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1 PROCEEDINGS 2 CHAIRMAN CLARK: All right. The final item on 3 the agenda, Item No. 16. Mr. Futrell. 4 MR. FUTRELL: Item 16 is Gulf Power Company's 5 petition for approval of an amortization rate for 6 its customer account management system, or CAMS. 7 The company is requesting a new subaccount, account 8 303.5, capitalization of software, to address the 9 depreciation of its new CAMS system. 10 By rule, investor-owned utilities must obtain 11 Commission approval for any new account or 12 subaccount classification, and any new or changed 13 depreciation rate. 14 Gulf is seeking to extend the period over which it amortizes this software from the 15 16 previously approved seven-year period to 20 years, 17 or five percent, in order to more closely match the 18 useful life of the software. 19 Staff recommends the new depreciation 20 subaccount and the new depreciation rate requested 21 be approved. The new rate be effective as of 22 February 24th, 2020, if approved. 23 There have been no customer comments placed in 24 the docket. 25 Staff also would note that an oral

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1 modification was made to Issue 3 at page sice, and 2 this was provided to your offices and also placed 3 in the docket file. 4 Representatives of Gulf Power and the Office 5 Public Counsel are available if you have any 6 questions, as well as staff. 7 All right. Any questions CHAIRMAN CLARK: 8 from any Commissioners? 9 Commissioner Polmann. 10 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, Mr. 11 Chairman. 12 UNIDENDIFIED SPEAKER: I just --13 CHAIRMAN CLARK: Commissioner Polmann. 14 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Thank you, sir. 15 UNIDENDIFIED SPEAKER: Pardon me? 16 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: Okay, we have somebody 17 else on the line. 18 CHAIRMAN CLARK: One second, Commissioner 19 Polmann. I -- I am sorry, we have got someone on 20 the line that we are getting some interference. 21 JEA, it looks like it's identified as your 22 Would you please make sure you are muted? line. 23 Yeah, hopefully I can COMMISSIONER POLMANN: get through this -- (inaudible) --24 25 So just a quick question on the depreciation

1 schedule, this is new software, and if I'm 2 interpreting this correctly, five percent over 20 3 years, so I am assuming that's a straight line type 4 of depreciation, not that I know anything about 5 accounting other than what I have learned here with -- with asking a lot of questions from staff. 6 7 Is there some expectation that the software 8 is, in fact, going to be useful over a 20-year 9 period, and perhaps not because the software is 10 likely to be upgraded in some regard sooner than 11 that. So what happens during the life -- the 12 useful life of something like software with regard 13 to the depreciation aspect of it? 14 CHAIRMAN CLARK: Mr. Futrell, would you like 15 to address that from a regulatory perspective? 16 MR. FUTRELL: Sir, I would maybe -- perhaps we 17 could point that to staff. Lee Smith is on the 18 line, as well as other staff in the Division of 19 Economics may be able to answer that; and if not, 20 perhaps Mr. Badders from Gulf Power may be on 21 the -- on the phone to answer that question. 22 CHAIRMAN CLARK: We'll start with Mr. Smith. 23 Are you available? 24 MR. SMITH: Yes. Yes, Chairman. This is Lee 25 Smith.

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1 If I understand the question correctly, you 2 are worried about the software not lasting 20 years 3 and need to be replaced. That -- that does seem 4 logical; however, in the recommendation, we cover 5 the software that -- the CSS system that Gulf is currently using has been -- was placed into service 6 7 in late '90s and it's still being used by Southern 8 Company, so that's a point there.

9 And also, it's noted that FPL requested the 10 same life to for their new system, which was also 11 developed by the same company, SAP, they also 12 requested 20 years.

13 I believe if the software were not to last 14 that long, the balance would be put into an amortization schedule, I quess similar to like a 15 16 regulatory asset, and then it would -- the 17 remainder of the capitalization would be amortized 18 over a certain period of years that -- for the 19 company to recover that amount. But it seems these 20 systems, that they are updated and adapted longer 21 than it seems like they should. 22 CHAIRMAN CLARK: Mr. Smith, let me ask a 23 question on -- on top of Commissioner Polmann's 24 question there. It's to the consumer's advantage 25 that we are giving this a 20-year depreciation. Ι

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1 guess the -- the utility would have the right to 2 request a seven-year, or maybe a 10-year 3 amortization for a piece of software which would hit the bottom line to the consumer much, much 4 5 faster; is that a fair statement? 6 MR. SMITH: That is correct, but that won't 7 take effect until the next rate case. This -- this 8 recommendation will not affect the rates currently 9 in effect, but, yes, you are lowering your 10 depreciation expense by extending it -- it out from 11 seven years to 20 years, you are cutting it to a 12 third actually --13 CHAIRMAN CLARK: So even if the --14 MR. SMITH: -- it will --15 CHAIRMAN CLARK: Even if the life of the piece 16 of software were to end at -- at an early state, 17 the expense for that software has already been 18 incurred, and so you would be allowed to continue 19 the amortization, even though the software no 20 longer is viable; is that correct? 21 MR. SMITH: Yeah. Yeah. The capital expense 22 is -- is the same. It's just a matter of how much 23 we are expensing per year. 24 CHAIRMAN CLARK: Right. Okay, I just wanted 25 to add that on to Commissioner Polmann. I am

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1	sorry, Commissioner Polmann, I thought that might
2	help clarify something there.

3 COMMISSIONER POLMANN: No, both aspects of 4 that addressed my concern, that -- that the impact 5 to the customer was an important factor, and using a 20-year time period has a lesser impact on the 6 7 rate to the customer. And then if -- if the 8 software were to be replaced sooner than the 20 9 years, from an accounting perspective, the 10 opportunity would exist to -- to capitalize, or --11 or to convert that into regulatory asset. 12 So my questions have been answered, Mr. 13 Thank you. Chairman. 14 CHAIRMAN CLARK: Thank you. Any further 15 questions from any Commissioners? 16 All right. I will entertain a motion to 17 approve the item. 18 I will move to approve COMMISSIONER FAY: 19 staff's recommendation on all items. 20 COMMISSIONER BROWN: Second. 21 I have a motion and a second CHATRMAN CLARK: 22 to approve staff recommendation on all items on No. 23 16. 24 Any questions, discussion? 25 On the motion, all in favor, say aye.
