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I have just a couple of comments to offer. Throughout the discovery operation it calls for stopping activities “within a minimum of 100 feet of the discovery”. My question is who other than the CM determines that 100 feet is adequate. I would like to see the decision be made based on potential size of the site as determined by an archaeologist. Is it possible to move work to another location until the site are can be assessed?

In the procedures for discovery of human remains, I did not see where tribes would be notified. I think that tribes should be notified so they have knowledge of the process and how it is proceeding. In this fashion they will have the opportunity to comment if they desire and have the opportunity to comment of the final disposition of possible tribal related remains.
