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## PROCEEDINGS

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CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Moving on to Item Number 6. Commissioner Edgar.

COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Mr. Chairman, just a suggestion. We might want to ask staff to present Item 6 and 7 together just because -- although they are separate, they are, they are very similar. might be more efficient.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: That's not a bad idea. We can, we can do that, handle 6 and 7 together.

MS. KING: Good morning again, Commissioners. Laura King with Commission staff. And we would like to introduce 6 and 7 together since they are both petitions by Sebring for approval of special contracts for the transportation of natural gas with the Florida Department of Corrections.

Item 6 addresses the contract with Hardee Correctional Institute, and Item 7 addresses the contract to serve the DeSoto Correctional Institution. Both contracts have substantially similar terms and conditions; however, the cost to serve the facilities differ.

The facilities currently use propane to provide heat, hot water, cooking, and laundry

services, but would like to convert to natural gas.

Because the DOC was not willing to pay any upfront cost, the infrastructure needed to serve the -- for the infrastructure needed to serve the facilities, Sebring determined that it could not provide the services under its current tariffs and therefore the special contracts were needed.

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Staff reviewed the data provided by the company regarding its initial investment to serve both facilities as well as the contract terms and believes they are reasonable. The contracts each generate annual revenues that exceed the annual cost to serve, and the revenue stream will recover the up-front infrastructure costs in a reasonable amount of time.

Staff recommends approval of both contracts. We're here to answer any questions. And Mr. Horton is here to answer any questions on behalf of the company.

CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. Thank you.

Any questions, Commissioners, on these two items?

Commissioner Edgar.

**COMMISSIONER EDGAR:** Thank you. And I recognize that this may be slightly beyond our

jurisdiction; however, would it be correct to 1 presume that for the correctional facilities that 2 3 the conversion to natural gas from propane will ultimately be a savings to those facilities? 4 5 MS. KING: Yes, ma'am, that's correct. COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. And is it 6 7 also correct to say that if we were to approve these two items, that there would be -- there is not 8 9 expected to be a negative financial impact to 10 current ratepayers? MS. KING: That's correct. Currently 11 12 there's not. If the contract goes to term, we 13 expect there to be no issues. 14 COMMISSIONER EDGAR: Thank you. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Commissioner Balbis. 15 16 COMMISSIONER BALBIS: Thank you, 17 Mr. Chairman. 18 I just want to recognize Sebring for 19 working with these institutions and providing the 2.0 financing options so that they can receive the 21 benefit of natural gas. And I just wanted to point 22 that out, and at the proper time I'd move staff's 23 recommendation on all the issues for these two 24 items. 25 CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: Okay. Are there any

further comments? If there aren't, then we have a motion on the table. Is there --**COMMISSIONER EDGAR:** Second. CHAIRMAN BRISÉ: It's been moved and seconded. Once again I'll give you an opportunity -- any further comments? Seeing none, all in favor, say aye. (Vote taken.) All right. Thank you. Thank you very much. \* \* \* \* \*
