Dear Ms. Repp,

I am contacting you with regards to a Programmatic Agreement (PA) that my office is developing with the Florida SHPO and the Gulf Power Company/Nextera for the North Florida Resiliency Connection powerline project. The project requires a Department of Army permit for the entire 173 mile corridor, and the USACE Jacksonville District is the lead federal agency for NHPA Section 106 review of the project. A portion of the proposed corridor travels through lands managed by your agency.

It is my understanding that Rich Estabrook, as the Section 106 project manager for Florida Power and Light/Nextera, has communicated with you about this project in the recent past and has updated your office on the cultural resources survey work that was completed to date. Rich also provided me with a

communication from your office dated June 11, 2020 (attached) indicating that your agency does not have an interest in participating in the PA. As the Section 106 point for the lead federal agency on this project I just wanted to follow up with you to confirm that your agency does not wish to be involved in the PA.
