Dear Sir or Madam,

I understand that the rising costs of fuel charges and hurricanes in Florida have caused our electric bills to increase. However, when FPL presents a plan to increase each residential monthly bill to 15% to 18% on a sliding scale, please keep this percentage lower than 5% because our monthly salaries have not increased 15 - 18%.

I have spoken to Maggie Turon from FPL in great lengths about the usage, days in a month and extra charges due to hurricane damages and fuel cost but "most of our salaries" have not increased by 15 -18%. These increments to be approved by the Commission are ridiculous.

Thank you in advance for your anticipated cooperation in this matter.
