2	COMMISSIONER FAY: All right. Good afternoon,
3	everyone. It's 1:00 on October 13th.
4	Staff, please call this hearing to order
5	read the notice, I should say.
6	MS. OSBORN: By notice issued on October 5th,
7	2021, this time and place has been set for
8	prehearing conferences in Docket Nos. 20210001-EI,
9	20210002-EG, 20210003-GU, 20210004-GU, and
10	20210007-EI.
11	The purpose of these prehearings is set out
12	more fully in the notice.
13	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you,
14	Ms. Osborn.
15	We'll now take appearances.
16	MS. OSBORN: Yes, Commissioner. There are
17	five dockets to address today. Staff suggest that
18	all appearances be taken at once. All parties
19	should enter their appearances and declare the
20	dockets that they are entering an appearance for.
21	Several parties will make appearances. After
22	the parties make their appearances, staff will need
23	to make theirs.
24	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great.
25	We'll start taking appearances. We'll begin

1	Florida Power & Light.
2	MS. MONCADA: Good afternoon, Commissioner.

1	11	Malcolm Means with the Ausley McMullen Law Firm
1	12	appearing on behalf of Tampa Electric in the 01,
1	L3	02, and 07 dockets. And I'd also like to enter
1	L 4	appearances for Jim Beasley and Jeff Wahlen in
1	L 5	these dockets.
1	L6	Thank you.
1	L7	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.
1	L8	And then we have Peoples Gas.
1	L9	MR. BROWN: Andy Brown of the Law Firm of
2	20	Macfarlane, Ferguson, McMullen in Tampa, on behalf
2	21	of Peoples Gas.
2	22	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. We have granted
2	23	excusal for St. Joe Natural Gas Company.
2	24	So, next we have Sebring. Anybody appearing
2	25	for Sebring Gas?

1	Beth, did you already mention it?
2	MS. KEATING: I did, Commissioner.
3	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you.
4	MS. KEATING: I apologize. Yes.
5	COMMISSIONER FAY: OPC.
6	MS. WESSLING: Thank you, Commissioner. This
7	is Ali Wessling with the Office of Public Counsel.
8	And, for all of the dockets, I'd like to enter an

22	MR. BREW: Yes, good afternoon, Commissioner.

3	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you,
4	Mr. Brew.
5	Nucor?
6	MR. LAVANGA: Yes, good afternoon,
7	Commissioner. I'm Mike Lavanga of the Law Firm of
8	Stone, Mattheis, Xenopoulos & Brew, appearing today
9	on behalf of Nucor Steel Florida, Inc. I'd also
10	like to enter an appearance for Peter Mattheis, and
11	we are here today in the 01, 02, and 07 dockets.
12	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you.
13	Next, we have Mr. Cavros on the line.
14	Mr. Cavros, are you there?
15	MR. CAVROS: Good afternoon, Commissioner.
16	George Cavros appearing remotely today on behalf of
17	Southern Alliance for Clean Energy in the 02
18	docket.
19	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you,
20	Mr. Cavros.
21	Next, we have Commission staff.
22	MS. OSBORN: For the 02 docket will be Walt
23	Trierweiler; the 03 docket is myself, Stefanie-Jo
24	Osborn; for the 04 docket is Matthew Jones and Lee
25	Eng Tan; for the 07 docket is Charles Murphy and

1 Jacob Imig; and for the 01 docket is Suzanne 2. Brownless. 3 COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you. 4 Next --5 MS. HELTON: And --6 COMMISSIONER FAY: Go ahead. 7 MS. HELTON: Mary Anne Helton is here as your 8 advisor for all of the dockets. I'd also like to 9 enter an appearance for your general counsel, Keith 10 Hetrick. 11 COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Any -- any parties 12 that we missed? 13 Yeah, Commissioner, on behalf of MR. PERRY: 14 the Florida Retail Federation, my name is Timothy 15 Perry with the firm of Gardner, Bist, Bowden, Dee, 16 LaVia, Wright, Perry & Harper. And I'd also like 17 to enter an appearance for Schef Wright and Jay 18 LaVia, with my firm. 19 COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Thanks. 20 Mr. Perry. And I -- I'm presuming you're for the 21 01 docket? 22 That's correct, for the 01 docket. MR. PERRY: 23 COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. 24 MR. PERRY: And we filed a motion to intervene 25 yesterday.

