REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION OF REPORT AND DATA RESPONSES RELATED TO STAFF'S REVIEW OF COAL COMBUSTION RESIDUAL STORAGE AND DISPOSAL PROCESS OF THE FLORIDA ELECTRIC INDUSTRY

Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes, and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") requests confidential classification of certain information included in the "Review of Coal Combustion Residual Storage and Disposal Process of the Florida Electric Industry" report (the "Report") prepared by the Florida Public Service Commission Office of Auditing and Performance Analysis, and information included in FPL's data responses that Staff reviewed in preparing the Report ("Confidential Data Responses"). In support of its request, FPL states as follows:

1. Staff conducted an investigation regarding coal combustion residual storage and disposal process of the Florida electric industry. During its investigation, Staff was provided with numerous pages of Confidential Data Responses, and FPL contemporaneously served notices of intent to seek confidential classification. Pursuant to Rule 25-22.006(3)(a), Florida Administrative Code, FPL was given 21 days from November 28, 2011 to file a formal request for confidential classification with respect to the Report and Confidential Data Responses. Accordingly, FPL is filing this Request for Confidential Classification to maintain continued confidential handling of the information contained in the Report and data responses.

- 2. The following exhibits are included with and made a part of this request:
 - a. Exhibit A includes a copy the confidential Report and Confidential Data Responses, on which all information that is entitled to confidential treatment under Florida law has been highlighted.
 - b. Exhibit B consists of a copy of the confidential Report and Confidential

 Data Responses, on which all information that is entitled to confidential
 treatment has been redacted. Where multiple consecutive pages are
 confidential, a page labeled "redacted" has been inserted.
 - c. Exhibit C is a table containing the specific line, column or page references to the confidential information, and references to the specific statutory bases for the claim of confidentiality and to the affiant who supports of the requested confidential classification.
 - d. Exhibit D includes the affidavit of Scott Brown.
- 3. FPL submits that the highlighted information in Exhibit A is proprietary confidential business information within the meaning of Section 366.093(3), Florida Statutes. This information is intended to be and is treated by FPL as private in that the disclosure of the information would cause harm to customers or FPL's business operations, and its confidentiality has been maintained. Pursuant to Section 366.093, such information is entitled to confidential treatment and it is exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determines that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.

- 4. As the affidavit included in Exhibit D indicates, some of information in the Report and Confidential Data Responses is proprietary, confidential business information. The Report and Confidential Data Responses contain or constitute information related to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair FPL's and/or Georgia Power's competitive businesses and their ability to contract for goods and services on favorable terms for the benefit of their customers. Specifically, this information relates to Georgia Power's costs, revenues, earnings and management of coal combustion residuals. In addition, some of the other information in the Confidential Data Responses relates to Georgia Power's safety and emergency procedures, which information is confidential because of its security significance. Furthermore, disclosure of this information could impair the competitive interests of the provider of the information. Such information is protected by Section 366.093(3)(c), (d) and (e), Florida Statutes.
- 5. Upon a finding by the Commission that the information highlighted in Exhibit A, and referenced in Exhibit C, is proprietary confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for a period of at least eighteen (18) months and should be returned to FPL as soon as the information is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. See § 366.093(4), Fla. Stat. (2011).

WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as more fully set forth in the supporting materials and affidavits included herewith, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that its Request for Confidential Classification be granted
