Dear Florida Public Service Commission,

As resident, and president of an one building six unit condominium, I was surprised at the common area outside lighting only invoice doubled from \$15.85 to \$32.01 [\$25.00 plus tax and charges, with no change in service and consumption]to accommodate a new minimum base bill of \$25, which was approved by the Florida Public Service Commission, is now in effect for metered residential customers whose monthly base electric service costs fall below \$25.

While I'm sure each unit [real live in residential customer]pays above the new minimum base bill, I know my personal bill is \$60.00+, I find this minimum rate added to this space [outside lighting]disappointing under the price increase on this common area.

Please consider my email, when making broad strokes to the one size approvals that the customer will need to justify on their budget, not the commission.
