## Sebring Gas System's Response to Staff's SERC Data Request

1) What are the estimated incremental cost impacts to implement, and comply with, the proposed modifications to Rule 25-7.039, F.A.C. Please explain.

**Sebring:** At present, the Company anticipates no incremental cost impacts associated with the proposed changes to the rule. It is possible these changes will result in regulatory cost savings.

2) What are the estimated incremental cost impacts to implement, and comply with, the proposed modifications to Rule 25-22.0406, F.A.C. Please explain.

**Sebring:** The Company anticipates no incremental cost increases associated with the proposed rule changes. Instead, it is likely there will be some cost savings associated with the changes, namely the savings associated with the elimination of the requirement to place hard copies of the MFRs in numerous locations. These savings could be as much as \$500 per rate case for Sebring.
