1	PROCEEDINGS
2	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Okay. Let's circle around
3	to Item No. 3.
4	Staff.
5	MS. COWDERY: Good morning, Commissioners.
6	I'm Kathryn Cowdery with the Office of General
7	Counsel.
8	Chairman Graham, did you want to hear Items 3
9	and 3A together?
10	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Yes, ma'am.
11	MS. COWDERY: Those two items are petitions by
12	Duke Energy Florida and Florida Public Utilities
13	Company, respectively, for a temporary waiver of
14	the monthly billing requirement in the customer
15	billing rule until such time as restoration efforts
16	in response to Hurricane Michael are completed.
17	Staff recommends that both petitions be granted.
18	Representatives from both utilities are
19	available to answer any questions the Commission
20	may have, and staff is available for questions.
21	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, staff.
22	Commissioners, any questions, comments, or
23	concerns about Items 3 or 3A?
24	Commissioner Brown?
25	COMMISSIONER BROWN: I just have a comment.

1	And I know we mentioned this yesterday at our ten-
2	year site plan workshop but, you know, the
3	replacement and rebuilding of widespread
4	infrastructure has just been a massive endeavor of
5	Gulf, Duke, the co-ops, the munis, and they've done
6	such a tremendous job. And I wanted to acknowledge
7	this and also say what a tremendous community that
8	we have in our State to have such a rallying
9	around and of the support of the industry.
10	It's just been amazing, and appreciate all the
11	help of our political leaders, the utility
12	executives, and everyone on the on the ground,
13	especially the linemen who are risking their lives
14	so that others can have power and their lives back
15	to normalcy.
16	But I also wanted to thank our staff who's
17	been working in the EOC around the clock, 24 hours
18	a day, and thank them so much for all the work that
19	you're doing and providing the reports and the
20	filings. So, thank you.
21	And with that, I would move approval of
22	Items 3 and 3A.
23	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: It's been moved and
24	seconded, the approval of Items 3 and 3A.
25	Commissioner Polmann.

1	COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you,
2	Mr. Chairman.
3	I appreciate Commissioner Brown's comments.
4	In fact, she said everything I wanted to say. I
5	would reflect her comments as well, and second the
6	item.
7	I have no further comments, Mr. Chairman.
8	Thank you.
9	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Thank you, Commissioners.
10	I also want to thank both Duke and FPUC for
11	waiving these billings. I I it is a big time
12	of confusion for a lot, and it's kind of hard to
13	send a bill to someone that doesn't have a mailbox.
14	So, I do appreciate it's the right thing to
15	do. And that all being said, I'm ready for a vote.
16	All in favor, say aye.
17	(Chorus of ayes.)
18	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Any opposed?
19	By your action, you have approved staff
20	recommendations on Item 3 and Item 3A.
21	We'll have a we have a message from our
22	general counsel.
23	Keith?
24	MR. HETRICK: Thank you, Mr. Chair.
25	Item 3A that you just took up was actually

assigned to Rosanne Gervasi. And I would like to let the Commission know at this time that Rosanne is retiring, and this will be her last agenda conference meeting.

It's sad and exciting for her at the same time. I -- if you don't mind, I'd like to say a few words about her, as she has been here almost 25 years, nearly her entire legal career.

She graduated FSU and came to the Commission on July 1st, 1994. And she has been a rock-solid foundation of our legal staff throughout many general counsels. I'm sure that other general counsels would have even more to say about her than I do, but I do know some things about Rosanne and have had the pleasure to experience her expertise and her uplifting personality throughout my brief tenure here as your general counsel.

I could tell you that when she started out in GCL -- and I know this because I -- she rewrote it since I've been here -- she wrote GCA's first primer on objections in preparation for the largest water and wastewater rate case in the Commission's history. And we use that today.

She's fluent in Spanish and has used this skill set to foster the Commission's interactions

with international regulatory agencies as well as
Spanish-speaking customers at Florida utilities.

She was the first attorney in the Commission to ever sit on the process-review team. Because of her skill set and willingness to take on difficult issues, large and complex cases have gravitated Rosanne's way since she started here at the Commission. She started her career working on many complex and difficult water and wastewater dockets, such as the Southern States rate case and the Aloha certificate-revocation docket.

She's leaving us with a broad understanding of the Commission's authority over all industries regulated by the Commission. She's appeared regularly and -- and this is notable -- before the First District Court of Appeal and the Florida Supreme Court representing the Commission in electric, telecom, and water appeals.

She's covered the gamut and, throughout all of it, she's been unflappable and her calm demeanor inspires confidence. Her presence at the Court, if you have ever seen her, is transformative. She's a large part of the reason that the Florida Public Service Commission's excellent reputation in those appellate forums is universally understood and

accepted and recognized by the courts.

Mary Anne reminded me and -- and -- of some of the skill sets that she has. And these aren't just skill sets. She's probably been -- and we have wonderful attorneys throughout the history of the PSC, but probably our outstanding researcher of all time, one of our outstanding writers of all time, one of our outstanding communicators, and one of our outstanding teachers of all time.

And for that reason, she's going to be immensely missed. We wish her the best and hope that she will have, now, much more time to spend at her cottage, which I understand is still standing, in Apalachicola. And she'll be playing with her dogs and sharing her gift of song and, I'm sure, checking in on us, and she will be at our holiday events.

So, Rosanne, congratulations. We're going to miss you.

(Applause.)

CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Rosanne, it's going to be difficult -- it's going to be difficult moving forward without you. You've -- one of things I brag about quite a bit in the Public Service

Commission -- one of the many things I brag about

1	is our our legal record.
2	You know, we get challenged all the time. We
3	go before the appellate court, the Supreme Court
4	all the time. And I want to say, since I've been
5	here, our winning record is, like, 99.8 percent.
6	And I think you're a big part of that. That's
7	that is no small feat. And it's always good to
8	have you there, your research skills.
9	You're making sure even though I I'm one
10	of those people that push back quite a bit because
11	I may not agree with you, you keep us in the legal
12	standing, and that's what we need.
13	And and we will miss you.
14	And Keith, I have a question for you. Now, I
15	know the Legislature has changed the law. Is it a
16	year or two years before we can bring her back to
17	consult for us?
18	MR. HETRICK: You can always come back,
19	Rosanne.
20	MS. GERVASI: Thank you all very much. I will
21	love and miss all of you.
22	CHAIRMAN GRAHAM: Be safe and enjoy your time
23	away. Thanks.
