposed on utility customers "are back-door taxes and fees."

Both FPL and Progress Energy "have belatedly acknowledged the great uncertainty and risk surrounding the feasibility of ever completing these projects," wrote lawyers for the non-profit Southern Alliance For Clean Energy in documents filed before the PSC. But with public uncertainty as a result of the Fukushima disaster, "ratepayers are on the hook for billions of dollars spent on reactors which likely will never be constructed," they said.

The state Office of Public Counsel agrees and is asking utility regulators to cut Progress Energy's nuclear fees in half and deny FPL's fees until it proves it intends to actually build the plants.

Progress Energy is seeking a license to build a new nuclear power plan in Levy County and another to expand its existing Crystal River plant. In 2006, the company projected that the cost of the Levy plant was \$4 billion to \$6 billion, with the first reactor going online in 2016. Today, the project costs have exploded and estimates indicate it will cost from \$17 billion to \$22 billion, and not be online until 2021.

As of June, Progress Energy had spent \$795 million on the Levy project and collected \$471 million from customers. In 2012, it wants customers to pay another \$141 million.

FPL's projects include upgrading nuclear plants in St. Lucie and building two new reactors at Miami Dade's Turkey Point plant by 2023. Since 2008, the estimated cost of the project has risen from \$1.45 billion to \$2 billion and the company is asking for \$196 million next year.

Also contributing to the rising cost and risks of nuclear power is the fact that the utilities have no permanent place to store nuclear waste. Right now, depleted nuclear fuel rods are stored on site at both FPL and Progress Energy's facilities. FPL and Progress Energy are storing 2,664 metric tons of

spent nuclear fuel in storage ponds on their sites, until a permanent national repository can be found.

Opponents say that the broad language in Florida's law has discouraged companies from acting prudently. FPL, for example, accelerated the pace of its project, raising costs unnecessarily, the public counsel argues.

Leon Jacobs of the Southern Alliance for Clean Energy also argues that the PSC is basing its cost projections on flawed assumptions. For example, it has not taken into account whether technology, alternative energy sources and aggressive conservation may provide Florida with cheaper long-term energy options than building multi-billion dollar nuclear plants.

Florida's key decision makers so far appear to be convinced the advantages of new nukes outweigh the costs.

Gov. Rick Scott's energy advisor, Mary Bane, told a panel on Florida's nuclear future last week that it is a resource that's unavoidable in a state with few energy options. Scott has said he supports continued development of nuclear power. And Art Graham, chairman of the Public Service Commission, told the St. Petersburg Times editorial board last week that "nuclear is good, clean energy. It's cleaner than coal - but we have to figure out a way to keep that cost down."

The PSC hearings begin in Tallahassee on Wednesday.




