The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your email regarding Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) to the Florida Public Service Commission (FPSC). The FPSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the FPSC. The FPSC has authority in the telephone industry which is limited to the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. We appreciate the opportunity to respond directly with you.

On October 26, 2021, the FPSC approved a four-year rate settlement for FPL, reflecting an almost 40 percent reduction in FPL's original rate revenue request for 2022. Parties to the settlement—filed on August 9, 2021 included the Office of Public Counsel, representing customers, the Florida Retail Federation; the Florida Industrial Power Users Group; and the Southern Alliance for Clean Energy.

As part of the evaluation process for FPL's rate request, the FPSC conducted 12 virtual service hearings in June and July to allow feedback from FPL and Gulf customers about utility service and the rate-setting process. We will add your feedback to Docket No. 20210015, regarding FPL's petition.

You also expressed concern about the date in which FPL's new rates took effect. FPL's new rate went into effect on January 1, 2022, per the settlement in Docket 20210015. For all bills rendered on or after January 1, 2022, the new rate applies, even if the part of the consumption occurred in the previous month.

Finally, you expressed concern about no other options in south Florida for electric service. Florida is not a deregulated state. The FPSC cannot deregulate the electric industry. It would be up to the Florida Legislature to make changes in the Florida Statutes to deregulate the electric industry.
