On September 19, 2022, Florida City Gas (FCG) filed a request for confidential classification pursuant to Section 366.093(3)(e), Florida Statutes (F.S.), and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C), for information contained in FCG's response to Staff's Fourth Request for Production of Documents (No. 10).

FCG claims the confidential information is intended to be and has been treated by FCG as private, its confidentiality has been maintained, and its disclosure would cause harm to FCG and its customers. Pursuant to Section 366.093, F.S., such materials are entitled to confidential treatment and are exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. FCG also claims that the confidential information contains information relating to competitive interests, the disclosure of which would impair the competitive business of the provider of the information. Specifically, the material contains the forward LIBOR curve interest rates and FCG's projected short-term debt cost rate.

Staff reviewed the document provided in the discovery response and concurs with FCG. In staff's opinion, FCG's request meets the criteria for confidentiality set forth in Section 366.093(3)(e), F.S., and Rule 25-22.006, F.A.C. Therefore, staff recommends that FCG's request for confidential classification be approved.
