Please deny the current request - reason: the system that is being proposed would require extensive maintenance

1. FPL service to the island is very erratic with power interruptions almost weekly which will affect the individual motors attached to each system {my monitored security system requires maintenance due to this service)
2. Main reason: When the next flood happens (like Milton this year) probably 100% of the proposed systems will be destroyed and have to be replaced. This would mean many months of our not being to live in our home
3. The Charlotte County waste disposal system is NOT upgraded to remove the nutrients - so all that sending our nutrient laden waste water that is currently going into our individual drain fields to Charlotte County facility

would not help remove the nutrients from the area - they would still eventually end up in Lemon Bay and the Gulf.

Please, please, if you determine that the septic tanks have to be removed, require that another more reliable system be used and that Charlotte County be required to upgrade their systems.