1	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you.
2	So, next we will move into the dockets. We'll
3	start with 02 we'll be doing 02, 03, 04, 07, and
4	then 01 last.
5	I'd like to start Mr. Trierweiler, how are
6	you?
7	MR. TRIERWEILER: I'm doing great.
8	COMMISSIONER FAY: There you are. Okay. Go
9	ahead.
10	MR. TRIERWEILER: We don't have any
11	preliminary matters at this time, so we can move
12	into the draft prehearing order.
13	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great.
14	And I I think that you worked through some
15	stipulations on this. I'll probably move through
16	this docket fairly quickly.
17	If any of the parties do have an issue in a
18	section that I'm going through, please just speak
19	up to to grab my attention and we'll make sure
20	we we give you the time to speak on that that
21	section.
22	So, with that, I will walk through each one,
23	starting with Section I, Case Background.
24	Section II, Conduct of Proceedings.
25	And Section III, Jurisdiction.

1	Section IV, Procedure for Handling
2	Confidential Information.
3	Section V, Prefiled Testimony and Exhibits and
4	Witnesses.
5	Staff?
6	MR. TRIERWEILER: Staff suggests that, for any
7	witnesses who are not excused, that their summary
8	of their testimony be no longer than three minutes.
9	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.
10	All parties agree with that?
11	MS. MONCADA: Yes.
12	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great.
13	Section VI, order of witnesses.
14	MR. TRIERWEILER: If stipulations of issues
15	and witness testimony can be reached, staff will
16	confirm with each Commissioner whether such
17	witnesses can be excused.
18	If no Commissioner has a question of a
19	stipulated witness, the witness may be excused from
20	the hearing and his or her testimony and exhibits
21	entered into the record at the hearing, as though
22	read.
23	The OEP requires that each party take a
24	position at the prehearing conference unless good
25	cause can be shown why they can't do so. If a

1	party's position in the draft prehearing order is
2	listed as "no position at this time", that party
3	must change it today or show good cause why it
4	can't take a position.
5	Absent a showing of good cause, the prehearing
6	order will reflect "no position" for that party on
7	that issue. If parties have not taken a position
8	or wish to change a position, staff suggests that
9	they be allowed to do so by tomorrow at noon.
10	A "no position" on an issue prohibits any
11	party from cross-examining witnesses with regard to
12	those issues or briefing on those issues.
13	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.
14	Do the parties have any well, we'll stay
15	with that. We'll move on to Basic Positions,
16	Section VII, if there are no issues with that.
17	Basic positions do the parties have any changes?
18	Okay. We'll move to on Section VIII, Issues
19	and Positions.
20	Mr. Trierweiler?
21	MR. TRIERWEILER: Issues and positions are
22	included in the draft prehearing order.
23	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.
24	Any other issues that need to be discussed?
25	MS. WESSLING: Commissioner, is this the right
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1	time to announce issues starting with Issue 1, if
2	we've changed them?
3	COMMISSIONER FAY: So yeah, if if you do
4	have language you want or or a specific change
5	you want to make at this time, it's something you
6	can address, but I'd also encourage you to include
7	the language and submit it by clo by noon
8	tomorrow.
9	MS. WESSLING: Certainly.
10	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. So, go ahead.
11	MS. WESSLING: So, for on behalf of OPC for
12	Issue 1, we would be willing to facilitate a Type 2
13	stipulation. And that would also apply to
14	Issues 2, 3, 4, and 5.
15	And, for Issue 6, we will provide a revised
16	position no later than noon tomorrow.
17	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay.
18	MS. WESSLING: For Issue 7, we would stipulate
19	to the effective date that the other parties have
20	mentioned.
21	And on Issue 8, we'd be willing to enter into
22	a Type 1 stipulation, as well as on Issue 9, a
23	Type 1 stipulation.
24	And for Issue 10, we would change our position
25	to simply "no position."

