**FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S
PREHEARING STATEMENT**

Pursuant to Order No. PSC-15-0100-PCO-EG, issued February 10, 2015 and Order No. PSC-15-0204-PCO-PU, issued May 21, 2015 establishing the procedure in this docket, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") hereby submits its Prehearing Statement.

III. STATEMENT OF BASIC POSITION

FPL's proposed Conservation Cost Recovery Factors for the January 2016 through December 2016 recovery period and true-up amounts for the prior periods should be approved.

IV. ISSUES AND POSITIONS

ISSUE 1: What are the final conservation cost recovery true-up amounts for the period January 2014 through December 2014?

FPL: \$8,356,646 under-recovery. (Keith)

ISSUE 2: What are the total conservation cost recovery amounts to be collected during the period January 2016 through December 2016?

FPL: \$191,276,638 including prior true-up amounts and revenue taxes. (Sharma)

ISSUE 3: What are the conservation cost recovery factors for the period January 2016 through December 2016?

ISSUE 4: What should be the effective date of the new conservation cost recovery factors for billing purposes?

FPL: The factors should be effective beginning with the specified conservation cost recovery cycle and thereafter for the period January 2016 through December 2016. Billing cycles may start before January 1, 2016 and the last cycle may be read after December 31, 2016, so that each customer is billed for twelve months regardless of when the adjustment factor became effective. These charges should continue in effect until modified by subsequent order of this Commission. (Keith)

ISSUE 5: Should the Commission approve revised tariffs reflecting the energy conservation cost recovery factors determined to be appropriate in this proceeding?

FPL: Yes. The Commission should approve revised tariffs reflecting the energy conservation cost recovery factors determined to be appropriate in this proceeding. The Commission should direct staff to verify that the revised tariffs are consistent with the Commission's decision. (Keith)
