

RESOLUTION NO. R-551-19

RESOLUTION URGING THE FLORIDA PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION TO APPROVE FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S "FPL SOLARTOGETHER" PROPOSAL THAT WOULD ALLOW CUSTOMERS TO DIRECTLY SUPPORT THE EXPANSION OF SOLAR ENERGY IN FLORIDA AND RECEIVE CREDIT ON FUTURE BILLS FOR THE SAVINGS GENERATED

WHEREAS, Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") has proposed a new community solar program that would present FPL customers with the opportunity to directly support the expansion of solar energy in Florida and participate in Florida's transformation to a global leader in solar energy; and

WHEREAS, the new voluntary program, called "FPL SolarTogether," aims to significantly expand solar energy in Florida through the installation of 1,490 megawatts of new universal solar energy at 20 new solar power plants across FPL's service area to meet anticipated customer enrollment in the program; and

WHEREAS, FPL estimates that the new solar power plants will generate \$139 million in net savings for customers over the long term, primarily from avoided fuel usage and other system savings; and

WHEREAS, upon implementation, the "FPL SolarTogether" program would be the largest community solar program in the United States, as FPL expects it to double the amount of community solar energy available throughout the country; and

WHEREAS, according to Eric Silagy, FPL's president and CEO, the company has "been aggressively expanding solar with one goal in mind: bringing more solar to all of our customers cost-effectively while continuing to keep their bills lower than 90 percent of the country"; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Silagy further explained that the "FPL SolarTogether" program presents "an unprecedented opportunity for [FPL] customers to harness the power of the sun like never before"; and

WHEREAS, from a customer perspective, the program would allow participants to help expedite the growth of solar energy in Florida in a cost-effective manner by paying a fee and subscribing to a portion of new solar power capacity; and

WHEREAS, in return, participating customers will receive direct credits that are expected to reduce the cost of monthly bills over time, and the program is also designed to contribute a portion of the savings to all customers, thereby helping to keep costs lower for everyone; and

WHEREAS, FPL estimates that participating customers will realize a payback on their subscription investment within seven years; and

WHEREAS, according to FPL, participating customers will not be required to enter into a long-term contract and will be able to terminate or reduce their subscription at any time; and

WHEREAS, FPL has also stated that participants who relocate within FPL's service area may maintain their program benefits, as the subscription is associated with a customer account and not a physical address; and

WHEREAS, in order to be implemented, the program proposal must be approved by the Florida Public Service Commission ("PSC"); and

WHEREAS, the County Mayor has stated, "Include Miami-Dade County among the advocates and early endorsers of FPL's SolarTogether program," as "a 'Resilient 305' means embracing sustainable and environmentally responsible options to promote the growth and utilization of smart, affordable solar energy sources to secure power for Miami-Dade County facilities and allow residents and businesses to reap the benefits of zero emissions and cost savings"; and

WHEREAS, this Board recently adopted Resolution No. R-58-19, authorizing the County Mayor to enter into a preregistration agreement for the "FPL SolarTogether" program on behalf of the County; and

WHEREAS, this Board now wishes to further support the program by urging the PSC to approve FPL's proposal,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, that this Board:

Section 1. Urges the Florida Public Service Commission to approve Florida Power & Light Company's "FPL SolarTogether" proposal that would allow customers to directly support the expansion of solar energy in Florida and receive credit on future bills for the savings generated.

<u>Section 2.</u> Directs the Clerk of the Board to transmit certified copies of this resolution to the chairperson, members, and executive director of the Florida Public Service Commission.

The Prime Sponsor of the foregoing resolution is Commissioner Esteban L. Bovo, Jr. It was offered by Commissioner Sally A. Heyman , who moved its adoption. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Rebeca Sosa and upon being put to a vote, the vote was as follows:
