1	PROCEEDINGS
2	CHAIRMAN CLARK: All right. Next up is Item
3	No. 5. Mr. Blocker you're recognized to introduce
4	the item.
5	MR. BLOCKER: Good morning, Commissioners.
6	I'm Jonathan Blocker with Commission Staff. Item 5
7	addresses the annual reestablishment of the price
8	index of major categories of operating costs
9	incurred by water and wastewater utilities. Staff
10	is recommending that the 2022 price index be set at
11	4.53 percent. Water and wastewater utilities
12	should be notified of the new index requirements by
13	mail and the information should be available on the
14	Commission website. No customers have contacted
15	the Commission regarding this matter. Staff is
16	prepared to answer any questions.
17	CHAIRMAN CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Blocker.
18	Commissioners, do you have questions?
19	Commissioner La Rosa.
20	COMMISSIONER LA ROSA: Thank you, Chairman.
21	This is more of a comment than it is a question.
22	Staff did a great job of explaining this item to
23	me. And the reason, I guess, I pulled it and the
24	reason I had questions with them in our briefing
25	was what was the reasoning really behind this high

increase and so forth. And, of course, concerns of inflation and things that are happening, you know, we're looking at CPI and so forth, are these reasons.

So they gave me great historical understanding of where things were 10 years ago, 20 years ago, and so forth. And I agree and I understand with what they're approving -- or what they're suggesting today, and I agree to that. So I have a concern as this moves down the road. When I look back historically and say, oh, one and a quarter, one and a half, one and three quarters percent increase, then all of a sudden we jump up four and a half percent. Well, what's going to happen here, and we're now in approving for 2022. We look back at 2023 or even 2024, we've now increased 15 or 20 percent. Well, is there some way to leverage and help ratepayers and maybe divide this out in the future? I'm not suggesting that. I just want to be clear, I'm not suggesting that for today. it is something maybe that we can look at going forward and moving into the new year to help relieve ratepayers -- just to see what options we ultimately have.

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So I just wanted to pull that and talk about

that for half a second. But I ultimately do agree
with what Staff is recommending today.

CHAIRMAN CLARK: Thank you, Commissioner La I would agree. It's always a concern when Rosa. you see these large numbers, and understanding how the index works can kind of get complicated in terms of tracking that against inflation, and looking at real inflation dollars versus what the I think if we were tracking true index number is. inflation dollars, we'd be overly concerned right now seeing the numbers that are going to be coming down the pipe in the next couple of years as we begin to look back and do re-averaging. It would I think our index formula does take be a concern. that into consideration.

I would say on the same point, I understand the utility company's perspective here, as well. They are seeing these rising costs in real time, in real dollars, and they're having to expend those dollars, whether it be for their wholesale costs, their labor costs, material costs. If you have bought PVC pipe, and I actually purchased a bunch in the last six months, it's doubled and tripled in cost. And just those small factors alone have a significant impact on these small utility

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1	companies, especially those that are eligible. The
2	index their small utility's ability to have the
3	resources to expand services. And it's for that
4	reason that's part of the reasoning behind the
5	indexing.
6	But, Commissioner La Rosa, your points are
7	absolutely on target is as we see higher
8	inflation numbers, and those numbers used in the
9	calculations, we do need to be concerned. And if
10	we can look at ways to spread those costs out or to
11	maybe not wait quite so long or wait a little
12	longer, I guess, from coming in for those, it
13	certainly has a benefit to the consumers. They
14	don't get to go back and re-collect. So anything
15	that we can do to minimize the impact to consumers,
16	we certainly need to take into consideration.
17	Other comments or questions? I'll entertain
18	your motion, Commissioner La Rosa.
