2	CHAIRMAN FAY: Next we will move to Item No.
3	2. That will be presented this morning by Mr.
4	Stiller.
5	Mr. Stiller, you are recognized.
6	MR. STILLER: Good morning, Chairman Fay and
7	Commissioners. Shaw Stiller from your General
8	Counsel's Office.
9	Agenda Item 2 is a petition for waiver or
10	variance filed by Florida Power & Light in Docket
11	No. 20230017.
12	This docket was opened when FPL filed its
13	petition for recovery of incremental storm
14	restoration costs related to Hurricanes Ian and
15	Nicole, this petition was granted in March, and
16	interim recovery is ongoing.
17	Pursuant to Rule 25-6.0143, Florida Power &
18	Light is required to file its final true-up by this
19	September 30th. It is that rule and that time
20	requirement from which Florida Power & Light seeks
21	a waiver or variance.
22	The basis of the waiver or variance is because
23	of the enormity of the storm and restoration costs
24	related to Ian, but enormity of the costs triggered
25	the requirement for an outside audit. Due to those

1	factors, FPL is running a couple months beyond
2	September 30th.
3	
	The Commission has found similar circumstances
4	related to company workload sufficient to
5	constitute a hardship for purposes of granting a
6	waiver or variance. Staff believes FPL has
7	demonstrated a hardship in this instance, and that
8	granting the waiver has no impact on the purpose of
9	the underlying statutes.
10	Staff is available for any questions.
11	CHAIRMAN FAY: Great. Thank you, Mr. Stiller.
12	Commissioners, you have a summary and
13	presentation of the recommendation on Item No. 2.
14	I will entertain a motion on that item.
