GULF POWER COMPANY'S REQUEST FOR EXTENDED CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION

Gulf Power Company ("Gulf"), pursuant to Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code ("F.A.C.") and Section 366.96, Florida Statutes ("F.S."), hereby requests an extension of confidential classification by the Florida Public Service Commission ("Commission") of certain information contained in documents showing Gulf's 2018 capacity expenditures ("2018 Capacity Expenditures"), which Gulf previously produced to the Commission Staff ("Staff") in Docket No. 20190001-EI in connection with Staff's Audit Control No. 2019-017-1-2. As grounds for this request, Gulf states:

- 1. On May 20, 2019, in Docket No. 20190001-EI, Gulf filed a request for confidential classification of certain information contained within the 2018 Fuel and Purchased Power Transactions. *See* Document No. 04438-2019. On August 22, 2019, the Commission issued Order No. PSC-2019-0346-CFO-EI granting Gulf's request for confidential classification.
- 2. Under the August 22, 2019 Order, the confidential classification of the Fuel and Purchased Power Transactions is set to expire on February 22, 2021. This request is being filed to request an extension of the confidential classification previously approved by the Commission.
- 3. The information contained in the 2018 Capacity Expenditures is entitled to continued confidential classification for the same reasons that it was initially classified. Specifically, the documents contain information that constitutes proprietary confidential business information concerning pricing information for capacity purchases, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of Gulf to contract for goods and services on favorable terms. Disclosure of this

information would negatively impact Gulf's ability to negotiate pricing favorable to its customers in future contracts. In addition, potential counterparties may refuse to enter into contracts with Gulf, or may charge higher prices, if the price terms were made public. The information subject to this request is intended to be, and is treated as, confidential by Gulf and has not been otherwise publicly disclosed. Therefore, it is entitled to confidential classification pursuant to section 366.093(3)(d) and (e), F.S.

4. Upon a finding by the Commission that the confidential information contained in the Capacity Expenditures is proprietary and confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for at least eighteen (18) month period and should be returned to Gulf as soon as it is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. *See* Section 366.093(4), F.S.

WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, Gulf Power Company respectfully requests that the Commission grant Gulf's Request for Extended Confidential Classification and enter an order extending the confidential classification and protecting from public disclosure the information identified herein.
