

25-6.019 Notification of Events Accidents.

- (1) Form PSC/ENG 159 (12/12), entitled "Electric Utility Event Report Injury," is incorporated in this rule by reference and may be obtained from the Commission's Division of Administrative Services and is also available at http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-02041. As soon as practicable, but no later than two business day after it learns of the occurrence, each investor-owned electric utility, rural electric cooperative, and municipal electric utility shall notify the Commission's Bureau of Safety, in writing, using Form PSC/ENG 159 (12/12), Commission of any event involving accident occurring in connection with any part of the electrical system which:
 - (a) Involves death or injury requiring hospitalization of non-utility persons, or
- (b) Is significant from a safety standpoint in the judgment of the utility even though it is not required by paragraph (a).
- (2) Form PSC/ENG 158 (12/12) entitled "Electric Utility Event Report Damages," is incorporated into this rule by reference and may be obtained from the Commission's Division of Administrative Services and is also available at http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-02041. Each investor-owned electric utility, rural electric cooperative, and municipal electric utility shall report, in writing, to the Commission's Bureau of Safety, using Form PSC/ENG 158 (12/12), Commission within 30 days of learning of any event malfunction of or accident involving any part of the electrical system, fire, or explosion, that:
 - (a) Involves damage to the property of others for an amount in excess of \$10,000 \$5000, or,
 - (b) Causes Cause significant damage, in the judgment of the utility, to the utility's facilities.
- (3) <u>Unless requested by the Bureau of Safety</u>, <u>r</u>Reports are not required with respect to personal injury, death, or property damage resulting from vehicular equipment striking poles and/or other utility property or events directly caused by:
 - (a) A storm named by the National Hurricane Center;

- (b) A tornado recorded by the National Weather Service;
- (c) Ice on line;
- (d) An extreme weather or fire event causing activation of the county emergency operation center.

 25-6.0345 Safety Standards for Construction of New Transmission and Distribution Facilities.
- (1) The Commission adopts and incorporates by reference the 2012 2002 edition of the National Electrical Safety Code (ANSI C-2) [NESC], as the applicable safety standards for transmission and distribution facilities subject to the Commission's safety jurisdiction. For electrical facilities constructed on or after February 1, 2007, the 2007 NESC shall apply. Electrical facilities constructed prior to February 1, 2007, shall be governed by the edition of the NESC specified by subsections 013.B.1, 013.B.2, and 013.B.3 of the 2007 NESC. Each investor-owned electric utility, rural electric cooperative, and municipal electric system shall, at a minimum, comply with the standards in these provisions. A copy of the 2007-NESC₃ ISBN number 0-7381-4893-8, may be obtained from the Institute of Electric and Electronic Engineers, Inc. (IEEE), 3 Park Avenue, New York, NY, 10016-5997. (2) Each investor-owned electric utility, rural electric cooperative and municipal electric utility shall report all completed electric work orders, whether completed by the utility or one of its contractors, at the end of each quarter of the year. The report shall be filed with the Director of the Commission's Division of Regulatory Compliance and Consumer Assistance no later than the 30th working day after the last day of the reporting quarter, and shall contain, at a minimum, the following information for each work order: (a) Work order number/project/job; (b) Brief title outlining the general nature of the work;

— (c) Estimated cost in dollars, rounded to nearest thousand and;

— (d) Location of project.

25-6.0346 Quarterly Reports of Work Orders and Safety Compliance.

(1) Each investor-owned electric utility, rural electric cooperative and municipal electric utility shall report all completed electric work orders, relating to the construction and/or maintenance of transmission and distribution facilities, whether completed by the utility or one of its contractors, at the end of each quarter of the year. The report shall be electronically filed with the Commission's Bureau of Safety no later than the 30th working day after the last day of the reporting quarter using Form PSC/ENG 157 (12/12), "PSC Quarterly Report of Completed Work Orders," which is available at

http://www.flrules.org/Gateway/reference.asp?No=Ref-02040. This form is incorporated into this rule by reference and may also be obtained from the Commission's Division of Administrative Services.

(2) In its quarterly report, each utility shall certify to the Commission that all work described in the completed work orders listed in the quarterly report meets or exceeds the applicable standards.

Compliance inspections by the Commission shall be made on a random basis or as appropriate.

25-6.060 Meter Test – Refereed Dispute Referee.

- (1) In the event of a dispute, upon request written application to the Commission by any customer, a test of the customer's meter shall will be made by the utility as soon as practicable. Said test shall will be supervised and witnessed by a representative of the Commission.
- (2) A meter shall in no way be disturbed after the utility has received notice that application has been made for such referee test unless a representative of the Commission is present or unless authority to do so is first given in writing by the Commission or by the customer.
 - (3) A report of the results of the test will be made by the Commission to the customer.
- (4) For equipment tested under this rule, any previous accuracy test result on record at the time the meter test is requested must be retained in accordance with Rule 25-6.022, F.A.C.

SUMMARY OF THE RULES

Rule 25-6.019, Notification of Accidents, is amended to incorporate forms to be used by electric utilities in reporting events involving injury and involving property damage. The amount of property damage triggering the reporting requirement has been updated from \$5000 to \$10,000.

Rule 25-6.0345, Safety Standards for Construction of New Transmission and Distribution Facilities, is amended to delete provisions concerning quarterly reports, which have been moved to new rule 25-6.0346. The rule is updated to reference the most recent edition of the National Electrical Safety Code, and notification requirements which were duplicative of provisions of Rule 25-6.019 are deleted.

Rule 25-6.0346, Quarterly Reports of Work Orders and Safety Compliance, is adopted to address, by separate rule, requirements for submitting quarterly reports of work orders and safety compliance, and a reporting form has been incorporated by reference.

Rule 25-6.060, Meter Test – Referee, is amended to allow oral customer requests for meter tests, and to require such tests to be witnessed by a Commission representative.

WRITTEN STATEMENT OF THE FACTS AND CIRCUMSTANCES JUSTIFYING THE RULES

Rule 25-6.019 is amended to incorporate all relevant injury and damage notification requirements into one rule for clarification and to remove duplicative language from the rules. Two forms for written notification are incorporated for consistency in reporting, and the property damage amount triggering notification requirements is updated by increasing the amount from \$5000 to \$10,000. Amendments to provisions regarding event reporting are intended to clarify and update the rule.

Rule 25-6.0345 is amended to delete provisions concerning quarterly reports, which for clarity are moved to new rule 25-6.0346. The rule is updated to reference the most recent edition of the National Electrical Safety Code, and notification requirements which were duplicative of provisions of Rule 25-6.019 are deleted. Obsolete and unnecessary reporting formatting requirements are deleted.

Based upon input from the electric industry, Rule 25-6.0346 is adopted to specifically address quarterly reports of work orders and safety compliance, for clarity, to make this subject matter easier to locate, and for consistency with Section 120.54(1)(g), F.S. These provisions were previously included in Rule 25-6.0345. A new reporting form is incorporated by reference to provide consistency in reporting.

Rule 25-6.060 is amended to update and clarify the rule to reflect that oral requests for customer meter tests are allowed and that such tests shall be witnessed by a Commission representative. These changes are consistent with the gas meter test dispute rule and clarify the intent of the rule.

SUMMARY OF ANY HEARINGS HELD ON THE RULES

No timely request for a hearing was received by the agency, and no hearing was held.
