Dear Mr. Walsh:

The Governor's office forwarded a copy of your E-mail regarding Florida Power & Light Company (FPL) to the Florida Public Service Commission (FPSC). The FPSC regulates investor-owned electric, and natural gas utilities throughout the state, and investor-owned water and wastewater utilities in those counties which have opted to transfer jurisdiction to the FPSC. The FPSC has authority in the telephone industry which is limited to the Lifeline Assistance Program, Florida Relay Service, and pay telephone service. We appreciate the opportunity to respond directly to you.

As we advised in previous E-mails to you, the FPSC approved Florida Power & Light Company's general base rate settlement agreement in Order No. PSC-2021-0446-S-EI, issued on December 2, 2021, in Docket No. 20210015-EI. The settlement agreement was entered into by FPL and various parties representing consumers, including the Office of the Public Counsel (OPC) who **advocates** on behalf of Florida consumers **?????**. The settlement agreement includes numerous provisions with regards to FPL's base rates through the end of 2025.

The agreement also contained a provision that raised the minimum bill charge to \$25.00 for all residential and general service non-demand customers. The minimum bill provision went into effect in June 2022. There was no provision to exempt any class of service or customer from the minimum bill charge. As a result, we **cannot compel** FPL to remove the minimum bill charge for those bills that do not reach the **\$25.** minimum billing threshold **???**

We have added your concerns to our files as a protest to the FPL's Rate Case, docket 20210015.