1	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Is that all,
2	
	Ms. Wessling?
3	MS. WESSLING: Yes, sir.
4	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great.
5	Any any other parties have any other
6	matters?
7	MR. MEANS: Commissioner, we'd like to make
8	one oral modification to our position on Issue 4.
9	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay.
10	MR. MEANS: That's the issue that asked about
11	the total amount to be collected next year. We'd
12	like to provide a number, in the event that the
13	Commission approves the settlement agreement in
14	Tampa Electric's pending rate case.
15	But I can provide the exact language in
16	writing to staff, as you suggested a moment ago.
17	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. And this is for
18	Issue No. 4, Mr. Means?
19	MR. MEANS: Yes, sir.
20	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Yeah, just
21	make sure you have it to them by noon tomorrow.
22	Thank you.
23	MR. BREW: Commissioner?
24	COMMISSIONER FAY: Yes, Mr. Brew.
25	MR. BREW: I just wanted to note that, to the

1	extent that PCS's positions agree with OPC, that
2	they stay in agreement with the OPC with the
3	changes that Ms. Wessling just discussed.
4	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Great. Thank you
5	for that clarification.
6	MR. MOYLE: Ditto ditto for FIPUG.
7	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Thank you,
8	Mr. Moyle.
9	All right. Any other parties?
10	All right. With that, we will move on to
11	Section IX, exhibit list.
12	Staff?
13	MR. TRIERWEILER: Staff has prepared a
14	comprehensive exhibit list that includes all
15	prefiled exhibits and also includes those exhibits
16	staff wishes to include in the record.
17	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.
18	Section X, Proposed Stipulations.
19	Staff.
20	MR. TRIERWEILER: We have a proposed-
21	stipulation list that's circulating, but we don't
22	have enough agreement to discuss it at this time.
23	COMMISSIONER FAY: All righty. Section XI,
24	Pending Motions.
25	MR. TRIERWEILER: There are none.
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1	COMMISSIONER FAY: Section XII, Pending
2	Confidentiality.
3	MR. TRIERWEILER: None.
4	COMMISSIONER FAY: And Section XIII, Post-
5	hearing Procedures.
6	MR. TRIERWEILER: If there is no bench
7	decision, staff recommends post-hearing briefs be
8	no longer than 40 pages.
9	COMMISSIONER FAY: Okay. Any issues from the
10	parties on that?
11	All right. Section XIV, rulings.
12	MR. TRIERWEILER: Staff recommends that the
13	prehearing officer make a ruling that opening
14	statements, if any, should not exceed three minutes
15	per party, unless any party chooses to waive its
16	opening statement.
17	Staff recommends that the prehearing officer
18	make a ruling that witness summaries be limited to
19	three minutes per witness.
20	All cross-examination exhibits that a party
21	intends to use at the hearing must be provided to
22	the Commission Clerk by the close of business on
23	October 25, 2021, in order to be processed and made
24	available digitally.
25	Attachment A to the draft prehearing order

1	explains the process for the parties to follow when
2	providing cross-examination exhibits to the clerk.
3	Exhibits that are prefiled and designated as
4	cross-examination or impeachment exhibits shall not
5	be viewed by opposing witnesses or opposing counsel
6	or otherwise have their contents or identity
7	communicated to such witnesses or counsel.
8	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great. Thank you,
9	Mr. Trierweiler.
10	All parties in agreement?
11	All right. Any other matters?
12	MR. TRIERWEILER: Any edits to the draft
13	prehearing order will be circulated to the parties
14	for review before the order will be issued. The
15	comprehensive exhibit list has already been
16	circulated.
17	COMMISSIONER FAY: Great.
18	Any other matters from the parties?
19	Okay. With that, we'll conclude the
20	prehearing for the 02 docket and move into the 03
21	docket.
