On March 27, 2015, Go SOLAR Florida sent a <u>letter</u> to each of the <u>67 county Chairs or</u> <u>Mayors in Florida</u> asking them to adopt a resolution supporting solar energy and the Go SOLAR Florida Financial Action Plan. ## Financial Options gets approved by the Broward County Commission

On Tuesday, March 17, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners adopted a resolution supporting the expansion of solar energy in Florida and pledging to examine which solar financing options in the Florida Solar Financing Action Plan might be advanced in Broward County. The Action Plan, a product of the Go SOLAR Florida initiative, presents a comprehensive review of the tools local governments in Florida can use to finance rooftop solar systems on their own facilities and to provide financial options to homeowners and businesses seeking to install rooftop solar equipment.

Similar resolutions have already been adopted in two other Go SOLAR Florida partner counties, Orange and Alachua. The Go SOLAR Florida partners will be asking all other counties in Florida to adopt similar resolutions supporting solar energy and pledging to review the Action Plan for possible use in their communities.
