## **DUKE ENERGY FLORIDA, LLC'S ("DEF") POST-WORKSHOP COMMENTS**

On September 21, 2021, the Florida Public Service Commission ("FPSC") published the Notice of Development of Rulemaking re. the proposed adoption of Rule 25-18.020, Florida Administrative Code ("F.A.C."), *Pole Inspection and Maintenance*, and on October 05, 2021, FPSC Staff ("Staff") attempted to host a Development of Rulemaking Workshop. Because of technical difficulties, the Workshop was unable to commence. Subsequently, on October 13, 2021, the FPSC published an additional Notice of Development of Rulemaking, and on October 27, 2021, Staff successfully held the Rulemaking Workshop in order to discuss pre-filed comments, as well as in-person comments, regarding Staff's proposed rule language and adoption of the Rule. Staff initially circulated their proposed rule language on September 21, 2021, and provided the updated version of the same via the FPSC website, under the "Rulemaking" tab, on October 20, 2021. Representatives of DEF and other Telecom companies participated in the Workshop, and some provided both general and specific comments on Staff's proposed language.

At the conclusion of the Workshop, Staff invited interested parties to provide subsequent, written comments. DEF does not have specific comments at this time, but respectfully requests the opportunity to provide comments at a later time, pending its review of comments from other parties.
