I'm happy to hear the PA is coming together. We still need some time to put together comments for the three reports. We'll work on those over the next week.

As we mentioned during the last call, we had a couple general concerns across the three reports: documentation that excluded areas with previous survey included sufficient testing within the APE and documentation of no testing due to environmental issues or disturbance. In general, that areas that were tested, appeared to be sufficiently tested. And, of course, areas not tested due to access

issues will need to be tested.

There may be some sites we could considered to have insufficient information, but otherwise I don't think we had issues with eligibility recommendations. We'll confirm that in our comments.
